





Northern Ireland Waiting Time Statistics:

Inpatient and Day Case Waiting Times

Quarter Ending June 2021





Reader Information

Purpose: This statistical release presents information on waiting times for

admission for either inpatient or day case treatment in Northern Ireland and reports on the performance of the Health and Social Care (HSC) Trusts against the 2021/22 ministerial waiting time target which states

that:

"By March 2022, 55% of patients should wait no longer than 13 weeks for inpatient/day case treatment, with no patient waiting longer than 52

weeks."

This statistical release details information on the number of patients waiting, and length of time waiting, for inpatient and day case admissions in HSC Trusts at 30th June 2021. Data are presented by HSC Trust, specialty and time band. It also includes inpatient and day case activity commissioned by the Health Service during the quarter ending June

2021.

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
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Total number of patients waiting at 30th June 2021

At 30^{th} June 2021, a total of 112,915 patients were waiting to be admitted to hospitals in Northern Ireland, 1.5% (1,706) more than at 31^{st} March 2021 (111,209), and 16.1% (15,672) more than at 30^{th} June 2020 (97,243) (Table 1).

Almost one third (32.8%, 37,055) of those waiting for admission at 30th June 2021 were waiting for an inpatient admission, with the remaining 67.2% (75,860) waiting for a day case admission (Table 1).



A number of inpatient and day case services may not be provided at a patient's local HSC Trust, and instead are provided at a single regional centre for Northern Ireland. As patients are reported against the HSC Trust responsible for the service that will be providina treatment, users should be cautious in how they use these data (see explanatory note 12).

Of patients waiting, almost two fifths (38.7%) were waiting to be admitted in the Belfast HSC Trust, with a further 20.2% waiting in the Western HSC Trust, 18.1% in the Southern HSC Trust, 12.4% in the Northern HSC Trust and 10.5% in the South Eastern HSC Trust (Table 2a).


Of the 112,915 patients waiting for admission, around four fifths (81.4%, 91,873) were in one of the following specialties: General Surgery (24,958); T & O Surgery (22,148); ENT (12,323); Urology (10,093); Gastroenterology (7,869); General Medicine (7,533) and Oph thalmology (6,949) (Table 3a).

Percentage waiting over 13 weeks



Achievement of the 13 week target requires that less than 45% of patients should be waiting over 13 weeks for inpatient or day case admission. At 30th June 2021, 81.1% (91,608) of patients were waiting more than 13 weeks to be admitted for treatment, compared with 83.3% (92,690) at 31st March 2021 and 88.8% (86,337) at 30th June 2020 (Table 1).

At 30th June 2021, the 13 week element of the target was not achieved by Northern Ireland as a whole (Table 2a), nor by any of the HSC Trusts. Data users should be aware that not all inpatient and day case services are provided at every HSC Trust (see explanatory note 12).

Of patients waiting for an inpatient admission, almost nine tenths (88.5%, 32,784) were waiting over 13 weeks. This is compared with 77.5% (58,824) waiting over 13 weeks for a day case admission (Table 1).






Over four fifths (83.1%, 76,169) of the 91,608 patients waiting more than 13 weeks at the end of June 2021 were in one of the following specialties: General Surgery (20,685); T & O Surgery (19,854); ENT (11,397); Urology (7,598); Gynaecology (5,709); Gastroenterology (5,497) and Ophthalmology (5,429) (Table 3a).

Achievement of the 52 week target requires that no patient should be waiting over 52 weeks for inpatient or day case admission.


At 30th June 2021, 58.7% (66,287) of patients were waiting more than 52 weeks for either an inpatient or day case admission, compared with 61.4% (68,309) at 31st March 2021, and 39.4% (38,354) at 30th June 2020 (Table 1).

At 30th June 2021, the 52 week element of the target was not achieved by Northern Ireland as a whole nor by any individual HSC Trust (Table 2a). Data users should be aware that not all inpatient and day case services are provided at every HSC Trust (see explanatory note 12).

Around two thirds (66.0%, 28,840) of patients in the Belfast HSC Trust were waiting longer than 52 weeks at 30th June 2021, around three fifths in both the Southern (60.4%, 12,374) and Western (56.6%, 12,913) HSC Trusts, more than half (52.6%, 7,397) in the Northern HSC Trust and two fifths (40.3%, 4,763) in the South Eastern HSC Trust (Table 2a).

Of those waiting more than 52 weeks, 26,058 were waiting for an inpatient admission and 40,229 were waiting for a day case admission (Table 1).

Over four fifths (85.5%, 56,656) of the 66,287 patients waiting more than 52 weeks on the 30th June 2021 were in one of the following specialties: T & O Surgery; General Surgery; ENT; Urology; Gynaecology; Ophthalmology and Gastroenterology (Table 3a).


Completed waits for inpatient and day case activity during quarter ending 30th June 2021

A total of 30,879 patients were admitted to Health Service hospitals in Northern Ireland during the quarter ending 30th June 2021, 45.5.% (9,661) more than during the quarter ending 31st March 2021 (21,218) and 126.6% (17,250) more than during the quarter ending 30th June 2020 (13,629) (Table 4). Users should exercise caution when using these provisional data given that hospital records may not be fully updated at this time.

During the quarter ending 30th June 2021, 3,975 patients received inpatient or day case treatment commissioned by the Health Service within the Independent Sector, 12.1% (547) fewer than the number seen during the quarter ending 31st March 2021 (4,522), and approximately four times more than that seen during quarter ending June 2020 (1,086).

When the number of completed inpatient and day case waits within the Independent Sector during the quarter ending 30th June 2021 (3,975) is combined with those treated in Health Service hospitals during the same period (30,879), provisional figures indicate that 34,854 inpatients and day cases received treatment in Northern Ireland commissioned by the Health Service. This was a 35.4% (9,114) increase in the number of completed waits commissioned by the Health Service compared to the quarter ending March 2021 (25,740) and an increase of almost 2.5 times the number commissioned compared to the quarter ending June 2020 (14,715) (Table 4).

In October 2016 the then Health Minister launched 'Health and Wellbeing 2026: Delivering Together,' a strategy which underpins the Northern Ireland Executive's draft Programme for Government ambition to support people to lead long, healthy and active lives.

As part of this strategy, the Elective Care Plan was published in February 2017 which stated that 'Regional Elective Care Assessment and Treatment Centres will be established to deliver large volumes of assessments and non-complex routine surgery across a broad range of specialties.' In December 2018, prototype 'Day Case Procedure Centres' (DPC) became operational for the surgical treatment of Cataracts and Varicose Veins. Patients waiting for either of these procedures can now be referred to a DPC for treatment rather than attend the hospital site they may have been referred to previously.

DPCs have been set up in the following locations:

At 30th June 2021, 917 patients were waiting to be admitted to a Varicose Veins DPC, with a further 3,032 patients waiting to be admitted to a Cataracts DPC (Table 5).

Appendix 2: Explanatory Notes

- 1. The sources for the data contained in this release are the DoH Inpatient Waiting Times Dataset, Hospital Inpatient System and IS1 Part 2 Return. These returns collect information from Health and Social Care Trusts on a quarterly basis.
- 2. The 'Inpatient and Day Case Waiting Times Publication Supporting Documentation' booklet details the technical guidance and definitions used, as well as notes on how to use the data contained within this statistical release. This booklet is available to view or download from: https://www.health-ni.gov.uk/publications/inpatient-and-day-case-waiting-times-supporting-documentation
- 3. All of the data contained in the tables are available on a quarterly basis and can be supplied by individual specialty or Provider HSC Trust if this level of detail is required. In addition, quarterly data relating to inpatient and day case waiting times have been published in spreadsheet format (CSV), split by HSC Trust, Specialty, Programme of Care and Intended Management of the patient (i.e. Inpatient Admission or Day Case), in order to aid secondary analysis. These data are available at https://www.health-ni.gov.uk/articles/inpatient-waiting-times-June-2021.
- 4. Information includes patients living outside Northern Ireland and privately funded patients waiting for treatment in Health Service hospitals in Northern Ireland.
- 5. Inpatient and day case waiting list data comprise the number of patients waiting for inpatient admission to hospital and the number of patients waiting for day case treatment.
- 6. Inpatient admissions can include both (a) patients admitted electively with the expectation that they will remain in hospital for at least one night, and (b) non-elective admissions (e.g. emergency admissions). A patient who is admitted with either of the above intentions, but who leaves hospital for any reason without staying overnight, is still counted as an inpatient admission.
- 7. Day Cases are patients admitted electively during the course of a day with the intention of receiving care who do not require the use of a hospital bed overnight and who return home as scheduled. If this original intention is not fulfilled and the patient stays overnight, such a patient is counted as an inpatient admission.
- 8. The inpatient and day case waiting list figures do not include:
 - -Patients admitted as emergency cases;
 - -Outpatients;
 - -Patients undergoing a planned programme of treatment e.g. a series of admissions for chemotherapy;

- -Patients waiting for admission as a regular day or night attender
- -Maternity (specialties 510 and 520);
- -Patients currently receiving inpatient treatment in hospitals who are included on other waiting lists;
- -Patients who are temporarily suspended from waiting lists.
- 9. Waiting time begins from the date the clinician decided to admit the patient. Patients who cannot attend (CNA) have their waiting time adjusted to commence on the date they informed the HSC Trust they could not attend, while patients who do not attend (DNA) have their waiting time adjusted to commence on the date of the DNA.
- 10. Some people will be waiting on more than one waiting list or be on the waiting list for more than one outpatient appointment/admission/diagnostic test at the same time due to having more than one condition.
- 11. The Ministerial target, for inpatient and day case waiting times, as set out in the Health and Social Care (Commissioning Plan) Direction states that, by March 2021, at least 55% of patients should wait no longer than 13 weeks for inpatient or day case treatment, with no patient waiting longer than 52 weeks.
- 12. A number of inpatient and day case services may not be provided at a patient's local HSC Trust or at each of the five HSC Trusts, and instead are provided at a single regional centre for Northern Ireland. In such circumstances, patients from one HSC Trust area will be waiting to be seen at a service provided at another HSC Trust. Users should therefore be cautious in how they use these data. For example, they should not be used to calculate the total number of patients waiting per head of the population residing within each Trust area, as HSC Trusts that provide services for the whole of Northern Ireland will have a higher number of patients waiting per head of the population than those that provide more localised services. Neither should the actual number of patients waiting longer than the recommended waiting time be used as indicator of poor performance within an individual HSC Trust. Users who require an indication of the latter are advised to refer to the commentary section of the publication which provides an indication of the percentage of total waiters that have been waiting over the maximum recommended waiting times, within each HSC Trust.
- 13. For Tables 2a, 2b, 3a and 3b, each inpatient and day case waiting time band relates to the number of completed weeks a patient has been waiting for admission for treatment. For example, a patient waiting exactly 6 weeks would be included in the 0-6 week time band and a patient waiting 6 weeks and 1 day would be included in the >6-13 (greater than 6 weeks but waiting no longer than 13 weeks) week time band. Patients waiting 'more than 13 weeks' includes all patients in the >13-21, >21-26,

>26-52 and >52 time bands. Patients waiting 'more than 52 weeks' includes all patients in the >52 time band.

- 14. Patients waiting for day case endoscopies are included within both inpatient and diagnostic waiting times; as such, figures should not be added together.
- 15. The total number of completed inpatient waits within HSC hospitals each quarter is sourced from the Hospital Inpatient System. During the financial year, data from the Hospital Inpatient System will be marked as provisional. This is because information on inpatient admissions continuously improves during the year before being finalised. Consequently, quarterly information from the Hospital Inpatient System, for the most recent financial year, will be revised on a quarterly basis.
- 16. The number of completed inpatient waits within HSC hospitals each quarter do not include:
 - Elective planned patients
 - Emergency patients
 - Maternity (specialties 510 and 520)
 - Private patients
 - Amenity patients
 - Mental Health and Learning Disability patients
 - Others (including transfers)
- 17. The numbers of patients who received inpatient treatment, commissioned by the Health Service, in the Independent Sector, are provided by the HSC Board. They are not National Statistics and they have not been validated by the Department, however, they have been included to provide users with a comprehensive view of completed inpatient waits during each quarter.
- 18. HIB surveyed data providers during 2011/12 to ascertain the cost of producing, validating and submitting the information required for this publication. This relates to the time taken to generate, validate and submit data, over and above what is already required by their organisation for internal performance management purposes. The annual cost to data providers of compliance with HIB's requirements for this publication, based on HSC salary costs at the time of the survey, was £1,670.
- 19. Figures relating to inpatient and day case waiting times for the quarter ending 30th September 2021 will be released on Thursday 25th November 2021.

Appendix 3: National Statistics

Data contained within this publication are National Statistics except for information relating to DPC Waiting Lists and or completed inpatient and day case waits.

National Statistics status means that our statistics meet the highest standards of trustworthiness, quality and public value, and it is our responsibility to maintain compliance with these standards.
