

## THE AGRICULTURAL CENSUS IN NORTHERN IRELAND – RESULTS FOR JUNE 2023

#### **Key Points**

#### The main changes between June 2022 and June 2023 are:

**Farms:** In June 2023 there were 26,131 farms in Northern Ireland with approximately one million hectares (1,042,318 hectares) of land farmed.

**Farm Structure:** Over three quarters of farms in Northern Ireland are very small (20,603 in 2023). 78 per cent of farms in Northern Ireland have some cattle, 38 per cent have some sheep and 4 per cent have some poultry.

**Farmers and workers:** In June 2023 the were a total of 52,676 farm workers, of which 77 per cent were farmers, directors, partners or spouses.

**Cattle:** Total cattle numbers have decreased by less than 1 per cent to 1,673,345. The number of dairy cows remained relatively consistent at 319,346, while the number of beef cows fell by 4% to 236,082.

**Sheep:** There was a decrease of 2 per cent in breeding ewes compared to 2022, with numbers falling to 973,718. Overall, the total number of sheep recorded was approximately 2 million, which was a 3 per cent fall from June 2022.

**Poultry:** Total poultry numbers on farms at June 2023 increased by 24 per cent from 2022 levels with 25.6 million birds recorded. An alteration in animal health factors, which positively affected production, drove the change in the sector. Total number of laying birds saw an increase of 11 per cent whilst broiler numbers increased by over 31 per cent and other poultry by almost 294 per cent compared to June 2022.

**Pigs:** Total pig numbers recorded in June 2023 decreased by 8 per cent to 682,339 compared to June 2022.

**Crop areas:** The total area of crops grown in Northern Ireland in 2023 was approximately 47,777 hectares, a decrease of less than 1 per cent from 2022.

**Cereals:** The total area of cereals (31,803 hectares) grown in 2023 decreased by 3 per cent from 2022. Wheat crops decreased by 4 per cent to 8,309 hectares, Winter and Spring Barley decreased by just over 3 per cent and 2 per cent respectively, while Oats decreased by 3 per cent from 2022, at 1,922 hectares.

#### 1 Introduction

The data in this statistical publication are sourced from the Agricultural Census which is conducted in June each year. Data is collected on crop areas, livestock numbers and farm labour. Outputs include time series data and frequency distributions.

Results are presented at Northern Ireland and sub-regional level.

The statistics are compiled from a survey of farm businesses augmented by administrative data (Animal Public Health Information System, APHIS, cattle tracing system). In response to COVID-19, the data collection for the Farm Census moved entirely online since 2020. In 2023 the survey remained online with minor changes due to feedback. A large response was achieved from the online-only collection and focussed telephone follow-up. This has enabled detailed farm census statistics to be produced.

Since June 2020 new methodologies have been adopted to create the Agricultural Census in Northern Ireland sample using Departmental Administrative Data and to improve the quality of estimates for farms that did not respond. For some statistics within this publication this has created a break in the series of data and for these variables data should not be compared to published figures in previous years, these have been highlighted where applicable. The statistics provide robust estimates of crop areas, numbers of livestock and of farmers and workers on active farm businesses on the survey date of 1st June 2023.

The population of farms to which these statistics refer includes all active farm businesses having one or more hectare of farmed land, whether owned, leased or taken in conacre, and those with under one hectare having any cattle, sheep or pigs or with significant poultry or horticultural activity.

Farm numbers in 2023 remained largely stable with an increase of less than 1% to 26,131.

### **2 Executive Summary**

**Farms:** In June 2023 there were 26,131 farms in Northern Ireland with approximately one million hectares (1,042,318 hectares) of land farmed.




Figure 2.1 Number of farms and area farmed, Northern Ireland, 1984-2023<sup>1</sup>

The area farmed (excluding common land) has remained relatively steady since 1984.



**Farm Structure:** Over three quarters of farms in Northern Ireland are very small (20,603 in 2023).

The predominant activity on Northern Ireland farms is cattle & sheep. 78 per cent of farms in Northern Ireland have some cattle, 38 per cent have some sheep, 4 per cent have some poultry and 1.4 per cent have some pigs. This remains relatively consistent with the results in 2022, 2021 and 2020.




Figure 2.3 Number of farms by farm type, 2023<sup>2</sup>





Figure 2.4 Percentage of farm workers by type, Northern Ireland 2005-2023

**Farmers and workers:** The total number of farm workers increased by 1.8 per cent to 52,676 in 2023 from 51,760 in 2022. Figure 2.4 shows the breakdown of total farm workers between farmers, directors, partners or spouses (77 per cent) and all other farm workers (23 per cent) has remained relatively stable since 2004.

**Cattle:** Total cattle numbers have decreased by less than 1 per cent to 1,673,345 between 2022 and 2023. The number of beef cows decreased by just over 4 per cent to 236,082 and the number of dairy cows increased by less than 1 per cent to 319,346.



Over two thirds of cattle are in herds of 100 or more.

**Sheep:** The total number of sheep decreased by 3 per cent in 2023 to just over 2 million. There was a 2 per cent decrease in the number of breeding ewes compared with 2022 with numbers falling to 973,718.

Farms with more than 500 sheep on 1st June 2023 account for 41 per cent of the total sheep population.




Figure 2.7 Number of sheep on farm by size of flock, 2023

**Poultry:** Total poultry numbers on farms at June 2023 increased by 24 per cent from 2022 levels with 25.6 million birds recorded. An alteration in animal health factors, which positively affected production, drove the change in the sector. Total number of laying birds saw an increase of 11 per cent whilst broiler numbers increased by over 31 per cent and other poultry by almost 294 per cent compared to June 2022.




Figure 2.8 Number of Poultry, 2023<sup>3</sup>

**Pigs:** There has been a decrease in total pig numbers recorded on the farm census in June 2023 of 8 per cent to 682,339. The decrease in pig numbers was primarily due to a reduced number of weaners, growers and suckling piglets.

In comparison to 2022, the total breeding herd fell to 56,274 (58,130 in 2022). The number of Weaners and Growers fell by almost 11 per cent to 200,309 and suckling piglets fell by almost 11 per cent to 109,527.




Figure 2.9 Type of Pigs, 2014 – 2023

Most pigs are concentrated in relatively few farms, with units of more than 200 sows on 1st June accounting for 12 per cent of herds but 79 per cent of total breeding sows.

**Crop areas:** The area of crops decreased by less than 1 per cent between June 2022 and June 2023 to 47,777 hectares. Grass accounted for 79 per cent of all area farmed.




Figure 2.10 Land use by agricultural production type, 2023


**Cereals:** The total area of cereals grown in 2023 decreased by 3 per cent from 2022 to 31,803 hectares with wheat, winter and spring barley, oat and mixed corn crops all decreasing over the same period.

The area of spring barley grown in June 2023 decreased by 2 per cent from 2022 to 13,113 hectares but remains the most popular crop grown in Northern Ireland.

The area grown of wheat decreased by 4 per cent to 8,309 hectares in the same period, less than the area of winter barley grown (8,340 hectares).


Oat crops decreased by 3 per cent from 2022, at 1,922 hectares. Area of mixed corn remains relatively small in 2023 and has decreased by almost 4 per cent from 126 hectares in 2022 to 121 hectares in June 2023.

**Other crops:** The total area of other field crops increased by 6 per cent between 2022 and 2023. The area of forage maize increased by 22 per cent to 2,262 hectares and arable crop silage increased by almost 13 per cent to 4,440 hectares. There was a decrease of 7 per cent in the area of potatoes to 3,258 hectares. The area of other crops increased by 3 per cent to 3,350.

#### 4 Farm Structure

The tables in this section focus on the farm business type. Farms are classified according to the type of farming found on the holding. In 2020 the business type classification was updated from 2010 Standard Output (SO) co-efficient to the more current 2013 SO values to align with other publications produced by the Department and across the UK. It is therefore worth noting that any comparison done on farm type data between 2020 and preceding years is not directly comparable. 

## 7 Less Favoured Area

The LFA consists of Severely Disadvantaged Area (SDA) which is the original LFA as designated in 1975 and the Disadvantaged Area (DA) which was designated following reviews in 1984 and 1990.

## 8 Crop Yields and Production

The tables in this section show yield and production estimates for the main cereal crops and potatoes for the year 2023. The estimates for cereal yields were obtained from a post-harvest survey of 233 growers, whilst potato estimates were derived from a survey involving pre-harvest digs covering potato crops on approximately 70 farms.

- There was a decrease in yield (tonnes per hectare) for winter barley, spring barley, wheat. Overall, production (tonnes) for cereals decreased in 2023.
- Barley: Total production of barley decreased in 2023 to approximately 111,000 tonnes, a decrease of 20 per cent compared to 2022. Spring barley production decreased by 27 per cent to 57,000 tonnes while winter barley production decreased by 10 per cent to 54,000 tonnes. The overall area grown decreased by 2 per cent from 2022 levels which accounts for the decrease in production. Yields for both winter (6 t/ha) and spring (4 t/ha) crops also decreased by 26 and 7 per cent respectively from 2022.
- Wheat: The total area of wheat grown decreased by 4 per cent with production of wheat decreasing to 57,000 tonnes, a decrease of 15 per cent from 2022. As with Barley, this decrease is a result of both a decrease in area grown and yields as yields also decreased by 12 per cent compared to 2022.
- Oats: Oat yields decreased by 10 per cent in 2023. The total area of oats planted decrease by 3 per cent in 2023. This decrease in both yield and area planted lead to an overall decrease in production of 12 per cent (11,000 tonnes).
- Potatoes: The pre-harvest production estimate of main crop ware and seed potatoes is 123,000 tonnes, a decrease of 11 per cent from 2022. In 2023, the area planted decreased by 7 percent to 3,258 and yields decreased by 5 per cent to 38 tonnes per hectare.

## 9 Notes for Readers

- 1. The survey results were prepared by statisticians from the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) working within DAERA. Further information about NISRA can be found: https://www.nisra.gov.uk/
- 2. There were key methodological changes in 2020 both in how the Agricultural Census data was collected and processed. These included
  - The creation of a revised farm census sample using departmental administrative data sources.
  - Due to COVID-19, a letter inviting farms to take part was issued to all farms and data collected online only for the first time.
  - Some questions were simplified or removed to streamline the online collection experience and reduce the burden on farms.
  - Data for the cattle section was extracted from the APHIS cattle tracing database as in previous years.
  - Telephone support was provided for farmers who could not complete online and a focussed telephone follow-up of non-responding farms was carried out.
  - New estimation and imputation methods were used to create statistics for those who did not provide a return.
