

THE AGRICULTURAL CENSUS IN NORTHERN IRELAND – RESULTS FOR JUNE 2021

Key Points

The main changes between June 2020 and June 2021 are:

Farms: In June 2021 there were 26,077 farms in Northern Ireland with 1,035,642 hectares of land farmed. An increase of 181 farms from 2020.

Farm Structure: Over three quarters of farms in Northern Ireland are very small (20,454 in 2021). 79 per cent of farms in Northern Ireland have some cattle, 38 per cent have some sheep and 4 per cent have some poultry.

Farmers and workers: In June 2021 the were a total of 52,195 farm workers, of which 77 per cent were farmers, directors, partners or spouses and 23 per cent of all other farm workers.

Cattle: Total cattle numbers have increased by 4% to 1,681,991. The number of beef cows have increased by 1% to 246,956 while the number of dairy cows increased by 2% to 318,372.

Sheep: There was an increase of 2% in breeding ewes compared to 2020, with numbers increasing to 968,300. Overall, the total number of sheep recorded was just over 2 million, which was also a 2% rise from June 2020.

Poultry: Total poultry numbers on farms at June 2021 remained unchanged from 2020 levels with 24.5 million birds recorded. However, within poultry categories there was a decrease in laying birds of 13% and an increase in broiler numbers of 4% compared to June 2020.

Pigs: Total pig numbers recorded in June 2021 increased by 5% to 716,798 compared to June 2020.

Crop areas: The total area of crops grown in Northern Ireland in 2021 was approximately 46,500 hectares, an increase of 2% from 2020.

Cereals: The total area of cereals (30,500 hectares) grown in 2021 increased by 4% from 2020. Wheat crops increased by 8% to 7,700 hectares, Winter and Spring Barley increased by 2% and 3% respectively, while Oats remained similar to the 2020 area recorded.

1 Introduction

The data in this statistical publication are sourced from the Agricultural Census which is conducted in June each year. Data is collected on crop areas, livestock numbers and farm labour. Outputs include time series data and frequency distributions.

Results are presented at Northern Ireland and sub-regional level.

The statistics are compiled from a survey of farm businesses augmented by administrative data (Animal Public Health Information System, APHIS, cattle tracing system). In response to COVID-19, the data collection for the Farm Census moved entirely online since 2020. The questions on the survey were streamlined in 2020 to reduce the burden on farmers, streamlined questions were reinstated for this year. In 2021 the survey remained online with positive feedback, a large response was achieved from the online-only collection and focussed telephone follow-up. This has enabled detailed farm census statistics to be produced.

Since June 2020 new methodologies have been adopted to create the Agricultural Census in Northern Ireland sample using Departmental Administrative Data and to improve the quality of estimates for farms that did not respond. For some statistics within this publication this has created a break in the series of data and for these variables data should not be compared to published figures in previous years, these have been highlighted where applicable. The statistics provide robust estimates of crop areas, numbers of livestock and of farmers and workers on active farm businesses on the survey date of 1st June 2021.

The population of farms to which these statistics refer includes all active farm businesses having one or more hectare of farmed land, whether owned, leased or

taken in conacre, and those with under one hectare having any cattle, sheep or pigs or with significant poultry or horticultural activity.

Farm numbers in 2021 remained largely stable with a change of less than 1% to 26,077. This further suggests the uplift seen in 2020 is likely to be a step change in data as a result of a new sampling methodology introduced in 2020. Figure 2.2 shows the number of farms activating Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) Entitlements since 2015 compare to the number of active farms included on the Farm Census. Although the definition of active farm is slightly different between the two sources both sources show minor year on year figures changes with an overall declining number of farms.

In 2021 the number of farms that activated BPS entitlements continued that trend suggesting the uplift in Farm Census data in 2020 is a step change as a direct result of methodological changes.

Figure 2.2: Number of Farms Northern Ireland 2015-2021


As with number of farms in 2021 the change in total area farmed recorded by the census matches the negligible increase in number of farms. An increase of 0.6% suggests methodology and sample changes have had negligible effect on the land area variables.



The predominant activity on Northern Ireland farms is Cattle & sheep. 79 per cent of farms in Northern Ireland have some cattle, 38 per cent have some sheep, 4 per cent have some poultry and 2 per cent have some pigs. This is Identical to the results in 2020.

Figure 2.4 Number of farms by farm type, 2021




Farmers and workers: Major changes in methodology are likely to have been responsible for much of the increase experienced in 2020. However, recent data shows an overall rising trend in Farm workers which appears to be continuing into 2021.

It is important to note that further changes were made to the labour questions making up the 2021 Census. These questions where expanded and simplified in order to ensure higher quality of data. With this in mind, some of the increase in labour figures recorded in 2021 is likely due to these changes.

In June 2021, there were 52,195 farm workers, an increase of 2 per cent from 51,301 in 2020

Figure 2.5 shows the breakdown of total farm workers between farmers, directors, partners or spouses (77 per cent) and all other farm workers (23 per cent) has remained relatively stable since 2004.

Cattle: Total cattle numbers have increased by 4 per cent to 1.68 million between 2020 and 2021. The number of beef cows increased by 1 per cent to 246,956 and the number of dairy cows increased by 2 per cent to 318,372.

Two thirds of cattle are in herds of 100 or more.

Figure 2.7 Number of cattle on farm by size of herd, 2021



Sheep: The total number of sheep increased by just over 2 percent in 2021 to just over 2 million. There was a 2 per cent increase in the number of breeding ewes compared with 2020 with numbers rising to 968,300.

Farms with more than 500 sheep on 1st June account for 41 per cent of the total sheep population.

Poultry: The number of total poultry on farms remained virtually unchanged between June 2020 and June 2021. Broiler poultry account for three fifths of all birds.





Figure 2.9 Number of Poultry, 2021

Pigs: There has been an increase in Northern Ireland total pig numbers recorded on the farm census in June 2021 of 5 per cent to 716,798. The increase in pig numbers was a result of a higher number of breeding pigs and fattening pigs.

In comparison to 2020, the total female breeding herd increased by 9 per cent to 50,086. Weaners and Growers decreased by 4 per cent to 208,944. This was offset by an increase of 10 per cent in finishers to 335,793.


Figure 2.10 Type of Pigs, 2013 – 2021



Most pigs are concentrated in relatively few farms, with units of more than 200 sows on 1st June accounting for 19 per cent of herds but almost 80 per cent of total breeding sows.

Crop areas: The area of crops remained similar to last year. Grass accounted for 79 per cent of all area farmed.

Figure 2.11 Land use by agricultural production type, 2021




Cereals: The total area of cereals grown in 2021 increased by 4 per cent from 2020 to 30,507 hectares with wheat, winter and spring barley crops increasing while oat and mixed corn crops decreasing over the same period.

The area of spring barley grown in June 2020 increased by 3 per cent from 2020 and remains the most popular crop grown in Northern Ireland.

The area grown of wheat increased by 8 per cent in the same period. And winter barley grown increased by 2 percent and continues to surpass the total area of wheat.

Oat crops remain similar to area grown in 2020, at 1,874 hectares, whilst mixed corn fell by 50 per cent from 113 hectares to 57 hectares in the same period.

Other crops: The total area of other field crops decreased by 2 per cent between 2020 and 2021. The area of forage maize decreased by 2 per cent to 1,836 hectares and arable crop silage decreased by 3 per cent to 4,082 hectares. There was a decrease of 7 per cent in the area of potatoes to 3,468 hectares. The area of other crops increased by 4 per cent to 3,251.

4 Farm Structure

The tables in this section focus on the farm business type. Farms are classified according to the type of farming found on the holding. In 2020 the business type classification was updated from 2010 Standard Output (SO) co-efficient to the more current 2013 SO values to align with other publications produced by the Department and across the UK. It is therefore worth noting that any comparison done on farm type data between 2020 and preceding years is not directly comparable. 

8 Crop Yields and Production

The tables in this section show yield and production estimates for the main cereal crops and potatoes for the year 2021. The estimates for cereal yields were obtained from a post-harvest survey of 235 growers, whilst potato estimates were derived from a survey involving pre-harvest digs covering potato crops on approximately 70 farms.

- There was an increase in yield (tonnes per hectare) and overall production (tonnes) for winter barley, spring barley, wheat and oats in 2021.
- Barley: Total production of barley increased in 2021 to approximately 137,000 tonnes, an increase of 12 percent compared to 2020. Spring barley production rose by 9 percent to 77,000 tonnes while winter barley production rose by 17 percent to 60,000 tonnes. The overall area grown increased by 2 per cent from 2020 levels but most of the increase in production was due to higher yields for both winter (8 t/ha) and spring (6 t/ha) crops which increased by 15 and 6 per cent respectively from 2020.
- Wheat: The total area of wheat grown increased by 8 percent with production of wheat increasing to 64,000 tonnes, an increase of 37 percent from 2020. The majority of this increase can be attributed to the 27 per cent increase in yields since 2020.
- Oats: Oat yields increased to 6 tonnes per hectare in 2021 from 5 tonnes per hectare in 2020. The total area of oats planted stayed the same with an overall increase in production of 7 percent (11,000 tonnes).
- Potatoes: The pre-harvest production estimate of main crop ware and seed potatoes is 118,000 tonnes, a decrease of 9 per cent from 2020. In 2021, the area planted decreased by 7 per cent to 3,468 hectares and yields fell by 3 per cent to 34 tonnes per hectare.

9 Notes for Readers

- 1. The survey results were prepared by statisticians from the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) working within DAERA. Further information about NISRA can be found: https://www.nisra.gov.uk/
- 2. There were key methodological changes in 2020 both in how the Agricultural Census data was collected and processed. These included
 - The creation of a revised farm census sample using departmental administrative data sources.
 - Due to COVID-19, a letter inviting farms to take part was issued to all farms and data collected online only for the first time.
 - Some questions were simplified or removed to streamline the online collection experience and reduce the burden on farms. Questions on pigs and poultry, normally gathered from the NI Annual Inventory of Pigs and Update of NI Bird Register, were added because the inventories were postponed until later in 2020.
 - Data for the cattle section was extracted from the APHIS cattle tracing database as in previous years.
 - Telephone support was provided for farmers who could not complete online and a focussed telephone follow-up of non-responding farms was carried out.
 - New estimation and imputation methods were used to create statistics for those who did not provide a return.
