


MANAGEMENT NOTES:

- Grass growth rates continue to lag well below the 10 year average. With little rainfall recorded in the past seven days and very little predicted for the incoming week, a soil moisture deficit could be seen in eastern areas.
- The lower temperatures coupled with lower soil moisture levels mean growth rates will continue to be restricted. It is very important for average farm cover to not fall below 2100Kg DM/ha or reduce rotation length.
- Consider increasing the grazing area available to reduce demand per ha, ٠ or reduce demand by increasing silage or concentrate inclusion in the diet.
- The drier conditions do provide a good opportunity to achieve target ٠ residuals, especially on paddocks grazed in wet and unfavourable conditions in the first rotation, to maximise pasture quality going forward.
