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#### FOREWORD BY THE EASTERN DIVISIONAL ROADS MANAGER

I am very pleased to present my Spring Report to Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council.

DFI Roads Eastern Division covers the two Council areas of Belfast and Lisburn & Castlereagh. It is one of four Divisions, each of which manages, improves and maintains the transport network and is the primary contact point for road users and public representatives.

This report deals with works completed in the Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council area during the year 2017/18 and sets out our programme of schemes being undertaken in the year 2018/19.

There are pressures on both capital and resource funding again in 2018-19. On the capital side, my staff will continue to develop Local Transport and Safety Measures to enhance safety, improve traffic flow and provide measures for pedestrians and cyclists.

The overall 2018/ 19 structural maintenance capital budget is £75m for Northern Ireland. Of that, £15m has been set aside for a roads recovery fund which is being used to address areas of immediate need across the road network. Almost 40,000 surface defects have been repaired in the last few months. This level of funding will allow us to continue to identify those roads most in need of repair and prioritise this work alongside other ongoing priorities.

Whilst there is a slight increase in our resource budget this year, there remains a significant reliance on in-year funding to deliver core services. As the year progresses we will continue to bid for additional funding to maintain the integrity of the road network.

I am pleased to report that a wide programme of Maintenance, and Local Transport and Safety schemes was delivered last year.

I would encourage Councillors to continue to contact the relevant members of my staff in relation to operational matters and they will do their best to assist.

I hope that you find this report informative. Dfl Roads values constructive comment on all its activities and I look forward to meeting Council members on 29th May 2018.




Figure 1 – Organisation Context



#### WHAT WE DO

#### Maintaining the road network

#### Structural maintenance

Maintaining the network in a safe and serviceable condition remains one of our highest priorities.

Structural maintenance includes:

- The resurfacing and surface dressing of roads and footways
- The repair of surface defects, such as potholes and broken flagstones
- The replacement and repair of road gullies, culverts and manholes

Within the Eastern Division area in 2017/18 we:

- Invested £7.7 million on structural maintenance
- resurfaced 52.58 lane km of the road network
- resurfaced 10.08 km of footways

#### Condition of the network

Monitoring the condition of our road network is an essential part of planning maintenance work and, in order to detect deterioration at an early stage, we undertake a number of annual road condition surveys using specialist vehicles to measure the strength, surface condition and skidding resistance of our roads.

In 2017/18 71.2% of the motorway and 75.4% of trunk road network had a residual life of more than 5 years compared to a target of 70% respectively. The information from the survey gives us an indication of areas of the road network which require further investigation and are likely to require maintenance.

#### Routine maintenance

Routine maintenance is important, both to enhance user safety and to help prevent more significant and costly maintenance problems building up over time.

In Eastern Division during 2017/18 we:

- Invested around £0.72 million replacing road markings, cutting grass verges to maintain visibility, emptying gullies and maintaining or replacing safety barriers, and maintaining street trees, verges and fences.
- Repaired 31,206 road defects following inspections.

#### Managing the road

The Traffic Information and Control Centre (TICC) is located within Belfast City Council area and from this location Dfl Roads manage:

- 330 sets of traffic signal controller junctions
- 600 sets of traffic signal controlled pedestrian crossings
- 45 motorway gantries
- 73 motorway Variable Message Signs
- Use approximately 160 CCTV cameras to monitor the road network in real time

We also disseminate real time travel information through the use of Social media

- with 30,715 followers on Twitter,
- in excess of 650,000 unique users on Trafficwatchni.com website in 2016 and
- approximately 3,000 users registered to receive emergency e-mail alerts.

We manage the road network to promote its safety and efficient operation. We have continued to make use of the latest technology and traffic management techniques to improve road safety, provide facilities for all road users, and effectively manage the network. This has included:

- Monitoring and management of traffic signal timings
- Responding to at least 92% of urgent traffic signal faults within 24 hours
- The use and extension of traffic control and monitoring systems
- The promotion and introduction of Puffin crossings
- The provision and management of motorway control systems
- The supply and management of road traffic signs
- The internal dissemination of collision records to help target areas of safety concern
- The provision of accurate and reliable traffic information to the public including replies to traffic count queries and the provision of the annual traffic count census report.

Within Eastern Division during 2017/18 we:

- Provided pre-trip information on the trafficwatchni website, <u>www.trafficwatchni.com</u>,via radio broadcasts and our traffic information telephone line 08457123321.
- Commenced the upgrade of traffic signals at 1 signalised junction. [DN: other parts of Eastern Division may have undertaken similar work as well as BRT].
- Completed the migration of the Urban Traffic Control Communications system (UTC) to a new operating platform to ensure its continued robustness and expandability.
- Completed the upgrade of 2 pedestrian crossings. [DN: again other parts of Eastern Division may have undertaken similar work as well as BRT].
- Commenced the migration of the CCTV control system to a new operating platform to ensure its continued robustness and expandability.

#### Winter Service

The aim of winter service is to help, as far as possible, main road traffic to move safely and freely in wintry conditions by spreading salt at the most effective times.

Eastern Division, has a fleet of 23 gritters and over 100 personnel available to salt approximately, 1,306km of main roads.

There were 115 call-outs this year, using around 20,148 tonnes of salt, at a cost of approximately £15k per call-out to treat all roads on the salting schedule. Eastern Division completed 92% of winter salting actions within 4 hours.

Our total winter service expenditure was £1.68 million.

#### Emergency Response Service

We have procedures in place to assist with roads related emergency incidents to ensure a response, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Our emergency response procedures are supported by a well-established reporting system to gather operational information from across Northern Ireland during an emergency. A lead communicator is available out of hours all year round to ensure that the latest news on road conditions is available to the travelling public and we have enhanced the trafficwatch website to enable the lead communicator to keep this information updated including Social Media System and Twitter.

#### Development Control and Private Streets

Development Control staff act as consultee to Planning Service, providing advice on road safety, traffic progression, transportation, roads layout/standards and policy compliance. During the 2017/18 financial year, Eastern Division dealt with over 2,500 planning application consultations and processed an average of 75% of these within 15 working days. In relation to new housing developments, 10km of Private Streets have been determined in 2017/18. This means that if and when the streets are built to the agreed layout and standard, they will be adopted into the public roads network.70 new development sites have started since April 2017 representing approximately 6.5km of new roads and footways. At 31 March 2018 we held £24.5M in bonds, and during 2017/18, £4M of new bonds were processed with £2.8M released on adoption.

#### Street Works

Our road network is a major public asset valued at over £32 billion. It accommodates a network of underground pipes and cables which deliver key services to the public including water supply, waste water disposal, electricity, gas and telecommunications.

Utility companies have the right to open the public road to place or maintain their equipment. In 2017/18 there were 46,703 utility company road openings across Northern Ireland, with some 13,852 in Eastern Division. We work closely with utility companies to minimise disruption caused by street works and ensure better quality reinstatements.

Our Inspectors in Eastern Division have carried out over 3,430 visits to street works sites to inspect work in progress and completed reinstatements.

#### Improving the Road Network

#### Major Road Improvements

Network Development Section progress the development of major road improvement schemes in the Strategic Road Improvement Programme. Delivery of these schemes is dependent on funding levels envisaged through the Investment Strategy for Northern Ireland 2011-21 and future budget settlements.

In Eastern Division there are three major road improvement schemes currently at development stage. These are the York Street Interchange, the A55 Knock Road and the A2 Sydenham Bypass.

- York Street Interchange on the 15 November 2016, Chris Hazzard MLA, Dfl Minister, announced the publication of the outcome of the Public Inquiry into this scheme. This included the publication of the Public Inquiry Inspector's Report and the Departmental Statement.
- The procurement process for the York Street Interchange has been progressed in parallel with the statutory process. The tender process to appoint a Contractor to bring the scheme to a construction ready stage has now been completed, however tender award cannot occur due to a legal challenge. The legal process is ongoing, with the court hearing having finished and the judgement being awaited.
- Following a Ministerial direction, the process of consulting local residents and key stakeholders on issues identified in the Inspector's Report has now commenced.

The commencement of construction for the York Street Interchange will depend on the satisfactory completion of an economic assessment, completion of the statutory process and subject to funding being made available in future budget settlements.

#### Bridge Strengthening

Dfl Roads regularly inspects its stock of bridges and other structures on the public road network.

Last year across Eastern Division we inspected 134 structures and carried out maintenance and repair work to 21 structures. In 2016/17 we spent a total of £240k on strengthening and maintaining our current stock of bridges, culverts and retaining walls.

#### Local Transport and Safety Measures

In 2017/18 we spent over £3.5 million on a range of measures to improve the safety and efficiency of the road network. In Eastern Division this included implementation of:

- 20 Minor Works improvement schemes;
- 5 Collision Remedial measures at specific sites;
- 2 Traffic Calming measures;
- 5.4 kms of new cycle facilities;
- 2 Controlled Pedestrian Crossings;
- Improvements to the trafficwatch website and the motorway control system as well as continuously ongoing work to improve the performance of our traffic signals and pedestrian controlled crossings.

#### Street Lighting

We provide and maintain street lighting on all adopted roads in urban areas and in certain circumstances, on rural roads.

In 2017/18 we spent £2.12 million installing new and maintaining existing lighting systems in Eastern Division. This excludes the energy costs which were £3.06 million.

Budget constraints have meant that the Department has faced periods of significant street lighting resource pressures over the last two years. While budget pressures still exist this year, our initial allocation for street lighting maintenance allows us to continue using our external contractors to carry out street lighting repairs at this time. However, the continuation of this service for the full year will depend on the outcome of monitoring rounds.

#### Belfast Rapid Transit

We provide the infrastructure necessary for the proposed new Belfast Rapid Transit (BRT). Buses to operate reliably.

BRT has been divided into a number of schemes and in 2017/18 we spent £13M in carrying out widening of the carriageway to achieve 4x3m running lanes, relocation of services and resurfacing of the footway and carriageway. The necessary legislation to provide 12 hour bus lanes has also been progressed in conjunction with this. The Rapid Transit system is currently expected to be operational in September 2018.

During 2017/18 the following schemes have been completed: -

- Albertbridge Road (Between Castlereagh Street and Newtownards Road)
- Andersonstown Road/Stewartstown Road (Between Finaghy Road North and Michael Ferguson Roundabout)

The following schemes are currently underway: -

- Upper Newtownards Road (Between Knock Road and Dunlady Road)
- Falls Road/Andersonstown Road (Between Whiterock Road and Finaghy Road North)
- Stewartstown Road (Between Michael Ferguson Roundabout and McKinstry Road Roundabout)
- CITI Route (City Centre and Victoria Street to Queens Road)

These schemes are to be completed summer 2018 prior to Belfast Rapid Transit becoming operational in September 2018.

#### **Customer Service**

Dfl Roads aims to inform, consult and involve customers by:-

- supplying up-to-date information through our publications, at shows and exhibitions and via our website http://www.drdni.gov.uk and;
- listening to customer needs; and
- remaining open, transparent and visible at all times.

We publish a wide range of information leaflets on specific road schemes and on the services we provide. Our free newspaper, "On the Move", is published twice a year and distributed through our local offices and public libraries.

We provide up-to-date travel news through our travel information website <a href="www.trafficwatchni.com">www.trafficwatchni.com</a> and our traffic hotline for Greater Belfast on 08457 123321. Traffic information is updated at 10 minute intervals and broadcast on BBC Radio Ulster during peak times.

During the development phase of major roads projects, we consult with a wide range of stakeholders, including elected representatives and the public and, particularly, those likely to be directly affected by the works. We hold exhibitions at local venues and inform the public through press articles, leaflet drops and individual visits, as necessary.

During 2017/18 we received 3679 written enquiries from the general public and responded to 86% of these within 15 days.

#### 2.3 M1/A1 LINK AT SPRUCEFIELD

The Regional Development Strategy (RDS) identifies the M1 and A1 as one of the five key transport corridors, by forming part of the Eastern Seaboard Corridor, running from Larne to Belfast and on to Dublin. The Belfast Metropolitan Transport Plan (BMTP) also recognises the strategic significance of this route and the existing congestion problems on the M1 and at the M1/A1 junction.



The proposed scheme, which is included in the Strategic Road Improvement Programme, will provide a high standard link between the M1 motorway and the A1. It will be of major benefit to the strategic traffic in reducing journey times by avoiding delays in the Sprucefield area. It is intended that the proposal will also consider congestion at the roundabout junction on the A1 at Hillsborough.

Dfl Roads commissioned consultants to consider a range of options and an evaluation of all of the viable options for capacity enhancement along this route. This first stage of this has been completed and the findings published in a Stage 1 Report, which determined route corridors within which further options will be examined.

Due to current budget priorities there is insufficient funding to allow development work on this scheme to continue. Progression of the scheme will be subject to the availability of funding made available in future budget settlements.

#### 2.4 M1 HARD SHOULDER BUS LANE

There is an existing hard shoulder bus lane on the M1, which operates during peak traffic periods. This runs east bound toward Belfast, from just after the Lisburn Motorway Services Area to Junction 3 at Black's Road, Belfast. Dfl Roads is proposing to extend this back to Junction 8 at Blaris.

A previous proposal to do this in 2017 did not proceed due to higher than expected tendered costs that were received at the procurement stage. Since then Dfl Roads has reviewed the original proposal and developed an alternative proposal, which is currently undergoing a procurement process. Subject to successful completion of this, works are expected to take place in 2018.

#### 2.5 A1 JUNCTIONS PHASE 2

This proposal, which is estimated to cost in the range £40-£50million, involves the construction of four grade separated junctions to facilitate the closing up of all openings in the central median and installation of a continuous central safety barrier between Hillsborough Roundabout and Loughbrickland improving road safety for all road users on the A1. The grade separated junctions will be located at; • Listullycurran Road • Gowdystown Road • Skeltons Road/Drumneath Road and • Waringsford Road In addition, the proposal includes the provision of a northbound on-slip at Castlewellan Road at Banbridge, a link between the existing underpass junction at Hillsborough Road, Dromore and Milebush Road and the closing of nine road junctions along this section of the A1. All other roads will then operate on a left in - left out basis.

Dfl Roads officials held a Community Consultation Events in June 2017 and again in February 2018 to seek the views of the local community and other stakeholders to inform the emerging final design as well as the preparation of an Environmental Impact Assessment for the scheme.

The current phase of this work involves the completion of the detailed design and preparing the Environmental Impact Assessment Report in preparation for taking the proposal through the statutory procedures, which will likely include a Public Inquiry.

The Draft Vesting and Direction Orders are currently programmed in the summer of 2018.

A strategy has been developed to implement incremental improvements in advance of the full proposal. This involves erecting sections of central median safety barrier and where possible, closing up existing median gaps which facilitate right turn manoeuvres.

The first such improvement involved the closure of the central median at Hillsborough to prevent the right turn movement for southbound traffic into Moira Road and the erection of a central safety barrier in the locality. These works were completed on site in March 2017. A second section of central median barrier has recently been completed along the Banbridge bypass section of the A1. Additional sections of barrier installation are currently being considered in the vicinity of the Dromore bypass.

Progression to construction for the full A1 Junctions Phase 2 proposal remains subject to it clearing the statutory procedures, having a satisfactory economic appraisal and, given other competing priorities, is dependent on funding being made available in future budget settlements.
