FOREWORD

I am thankful and proud to present the 2020-21 annual report for Community Sector Training. This report presents a somewhat different year for our community and team of trainers.

March 2020, around the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic saw the community and voluntary sector thrown into extremely difficult and challenging times. Restrictions were imposed on groups, meaning they couldn't meet with or provide the essential support to the community in their normal manner. This too impacted on Community Sector Training, with our services being stood down and redeployed to assist with helpline calls for those who needed help with food, fuel, social contact, pharmacy and food deliveries.

However, to continue to meet the needs of the organisations in our communities, we had to adapt our training to make it accessible online, in a safe non-contact fashion to equip groups with the safeguarding knowledge they needed. Whilst we had concerns at the beginning, it has proven to be very effective and has highlighted positives, such as participants and trainers can remain in the comfort of their own homes, no travel is required, especially on cold winter nights and a much wider scope of users can be accommodated in the sessions. Face to face training will always have the edge though and this will resume again in the not too distant future, but we are happy to say we will carry on offering a blend of both.


Over the remainder of the year, from September 2020 to March 2021, we managed to overcome "YOUR'E ON MUTE" and "SORRY YOU GO FIRST" and have successfully delivered training to 201 participants from 30 different groups!

Whilst it is still unclear what the future has in store, we are confident as a team that we will continue to adapt to whatever changes come about and will strive to carry on working in partnership with the community and voluntary sector, providing training and promoting good safeguarding practices.
