IDENTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL/FINAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT

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2.1. Key information on the implementation of the operational programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data. Background

The strategic aim of the ESF Programme 2014-2020 in Northern Ireland is to combat poverty and enhance social inclusion by reducing economic inactivity and to increase the skills base of those currently in work and future potential participants in the workforce.

The programme is structured around four priority axes, which are constructed from the thematic objectives listed in article 9 of Regulation (EU) No 1303/2013, hereafter referred to as the Common Provisions Regulation (CPR).

- **Priority 1 Access to Employment (Thematic Objective 8)** promoting sustainable and quality employment and supporting labour mobility.
- **Priority 2 Social Inclusion (Thematic Objective 9)** promoting social inclusion, combating poverty and any discrimination.
- **Priority 3 Skills for Growth (Thematic Objective 10)** investing in education, training and vocational training for skills and life-long learning.
- Priority 4 Technical Assistance

The aim of the 2014-2020 programme will be realised through the implementation of these thematic objectives.

For priority axes 1 and 2, under the first call for applications, a total of 66 operations were originally successful, of which 61 continued to be operational throughout 2017. Operations receive funding allocation comprising of 40% ESF and 25% Departmental match. Operations are responsible for securing the additional 35% match funding from either public or private sources. As Call 1 operations were due to cease delivery as at 31 March 2018, the Department issued a second call for applications.

The Call 2 application process formerly opened on Monday 11 September 2017 and closed on Friday 13 October 2017. Of the 92 applications received, 87 went through the assessment stage resulting in 69 operations (delivered by 54 beneficiaries) successfully meeting the assessment criteria.

Letters of Offer worth an estimated total value of \notin 204.24 million total expenditure (\notin 81.7 million ESF) are scheduled to be issued in March 2018 following due diligence checks. It is anticipated that ESF Call 2 projects will be ready to commence on 1 April, with existing Call 1 participants completing their engagement with the Programme on, or before, 31 March 2018.

Priority 3 of the Programme focuses on improving the labour market relevance of education and training systems, specifically through apprenticeships and youth training programmes. Provision was co-financed under a single Letter of Offer (LoO) for the period from June 2015 to March 2017 and comprised of 40% ESF and 60% Departmental match.

Following a review of policy on apprenticeships and youth training, and a series of successful pilots, the reformed provision was delivered as part of a steady state provision offered by the Department.

This steady state provision is co-financed under LoOs for two distinct operations, namely ApprenticeshipsNI 2017 and Higher Level Apprenticeships (HLAs). ApprenticeshipsNI receives cofinancing of \notin 43.43 million for the period April 2017 to March 2022. HLAs receive co-financing of \notin 12.6 million for the period September 2017 to December 2023. Co-financing comprises of 40% ESF with the remaining 60% comprising of Departmental match-funding.

Programme Monitoring Committee (PMC)

During 2017, PMC met on 3 May and 16 November and the ESF Communications Plan for 2018 was approved by PMC on 16 November 2016. Minutes of the PMC meetings are uploaded to SFC 2014.

As at 16 November 2017, the managing authority (MA) reported to PMC that it was satisfied that the ESF Programme remained on course to meet all of the associated output targets. The MA also confirmed that as it had been formally designated, submission of drawdown of ESF expenditure would commence and that it fully anticipated meeting the ESF N+3 target.

Managing Authority (MA) Designation & ESIF Database

Following provision of the ESIF 2014-2020 database and submission by the audit authority (AA) of an unqualified assurance of the MA's MCS, formal designation of the Department (DfE) was confirmed.

Programme Expenditure/N+3

NI ESF Interim Claim 1 worth \notin 34.42 million was submitted to the European Commission (EC) with subsequent approval and drawdown of \notin 13.77 million (40% ESF). This exceeded the N+3 target for 2017 of \notin 11.25m by \notin 2.52m. Further drawdown of expenditure relating to priorities 1, 2, and 3 is planned for 2018.

The current Performance Reserve milestone targets require a much higher level of spend to be certified by 31st December 2018. The MA is reviewing the financial allocations for the OP following Call 2 to ensure expenditure targets remain aligned with programme activity levels and their associated costs.

Modification to the Operational Programme (OP)

A formal modification to the OP was submitted by the MA (following approval by PMC) and accepted by the EC on 15 December 2017. The high level changes related to aspects of Call 2 for priority axes 1 and 2, and priority 4. These included:

- Introduction of a new simplified costs funding model;
- Changes to programme performance indicators; and

• Increase in the financial allocation to priority axis 4 – technical assistance.

There was no proposal to amend the co-financing rate (40% ESF) for operations in priorities 1 and 2, however the MA keeps this position under review.

Call 2 Engagement

A series of six stakeholder consultation events were held in June 2017 to discuss the proposed approach to Call 2 and provide stakeholders with information. Two pre-launch stakeholder events were held on 5 and 7 September to advise stakeholders of the application process and revised scoring matrix. All events were well attended and positively received. The MA will hold follow-on workshops and individually engage with all successful projects, well in advance of the 1 April 2018 date.

Publicity and Communications

The ESF Managing Authority's 2017 Communication Plan was approved by PMC by written procedure on 3rd January 2017 and then submitted to the Commission. The following provides a summary of the main actions completed during 2017.

Webpage – The ESF MA webpage on the DfE website is the main portal for providing information regarding the OP.

NI Direct ESF Page – a new dedicated ESF page went live on NI Direct in April 2017, providing citizens with an overview of the programme.

Tweets – A number of tweets relating to the ESF programme have been issued from DfE Press Office.

Case studies – There were 5 case studies uploaded to the DfE website in 2017.

Major Event – NIESF took part in the First World Conference on Supported Learning on 14-16th of June 2017 (attended by over 500 delegates).

3. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PRIORITY AXIS (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

ID Priority axis Key information on the implementation of the priority axis with reference to key developments, significant problems and steps taken to address these problems The actual spend claimed by beneficiaries across priority 1 was €38.95 million. This Access to Employment represents a total of 62.14% total spend against the 2018 expenditure milestone (€62.71 million). Based on the progress figures below the Managing Authority (MA) remains confident of meeting 2018 milestone targets, however as previously noted re-profiling of expenditure will be required to align N+3 and the performance reserve allocation. **Investment Priority 8i** This IP supports activity to enhance and extend access to employment for the unemployed or economically inactive. A total of 20 of the 23 operations that commenced during 2015 continue to deliver their ESF supported projects. Beneficiaries have claimed total project costs of €23.2 million to date comprising of €9.28 million of Commission co-financing. Based on the outcome of verification work to date, operations have supported 9,615 participants, however this is forecast to rise as verifications on performance data are completed. This represents progress of 58.7 % (6,164) for unemployed (CO01) and 57.52% (3,451) for inactive (CO03) towards the 2018 milestones respectively. **Investment Priority 8ii** This priority focuses on supporting young people aged 16-24 who are not in employment, education or training. All 13 of the original operations that commenced during 2015 continue to deliver their ESF projects. A total of €15.75 million has been claimed to date by beneficiaries comprising of €6.3 million ESF co-financing. Thus far, verification is completed for 3,797 participants, however the MA anticipates this figure will increase as verifications on all performance data are finalised. This represents 63.3% progress towards the 2018 milestone (PSO01).

This represents a 60.54% total spend against the 2018 expenditure milestone of $\notin 66.01$ million. Re-profiling of expenditure will be required to align N+3 and the performance reserve allocation.
		Investment Priority 9(i)(a) This IP supports unemployed or economically inactive individuals with a disability. 23 of 24 originally supported ESF operations continue to deliver their projects.
		Total project costs to date are €33.18 million comprising of €13.27 million co-financing. Based on current verification, a total of 3,814 participants received ESF support, but as previously noted this will increase once verification work is concluded.
		Delivery of this IP continues to perform well, with the MA able to report 78.64% progress towards the 2018 milestone target (CO16) of 4,850.
		Thematic objective 9i(b) This IP aims to support family members and break the cycle of intergenerational unemployment and associated poverty in communities, by supporting NEET participants aged 16 and over within families receiving Community Family Support. 5 operations were originally offered financial assistance and all continue to deliver their projects.
		Beneficiaries have declared $\notin 6.78$ million total project costs comprising of $\notin 2.71$ million co- financing. Operations have supported a total of 1,362 participants currently verified for performance indicators. As verification is finalised, the MA forecasts a rise in total supported participants reported across priorities 1 and 2
		This represents 72.45% progress against the 2018 milestone (PSO03) of 1,880 and the MA expects to meet the targets for 9i (a) and (b) in full.
3	Skills for Growth	This IP contributes to the development of a highly skilled and innovative workforce contributing to the twin goals of social inclusion and economic success for NI. The quality and effectiveness of training for young people and adults are crucial elements of this process.

		There are now two letters of financial assistance for government programmes, ApprenticeshipsNI worth $\in 108.5$ million, and Higher Level Apprenticeships (HLA) worth $\in 31.5$ million. This consists of ESF co-financing (40%) of $\in 43.43$ million for ApprenticeshipsNI and $\in 12.6$ million for HLAs.
		HLAs are a new offering by the Department in 2017, providing apprenticeships at levels 4 and 5. The redesigned apprenticeships provision (including HLAs) committed to in "Securing Our Success" is central to transforming the skills landscape of NI and securing the MS's economic success.
		Delivery of HLAs has progressed well over the first 4 months with reported total spend of €222k (89k ESF co-financing). No result indicator data can be provided as HLAs last a minimum of 2 years.
		 Through the ApprenticeshipsNI programme the following aims will be realised: Increasing the skills level of the NI workforce; Increasing the level of qualifications in the workforce; Increasing social inclusion Providing training to the highest quality standard.
		Participants are in paid employment from day one and work towards achieving an industry- approved apprenticeship framework at Level 2/Level 3.
		A total of 21,162 participants (AppsNI - 20,878, HLAs - 284) have received ESF support, well in excess (132.56%) of the 2018 milestone (PSO05) of 15,750. To date, a total of \notin 50 million eligible expenditure has been declared by operations which comprises of \notin 20.4 million (40%) ESF support.

Synthesis of the findings of all evaluations of the programme that have become available during the previous financial year, with reference of name and reference period of the evaluation reports used

In accordance with the ESF programme's evaluation schedule as detailed in Annex A of the evaluation plan (available for download from SFC) approved by the Programme Monitoring Committee (PMC), formal evaluations of selected investment priorities is due to commence in 2018 running until 2020. The first evaluations are therefore not due to be completed until late 2018/early 2019.

The Managing Authority is considering the viability of conducting one mid-term evaluation during 2018/19 as this has the potential to offer economies of scale, as well as providing an informed evaluation to shape programme development and operational delivery going forward. Any proposed revision to the evaluation plan would be subject to approval by PMC.

An evaluation of the 2017 Communication Plan was conducted in December 2017, and will be submitted to PMC for review and approval in January 2018. The evaluation will be made available on the Department for the Economy's website page for ESF.

A summary of the main findings that have resulted from the evaluation of the Communication Plan are:

During 2017:

- There was total expenditure of \in 31,446 on activities within the Communication plan;
- Of the 15 individual actions in the Communication Plan, 12 were fully achieved., 2 actions were partially achieved engagement with the Department for the Communities and engagement with the NEETs and CFSP forums it was acknowledged however that the motivation and objectives behind these actions were being met through other channels. Finally, 1 action was not achieved relating to the issue of press releases through the Department's Private Office, however it was accepted this was beyond the MA's control due to the suspension of the assembly on 26 January 2017 and therefore no ministerial activity since;
- The dedicated ESF webpage on the MS central government website NI Direct had received 5,338 views during the first 6 months since launch;
- Transparency of information was greatly increased, with all information relating to Call 2 being available through a dedicated ESF page on the departmental (DfE) website;
- A series of six stakeholder consultation events were held in June 2017 to discuss the proposed high level approach to the Call 2 application process and provide stakeholders with information on the application process, the revised performance targets and the introduction of simplified cost options. Two pre-launch stakeholder events were held on 5 and 7 September to advise stakeholders of the application process and revised scoring matrix. All events were well attended and positively received.
- The Call 2 application process formerly opened on Monday 11 September at 10am and closed at noon Friday 13 October. Of the 92 applications received, 87 went through the assessment stage with 61 successfully meeting the assessment criteria and 26 unsuccessful. All applicants were

informed of their outcome on 11 December 2017, with unsuccessful applicants having the right to appeal their outcome by 18 December 2017. 13 were received and out of those, 8 have had their appeal upheld. There are therefore a final total of 69 successful applications for Call 2 of the programme. Letters of Offer are scheduled to be issued in March 2018 following due diligence checks and it is anticipated that ESF Call 2 projects will be ready to commence on 1 April 2018.

- The Managing Authority will hold follow-on workshops and individually engage with all successful projects, well in advance of the 1 April 2018 date.
- Increased social media activity including 15 tweets (generating 35,197 impressions), 104 retweets, 710 engagements and 65 likes;
- Upload of 5 case studies, with one translated into French;
- Development of programme specific branding materials promoting ESF, including pop-up stands, posters and leaflets;
- Engagement at the First World Conference on Supported Learning;
- An advertising campaign for Call 2 and 2 pre-launch events in September rolled out across 3 national newspapers;
- The ESF Communication Plan offered good VFM (value for money) as actions greatly increased the availability and promotion of ESF information across stakeholders and customers.

6. ISSUES AFFECTING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE PROGRAMME AND MEASURES TAKEN (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013)

(a) Issues which affect the performance of the programme and the measures taken

Managing Authority (MA) designation and e-cohesion

DfE had been acting as the de facto MA and CA for the ESF Programme 2014-2020. Formal designation had been delayed due to addressing issues in the MCS identified in the 2007-13 Programme. The MA has developed enhanced MCS to address the issues identified – these systems were subject to AA review. Furthermore, the MA could not be granted formal designation until e-cohesion requirements (CPR, Article 122 (3)) were satisfied in full.

Following the introduction of the first stages of the ESIF database in 2017, with a report by the AA recording an unqualified assurance of the MA's MCS, formal designation of DfE was confirmed in July 2017. Full roll-out of the database is not expected until the middle of 2018.

Modification to the OP

A formal modification to the OP was submitted by the MA and accepted by the EC on 15 December 2017. The high level changes related to aspects of Call 2 for PA 1, 2, and 4. These included:

- Introduction of a new simplified costs funding model;
- Changes to programme performance indicators; and
- Increase in the financial allocation to PA 4.

In preparation for Call 2, the MA conducted a review of the performance indicators, against actual performance data as at March 2017 and, in light of a much changed socio-economic landscape in NI. As a result of the modification the targets much more accurately reflect the levels of programme activity on the ground. Both interventions are therefore operating at the required level and the MA anticipates meeting the associated programme targets in full.

N+3 and ESF Drawdown

For the OP, the target for the financial indicators in the PR are currently set at 45.73% of the financial allocation, well in excess of the N+3 allocation, and would require full expenditure prior to full programme implementation in 2020. In light of the unrealistic rationale, and to ensure that expenditure profiling remains aligned with actual ESF operational activity, the MA is currently considering

reallocation of the financial allocations across PA 1, 2 and 3.

The CA submitted the first financial drawdown (consisting entirely of expenditure relating to PA 3) worth a total of \notin 34.42 million on 30 November 2017. Subsequently, ESF spend of \notin 13.77 million (40% ESF) was approved and drawn down by the MA. This expenditure exceeded the N+3 target for 2017 of \notin 11.25m by \notin 2.52m. Further drawdown relating to PA 1, 2, and 3 is planned for 2018.

As noted above, the current PR financial milestones require a much higher level of spend to be certified by 31st December 2018. Having reviewed the position following the Call 2 application process it is clear that reallocation across the priorities and re-profiling of expenditure will also be required to fully utilise the Programme allocations.

Operational Expenditure & Claims Processing

For PA 1 and 2, a simplified administrative process was introduced and applied to operations where previous claim data had no or limited errors, resulting in a more efficient claims processing system. The IB have been proactive to ensure submission of claims in a more regular and timely fashion. This will expedite the closure of Call 1, and move to the more streamlined and simplified process for Call 2.

To date, beneficiaries have submitted programme expenditure of $\in 38.95$ m across PA 1, comprising of $\notin 23.2$ m for operations delivering TO8i, and $\notin 15.75$ m for TO8ii. A further $\notin 19.6$ m remains committed to PA 1 for the remainder of Call1. For PA 2, $\notin 39.96$ m expenditure has been submitted by beneficiaries, comprising of $\notin 33.18$ m for TO9i (a), and $\notin 6.78$ m for TO9i (b). $\notin 13.8$ m remains committed to PA 2 for the outrun of Call 1. Call 2 has an estimated expenditure of $\notin 204$ m bringing the estimate across PAs 1 and 2 to approximately $\notin 316.3$ m.

Across PA 3, circa \in 50 million (\in 20.4 million ESF) has been claimed, including \in 222k in respect of HLAs (\in 89k co-financing). For PA 3, total expenditure of \in 140.1m remains committed for AppsNI (\in 108.6m) and HLA (\in 31.5m). Taking into account the \in 34.4m approved for PA 3, this represents a total of almost \in 175m. As the target for PA 3 is \in 205,353,090, it is clear that reallocation across the priorities and reprofiling of expenditure will be required in order to fully utilise the financial allocations.

In light of current activity levels, the MA would not anticipate any financial reallocation impacting on the programme performance indicators. At this juncture, subject to financial re-profiling, the ESF 2014-2020 programme for NI therefore remains on course to meet its targets in full.

Indicator Verification Checks

For PAs 1 and 2, verification work is being finalised. Checks have been enhanced to include verification of data against CMS – a comprehensive database for participants engaged on training programmes. The IB, in consultation with the MA has also provided improved guidance to beneficiaries and, as a result a

significant amount of data that could not previously be reported, is subject to these enhanced checks. Once completed, the MA forecasts a rise in participants across PAs 1 and 2.

AIR 2016 and data completeness

The MA previously reported significant gaps in the participant data, due to completeness requirements. The MA prompted engagement by the IB with PA 1 and 2 operations resulting in significant improvements, with over 95% of records now having the requisite output indicators. This data is yet to be subject to the enhanced verification process and, as a result the MA anticipates seeing significant increases in reported values during the next reporting period.

ISCED Levels

A closer analysis of last year's data revealed 6,698 participant records that had captured 'no educational attainment level'. During IB engagement with operations it was discovered that the participant's existing skill level (qualification) was captured as opposed to educational attainment.

As the legislation in NI requires for compulsory full-time education up to a minimum school leaving age of 16 (see The Education and Libraries (NI) Order 1986 – Articles 45 and 46) the MA believes this data is being misreported. The MA intends to report these participants as ISCED 1-2, except were a participant specifically indicates they have not completed primary education. The data reported will be subject to the enhanced verification checks described above.

Long-term Result Indicators

Previously, the MA had required beneficiaries to capture long-term result-indicator data for the entire participant population. This has proven both challenging and administratively burdensome, and as a result long-term results data is incomplete. The MA has therefore agreed to rescind this requirement, instead preferring to capture this data via representative sampling.

(b) An assessment of whether progress made towards targets is sufficient to ensure their fulfilment, indicating any remedial actions taken or planned, where appropriate.

Priority 1

IP 8(i) has supported 6,164 unemployed which represents 58.7% progress towards the 2018 performance milestone (10,500) and 22.01% progress towards the final target for 2023 (28,000). A further 3,451 inactive have been supported, which constitutes progress of 57.52% against the 2018 milestone (6,000) and 21.57% progress against the 2023 target (16,000).

25.45% (1,569) unemployed have progressed into employment, well in excess of the target value for 2023 of 13.75% (3,850). 22.37% (772) inactive have been moved into employment, well above the 2023 target of 13.75% (2,200). A further 11.47% (396) inactive have entered education/training. This figure is slightly under target (13.75%), however this is anticipated to rise, as a large number of the cohort are still participating on operations.

For IP 8(ii) 3,797 participants received support, representing 67.68% of the 2018 milestone figure (5,610). 14.85% of participants (564) have progressed into employment, against a target of 12% (1,800), and 27.6% (1,048) have entered education/training against a 2023 target of 35% (5,250).

Priority 2

P2 focuses on social inclusion, and comprises of 1 IP - 9i, including two sub-priorities, 9i (a) participants with disabilities, and 9i (b) NEET participants within families receiving CFSP. These sub-priorities are reported under the same IP 9(i), however a brief analysis of each is detailed here.

Under 9i (a) a total of 3,814 received ESF support, representing progress of 78.56% towards the 2018 milestone (4,850) and 34.54% progress against the programme's final target of 13,000. 8.86% (338) have progressed into employment, against a programme target of 10% (1,300) by 2023. A further 10.57% (403) participants have entered education/training on leaving against the target for 2023 of 15% (1,950).

For IP 9i (b) the intervention has supported 1,362, which constitutes 72.45% of the 2018 milestone target (1,880) and 27.02% progress towards the 2023 target for the indicator (5,040). 12.78% (174) have progressed into employment, against a 2023 target of 10% (505), whilst 21.81% (297) have progressed into education/training against the 2023 target of 20% (1,010).

Immediate result figures will continue to rise as participants exit operations and all P1 and 2 interventions continue to perform well in their progress against the targets set in the modified OP. Enhanced verification checks by the IB are ongoing, in tandem with further engagement with beneficiaries to ensure achievement of the performance targets for P1 and P2 operations. The MA is confident of meeting the 2018 milestone target for the IPs, and that progress continues towards the associated result targets for

2023.

Priority 3

Preliminary indicators (see ApprenticeshipsNI statistical bulletins) are extremely positive with 21,162 participants working towards an apprenticeship/HLA. 5,519 have achieved a level 2 qualification, and 4,538 achieved a level 3, with 69% of leavers having achieved their targeted Level 2 and 69% having achieved the targeted Level 3 (Statistical Bulletin ApprenticeshipsNI 2013/2017, Figure 6). A number of participants are still in occupancy working towards their qualification, therefore result indicators are purely indicative and not fully representative of progress currently. As at October 2017, 38% of enrolments targeted a level 2 qualification, 21% towards level 2 en route to 3, and 42% level 3.
