



MANAGEMENT NOTES:

- GrassCheck plot growth rates have dropped slightly this week owing to cooler temperatures at the monitoring sites however on-farm growth rates remain high. With temperature forecasts remaining low for the coming weeks, the exceptionally high growth we have seen so far this year is more likely to return to the seasonal average.
- Reseeded areas are performing particularly well, owing to the mild conditions last autumn/winter. Active grazing of these areas in the first year will encouraging tillering and improved sward density.
