Further Education Activity in Northern Ireland by Local Government District: 2013/14 to 2017/18

This new statistical fact sheet presents a range of analysis regarding enrolments in the Northern Ireland Further Education Sector covering academic years 2013/14 to 2017/18. The analysis covers all enrolments, regulated enrolments, higher education enrolments as well as qualifications and performance (retention, achievement and success rates) by Local Government District.

The figures in this statistical fact sheet are a full year count of enrolments; however, it should be noted that students may be enrolled on more than one course at a given time and may, therefore, be counted as two or more enrolments. It is our intention to release future editions of this fact sheet annually. The second edition will be released early in 2020. Unknown*: Postcodes with unassigned LGDs are mainly accounted for by Republic of Ireland (RoI) domiciled student enrolments (70.6%, 2,748).

- In 2017/18, Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon LGD had the highest proportion of the 155,510 enrolments, accounting for 14.3% (22,262), and Mid and East Antrim the lowest, with 5.5% (8,599).
- In all eleven LGDs, over half of student enrolments were at one particular college. However, this ranged from Fermanagh and Omagh, where 96.2% of student enrolments were at South West College, to Causeway Coast and Glens, where 52.2% of student enrolments were at Northern Regional College.
- Over a third of enrolments from students residing in either Antrim and Newtownabbey LGD or Lisburn and Castlereagh LGD were at Belfast Metropolitan College (35.3% and 33.5% respectively).
- Notably, in North West Regional College (NWRC) a relatively large number of enrolments did not have an associated postcode (2,252), accounted for mainly by Republic of Ireland (Rol) domiciled students (78.2%, 1,760).

Unknown*: Postcodes with unassigned LGDs are mainly accounted for by Republic of Ireland (RoI) domiciled student enrolments (approximately 70%).

- Total enrolments at FE colleges increased by 1.6% between 2016/17 (153,088) and 2017/18 (155,510); however, they have decreased by a net 14.0% since 2013/14 (180,825).
- Since 2013/14, enrolments have decreased in net terms in each of the 11 Local Government Districts.
- The largest percentage net decrease has been in Belfast (28.7%), from 25,746 in 2013/14 to 18,369 in 2017/18. As a result, Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon has taken over from Belfast, with the most enrolments (22,262) in 2017/18.
- The smallest percentage net decrease has been in Mid and East Antrim (2.8%), from 8,848 in 2013/14 to 8,599 in 2017/18.




Figure 2: All enrolments by Local Government District and academic year

Unknown*: Postcodes with unassigned LGDs are mainly accounted for by Republic of Ireland (RoI) domiciled student enrolments (approximately 70%).

- Regulated enrolments at FE colleges increased by 0.3% between 2016/17 (128,629) and 2017/18 (129,054); however, they have decreased by a net 9.0% since 2013/14 (141,778).
- Since 2013/14, regulated enrolments have decreased in net terms in nine of the eleven Local Government Districts.
- The largest percentage net decrease has been in Belfast (23.9%), from 21,367 in 2013/14 to 16,256 in 2017/18.
- The largest percentage net increase has been in Causeway Coast and Glens (7.0%), from 8,809 in 2013/14 to 9,429 in 2017/18.




Figure 3: Regulated enrolments by Local Government District and academic year

Unknown*: Postcodes with unassigned LGDs are mainly accounted for by Republic of Ireland (RoI) domiciled student enrolments (approximately 75%).

- Higher Education enrolments at FE colleges increased by a net 2.3% between 2013/14 (11,576) and 2017/18 (11,848).
- Since 2013/14, higher education enrolments have decreased in net terms in six of the eleven LGDs.
- The largest percentage net decrease has been in Mid and East Antrim (16.2%), from 696 in 2013/14 to 583 in 2017/18.
- The largest percentage net increase has been in Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon (38.3%), from 1,337 in 2013/14 to 1,849 in 2017/18, making it the LGD with the highest number of HE enrolments in the FE sector, ahead of Newry, Mourne and Down (1,615) and Belfast (1,417).




Figure 4: Higher Education enrolments by Local Government District and academic year

Unknown*: Postcodes with unassigned LGDs are mainly accounted for by qualifications gained by Republic of Ireland (RoI) domiciled students (69.0%, 1,431).

- In 2017/18, Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon had the highest proportion of the 82,770 qualifications achieved, accounting for 15.4% (12,723), and Mid and East Antrim the lowest, with 5.4% (4,480).
- In all eleven LGDs, over half of student qualifications achieved were at one particular college. However, this ranged from Antrim and Newtownabbey, where 50.4% of qualifications were at Northern Regional College, to Fermanagh and Omagh, where 95.9% of qualifications were at South West College.
- Over a third of qualifications achieved by students residing in either Antrim and Newtownabbey LGD or Lisburn and Castlereagh LGD were undertaken at Belfast Metropolitan College (39.9% and 34.0% respectively).
- Notably, in North West Regional College (NWRC), a relatively large number of qualifications awarded did not have an associated postcode (1,207), accounted for mainly by those gained by Rol domiciled students (78.2%, 944).

Figure 5: Proportion of qualifications by Local Government District in 2017/18



- The number of qualifications achieved at FE colleges decreased by a net 8.9% between 2013/14 (90,851) and 2017/18 (82,770).
- Since 2013/14, the number of qualifications awarded has decreased in net terms in nine of the eleven Local Government Districts.
- The largest percentage net decrease has been in Fermanagh and Omagh (26.5%), from 6,546 in 2013/14 to 4,812 in 2017/18.
- The largest percentage net increase has been in Causeway Coast and Glens (2.7%), from 5,647 in 2013/14 to 5,798 in 2017/18.




Figure 6: Number of qualifications achieved by Local Government District and academic year

Unknown*: Postcodes with unassigned LGDs are mainly accounted for by final year enrolments/completers and qualifications gained by Republic of Ireland (RoI) domiciled students (approx. 70%).

- The retention rate for the FE sector was 90.3% in 2017/18, while those across the eleven LGDs ranged from 87.2% in Mid and East Antrim to 92.2% in Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon.
- While the success rate for the FE sector was 77.0% in 2017/18, the success rates across the eleven LGDs ranged from 72.7% in Mid and East Antrim to 82.5% in Ards and North Down.
- In 2017/18, the success rate in Ards and North Down (82.5%) was 3.0 percentage points higher than the second highest success rate of 79.5% at Lisburn and Castlereagh.




Figure 7: Performance rates of final year regulated enrolments by Local Government District in 2017/18

- In 2017/18, almost a fifth (18.4%) of the NI population (aged 16 and over) lived in the Belfast LGD, whereas, Belfast made up 11.8% (18,369) of the 155,510 enrolments in the NI FE sector
- In contrast, while 11.1% of the NI population (aged 16 and over) lived in Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon, this LGD accounted for 14.3% (22,262) of the 155,510 enrolments in the NI FE sector. Similarly, 9.4% of the NI population (aged 16 and over) lived in Newry, Mourne and Down, which accounted for 12.4% (19,312) of the 155,510 enrolments in the NI FE sector.
- When considering the LGD proportions of the NI population against the LGD proportion of NI FE sector enrolments, it should be noted there are no unknown postcodes for population, but there are 2.5% unknown postcodes with regards to FE sector enrolments. Of the 3,892 enrolments with unknown postcodes in the FE sector, 2,748 were Rol domiciled student enrolments, accounting for 1.8% of enrolments within the sector.




Figure 8: All enrolments in NI FE colleges and NI Population aged 16+ by Local Government District in 2017/18

1. Figures are correct as at 12th October 2018.

- 2. The Local Government District is based on the postcode provided by the student at the time of enrolment.
- 3. The level of study indicates the nationally recognised qualification level of the course.
- 4. From academic year 2013/14 onwards, 'regulated enrolments' consist of Higher Education courses ('Level 4 or above') and courses at 'Level 3 or below' that appear on either the Register of Regulated Qualifications (RRQ) or DfE's Prescribed List of Approved Qualifications (PLAQ).
- 5. The dataset was created using the Central Postcode Directory. Approximately 3% of all enrolments are not assigned to a Local Government District due to invalid geo-referencing or non Northern Ireland domicile students.
- 6. Performance analysis is based on Final Year Enrolments and excludes Transfers.
- 7. Withdrawals are included where there is an achieved outcome.
- 8. Those in their final year who have completed the course and subsequently achieved are regarded as final year achievements.
- 9. Achievements used to calculate achievement rates are final year full and partial achievements.
- 10. Retention rate is defined as the proportion of the number of enrolments who complete their final year of study to the number of final year enrolments.
- 11. Achievement rate relates to the percentage of the number of enrolments who complete their final year of study and achieve their qualification to the number of enrolments who complete their final year of study.
- 12. Success rate is the overall measure of performance, which is the proportion of the number of enrolments who complete their final year of study and achieve their qualification to the number of final year enrolments.
- 13. Tables for lower geographies, for example, District Electoral Area and Ward are available from NISRA's Neighbourhood Information Service (NINIS) and Open Data NI.
