#### Introduction

This report was made possible by the co-operation of the public in responding to the census, the commitment of the census field and headquarters staff, and the assistance of many other people and organisations throughout all aspects of the census. The Registrar General for Northern Ireland, who is responsible for the planning, conduct and reporting of the census, would like to thank all of those who contributed to the census.

This publication is the fourth report from the 2021 Census of population and housing. The report has been produced in accordance with the <u>Census Act (Northern Ireland)</u> 1969, <u>Census Order (Northern Ireland)</u> 2020, and <u>Census Regulations (Northern Ireland)</u> 2020. As a statutory report, it relates to the conduct of Census 2021 in Northern Ireland, which was taken with a reference date of 21 March 2021.

This report provides key statistics for a number of census topics at Northern Ireland and Local Government District levels. These statistics will also be laid before the Northern Ireland Assembly in report form. Thereafter, further statistics will be published in pre or user-defined tables, presenting more detailed data for all census topics. A timetable for the release of all census results is included in the <a href="Census">Census</a> 2021 outputs prospectus.

#### Conduct of the census

Results from Census 2021 relate to census day, 21 March 2021. The census placed a legal obligation on every householder and every manager/resident of communal establishments, to make a census return. Obligations were also placed on owners of vacant properties.

Census returns could be made online, by a paper questionnaire, or via telephone. In 2021, for the first time, the majority of the public made their census return online. The Census 2021 operation report gives a factual account of how the census was conducted and sets out a record of key elements associated with the operational delivery.

The census data collection operation was supported by an independent <u>coverage</u> <u>survey</u>. The coverage survey along with administrative data and information from the field operation were combined to allow statistical estimates to be made of the small number of households (2.8) and people (3.1) who did not make a return. The statistical estimates presented here, as with all Census 2021 outputs, reflect the full population of Northern Ireland.

#### **Population base**

Unless otherwise stated, all tables in this report relate to the usually resident population on census day, 21 March 2021.

#### Information in this report

As outlined above, this report provides census results for Northern Ireland on census day, 21 March 2021. A full list of definitions and output classifications will be published alongside this release on the NISRA website at:

This report contains 32 tables, covering Phase 3 of the topics in the census. Within each table, results are presented for Northern Ireland and all 11 Local Government Districts. Note that in some cases more detailed statistics for these topics may be available on the NISRA website.

## Confidentiality

Census Office has taken steps to ensure that the confidentiality of respondents is fully protected. All published results from the census have been subject to statistical processes to ensure that individuals cannot be identified. For more information, please refer to the <u>statistical disclosure control methodology</u>. These processes may result in very marginally different results between tables for the same statistic.

### Comparability with previous censuses

The census is designed to provide the most accurate possible picture of the population on the day the census is taken. Users should be aware that comparisons

between censuses may be affected by other differences, in particular, between the census questionnaires, impacts of issues of the day, etc.

As the last three censuses (2001, 2011 and 2021) were all adjusted for underenumeration and reflect the Northern Ireland population on census day, this supports comparisons between those censuses.

#### **Further information**

A number of <u>supporting documents</u> are available on the census pages of the NISRA website. These documents describe the census methodology in more detail, including the quality assurance processes applied, the paper questionnaire used in the census, and census outputs definitions.

More detailed results from Census 2021 will be published over the coming months. These will also be accompanied by supporting information. An evaluation of the conduct of the census will also be published in due course.

#### Quality of the results

As noted, the coverage assessment approach means that the results of the 2021 Census cover the entire population. However, all census results are subject to potential errors from a variety of sources, including incorrect information provided by respondents, and errors introduced during collection or data processing. Some elements of incorrect information have been corrected during an edit process and, following this, the results have undergone an extensive quality assurance process, including checks against other sources. More information on accuracy, coverage and imputation is provided on the NISRA website in the Census 2021 quality assurance report. A further general statement about data quality for Census 2021 is also available.

#### **Census definitions**

Key census outputs definitions on usually resident population, households and communal establishments are provided below:

#### Usual resident of the UK

A usual resident of the UK is anyone who, on 21 March 2021:

- is in the UK and is staying in the UK for a period of 3 months or more; or
- has a permanent UK address and is outside the UK and is staying outside the UK for less than 12 months.

#### Household

A household is either:

- one person living alone; or
- a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room, sitting room or dining area.

#### Communal establishment

A communal establishment is an establishment providing managed residential accommodation. Managed in this context means full-time or part-time supervision of the accommodation. The communal establishment resident figures also include people who were sleeping rough.
