

 of 100 people due to migration, and negligible other changes.
- The **population aged 65 and over** increased by 400 people (1.7 per cent) to 25,800. The **working age population** decreased by 100 people (-0.1 per cent) to 91,200 people. The number of **children** decreased by 100 people (-0.2 per cent) to 29,200.

Components of Population Change, mid-2021 to mid-2022:






- Over the year ending mid-2022, the **population** increased by 400 people (0.2 per cent) to 164,200 (84,300 females and 80,000 males).






- Over the year ending mid-2022, the **population** remained stable at 150,800 (77,300 females and 73,600 males).


- Over the year ending mid-2022, the **population** increased by 100 people (0.1 per cent) to 117,000 (58,600 females and 58,400 males).




