Overall, Northern Ireland departments face a 0.4% reduction in budgets; DfE's reduction is 1.3% against its 2022/23 year-end position. However, this does not reflect the real reduction in DfE RDEL spending power. In addition to the 1.3% (£13 million) reduction, DfE's one-off savings, totaling £75 million, delivered in 2022/23, must now be replicated in 2023/24, and additional new pressures including pay and price also funded. When comparing the Secretary of State's (SoS's) budget to the Draft Budget 2022–25, DfE must deliver its services with £100 million less and in addition, fund pressures of £30 million identified for 2023/24. Therefore, DfE's overall resource spending power is reduced by £130 million, or 16%.				
DfE does not direct its budget on a regional basis. There will undoubtably be impacts on people in rural areas due to reductions in funding. However, people in rural areas and urban areas will be equally impacted.
