

THE AGRICULTURAL CENSUS IN NORTHERN IRELAND – RESULTS FOR JUNE 2020

Key Points

The main changes between June 2019 and June 2020 are:

Farms: In June 2020 there were 25,896 farms in Northern Ireland with 1,029,822 hectares of land farmed. An increase of 1,069 farms from 2019 resulting principally from key methodological changes in 2020 both in how the Agricultural Census data was collected and processed. Further details of this can be found in the Quality and Methodology report¹.

Farm Structure: Over three quarters of farms in Northern Ireland are very small (20,329 in 2020). 79 per cent of farms in Northern Ireland have some cattle, 38 per cent have some sheep and 4 per cent have some poultry.

Farmers and workers: In June 2020 the were a total of 51,301 farm workers, of which 77 per cent were farmers, directors, partners or spouses and 23 per cent of all other farm workers.

Cattle: Total cattle numbers have stayed consistent at 1.61 million between 2019 and 2020. The number of beef cows decreased by 1 per cent to 244,702 and dairy cow numbers stayed consistent at 313,283.

Sheep: The total number of sheep of approximately 2 million remained similar to last year.

Poultry: There was a 2 per cent decrease in total poultry on farms at June 2020 to 24.4 million birds. Broiler poultry account for three fifths of all birds.

Pigs: There has been an increase in Northern Ireland total pig numbers recorded in June 2020 of 1 per cent to 681,467. The increase in pig numbers was a result of a higher number of fattening pigs.

Crop areas: The area of crops remained similar to last year. Grass accounted for 79 per cent of all area farmed.

Cereals: The total area of cereals grown in 2020 decreased by 1 per cent from 2019 to 29,460 hectares with oat, winter and spring barley crops increasing while wheat and mixed corn crops decreasing over the same period.

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1 Introduction

The data in this statistical publication are sourced from the Agricultural Census which is conducted in June each year. Data is collected on crop areas, livestock numbers and farm labour. Outputs include time series data and frequency distributions. Results are presented at Northern Ireland and sub-regional level.

The statistics are compiled from a survey of farm businesses augmented by administrative data (Animal Public Health Information System, APHIS, cattle tracing system). In response to COVID-19, the data collection for the 2020 Farm Census moved entirely online for the first time. The questions on the survey were streamlined to reduce the burden on farmers, and this was supported by a media campaign to encourage completion. A large response was achieved from the onlineonly collection and focussed telephone follow-up compared to online returns in previous years. This has enabled detailed farm census statistics to be produced.

In 2020 new methodologies were adopted to create the Agricultural Census in Northern Ireland sample using Departmental Administrative Data and to improve the quality of estimates for farms that did not respond. For some statistics within this publication this has created a break in the series of data and for these variables data should not be compared to published figures in previous years. The statistics provide robust estimates of crop areas, numbers of livestock and of farmers and workers on active farm businesses on the survey date of 1st June 2020.

The population of farms to which these statistics refer includes all active farm businesses having one or more hectare of farmed land, whether owned, leased or taken in conacre, and those with under one hectare having any cattle, sheep or pigs or with significant poultry or horticultural activity. Farm numbers in 2020 increased by 1,069 farms predominantly as a result of a new sampling methodology. Despite this increase in farm numbers in 2020, the overall trend is downward with farm numbers having decreased by 10 per cent over the 15 year period between 2019 and 2004.

Farms: In June 2020 there were 25,896 farms in Northern Ireland with approximately one million hectares (1,029,822 hectares) of land farmed.




Figure 2.1 Number of farms and area farmed Northern Ireland 1982-2020²

The area farmed (excluding common land) has remained relatively steady since 1981. The number of farms increased from 24,827 in 2019, to 25,896 in 2020. An increase resulting principally from key methodological changes in 2020 both in how the Agricultural Census data was collected and processed. A sample was drawn using signs of farm activity from all available Departmental Administrative Datasets and included 1,500 farms that had never been incorporated in previous farm census samples.




Figure 2.2: Number of Farms Northern Ireland 2015-2020

Figure 2.2 shows the number of farms activating Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) Entitlements since 2015 compare to the number of active farms included on the Farm Census. Although the definition of active farm is slightly different between the two sources both sources show minor year on year figures changes with an overall declining number of farms.

In 2020 the number of farms that activated BPS entitlements continued that trend suggesting the uplift in Farm Census data is a step change as a direct result of these methodological changes.

As with number of farms we can compare the total area farmed to available administrative data sources. Maximum Eligible Area (MEA) from the single farm payment scheme can provide an estimate for the agricultural area of Northern Ireland. The MEA does not include all land types included in the Farm Census but does show how total agricultural land can vary from year to year. Table 2.1 shows the Maximum Eligible Area from the single farm payment scheme since 2015 compared to the area farmed included on the Farm Census along with the annual percentage change for each. The table shows how small variations in land area are to be expected and are likely due to expected errors in data collection rather than any significant change in farming practise.

In 2020 the change in total area farmed of 0.7% suggests methodology and sample changes have had negligible effect on the land area variables.

Farm Structure: Over three quarters of farms in Northern Ireland are very small (20,329 in 2020).




Figure 2.3 Farm Size, 2020

The predominant activity on Northern Ireland farms is Cattle & sheep. 79 per cent of farms in Northern Ireland have some cattle, 38 per cent have some sheep, 4 per cent have some poultry and 2 per cent have some pigs. This is very similar to the results in 2019 (80 per cent cattle, 40 per cent sheep, 3 per cent poultry and 1 per cent pigs). It is worth noting in 2020 the 2013 Standard Output Classification was used to produce farm type. In 2019 and previous years the 2010 Standard Output Classification was used. 


Figure 2.4 Number of farms by farm type, 2020

Farmers and workers: In June 2020 there were a total of 51,301 farm workers, an increase of 4 per cent from 49,423 in 2019. It can be seen below that this was a result of key methodological changes in 2020 both in how the Agricultural Census data was collected and processed resulting in 1,500 returns from farms that have never previously been included in the farm census sample. Table 2.2 shows the small positive percentage changes in the total workforce in the 23,200 farming businesses that appeared in all four consecutive farm censuses from 2016 to 2020. It can therefore be stated that the 4 per cent step change of farm workers between the full 2019 and 2020 farm censuses is directly as a result of methodological changes.




Figure 2.5 Number of farm workers by type, Northern Ireland 2004-2020

Figure 2.5 shows the breakdown of total farm workers between farmers, directors, partners or spouses (77 per cent) and all other farm workers (23 per cent) has remained relatively stable since 2004.

Cattle: Total cattle numbers have stayed consistent at 1.61 million between 2019 and 2020. The number of beef cows decreased by 1 per cent to 244,702 and dairy cow numbers stayed consistent at 313,283.






Figure 2.6 Number of beef and dairy cows, 2004-2020

Two thirds of cattle are in herds of 100 or more.





Sheep: The total number of sheep of approximately 2 million remained similar to last year. There was a 1 per cent increase in the number of breeding ewes compared with 2019 with numbers rising to 946,054.

Farms with more than 500 sheep on 1st June account for 40 per cent of the total sheep population.




Figure 2.8 Number of sheep on farm by size of flock, 2020

Poultry: There was a 2 per cent decrease in total poultry on farms at June 2020 to 24.4 million birds. Broiler poultry account for three fifths of all birds.




Figure 2.9 Number of Poultry, 2020

Pigs: There has been an increase in Northern Ireland total pig numbers recorded in June 2020 of 1 per cent to 681,467. The increase in pig numbers was a result of a higher number of fattening pigs.

In comparison to 2019, the total female breeding herd decreased by 3 per cent to 45,896. Weaners and Growers decreased by 7 per cent to 217,511. This was offset by an increase of 9 percent in finishers to 306,563.





Figure 2.10 Type of Pigs, 2013 – 2020

Most pigs are concentrated in relatively few farms, with units of more than 200 sows on 1st June accounting for 17 per cent of herds but over three-quarters of total breeding sows. **Crop areas:** The area of crops remained similar to last year. Grass accounted for almost 79 per cent of all area farmed.





Cereals: The total area of cereals grown in 2020 decreased by 1 per cent from 2019 to 29,460 hectares with oat, winter and spring barley crops increasing while wheat and mixed corn crops decreasing over the same period.

The area of spring barley grown in June 2020 showed the largest increase of 5 per cent from 2019 thus remaining the most popular crop grown in Northern Ireland.

The area grown of wheat decreased by 12 per cent in the same period. For the first time the total of winter barley grown has surpassed the total area of wheat.

Oat crops increased by 1 per cent from 2019 to 2020 whilst mixed corn fell by 30 per cent from 161 hectares to 113 hectares in the same period.






Figure 2.12 Wheat and Barley grown, 2004 – 2020

Other crops: The total area of other field crops increased by 9 per cent between 2019 and 2020. The area of forage maize increase by 16 per cent to 1,874 hectares and arable crop silage increased by 7 per cent to 4,187 hectares. There was a small decrease of 2 per cent in the area of potatoes to 3,715 hectares.

The area of the other crops increased by 30 per cent to 3,114 however this change should be regarded with caution as it is most likely due to changes in methodology rather than a true increase. In 2020 the horticultural survey was not conducted and a proportion of crop questions were omitted from the 2020 online survey to promote ease of use, resulting in a greater uptake of the generic 'other crop' question.

4 Farm Structure

The tables in this section focus on the farm business type. Farms are classified according to the type of farming found on the holding. In 2020 the business type classification was updated from 2010 Standard Output (SO) co-efficients to the more current 2013 SO values to align with other publications produced by the Department and across the UK. It is therefore worth noting that any comparison done on farm type data between 2020 and preceding years is not directly comparable. 

8 Crop Yields and Production

The tables in this section show yield and production estimates for the main cereal crops and potatoes for the year 2020. The estimates for cereal yields were obtained from a post-harvest survey of 217 growers, whilst potato estimates were derived from a survey involving pre-harvest digs covering potato crops on approximately 66 farms.

- There was a decrease in yield (tonnes per hectare) and overall production (tonnes) for winter barley, wheat, oats and potatoes in 2020.
- **Barley:** Total production of barley decreased to approximately 122,000 tonnes, a decrease of 8 percent compared to 2019. Spring barley production rose by 10 percent to 71,000 tonnes while winter barley production fell 18 percent to 51,000 tonnes.
- Wheat: Production of wheat decreased from 2019 levels to 46,000 tonnes, a decrease of 24 percent.
- **Oats:** Oat yields decreased 8 percent to 5 tonnes per hectare in 2020. The total area of oats planted increased by only 1 per cent resulting in an overall decrease in production of 8 percent (10,000 tonnes).
- **Potatoes:** The pre-harvest production estimate of main crop ware and seed potatoes is 130,000 tonnes, a similar level to 2019. In 2020 the area planted decreased by 2 per cent to 3,700 hectares.

9 Notes for Readers

- 1. The survey results were prepared by statisticians from the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) working within DAERA. Further information about NISRA can be found: <u>https://www.nisra.gov.uk/</u>
- 2. There were key methodological changes in 2020 both in how the Agricultural Census data was collected and processed. These included
 - The creation of a revised farm census sample using departmental administrative data sources.
 - Due to COVID-19, a letter inviting farms to take part was issued to all farms and data collected online only for the first time.
 - Some questions were simplified or removed to streamline the online collection experience and reduce the burden on farms. Questions on pigs and poultry, normally gathered from the NI Annual Inventory of Pigs and Update of NI Bird Register, were added because the inventories were postponed until later in 2020.
 - Data for the cattle section was extracted from the APHIS cattle tracing database as in previous years.
 - Telephone support was provided for farmers who could not complete online and a focussed telephone follow-up of non-responding farms was carried out.
 - New estimation and imputation methods were used to create statistics for those who did not provide a return.
