Operating Plan 2023-2024

Health and Safety Executive for Northern Ireland



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Introduction

The Health and Safety Executive for Northern Ireland (HSENI) was established on 1 April 1999 as an executive Non-Departmental Public Body (NDPB) with Crown status and is sponsored by the Department for the Economy (DfE).

This Operating Plan reflects the strategic objectives set out in the HSENI Corporate Plan (CP) (2023 to 2028) which was agreed by the HSENI Board prior to being ratified by the DfE Minister in October 2022.

Mission

HSENI's mission is 'to reduce serious work-related injury and ill health in Northern Ireland' and will focus on:

- preventing the most serious workplace health and safety issues,
- high risk industries and activities,
- sensible and proportionate risk management,
- effective regulation; and
- supporting businesses and the economy.

Over the lifetime of the CP, HSENI will track the three measures below as indicators of the collective success of NI dutyholders. These reflect the reality that HSENI alone cannot deliver a continual downward trend in accidents and ill-health:

- The average number of serious and fatal accidents over the CP will be lower than the average number in the previous CP (32);
- The average number of major accidents over the CP will be lower than the average number in the previous CP (249); and
- The average number of over three day accidents over the CP will be lower than the average number in the previous CP (1790).

Over the lifetime of the CP, HSENI will endeavour to deliver the following outputs to compliment the efforts of NI dutyholders:

- 80,000 interventions which will include 25,000 site visits (in every year 16,000 and 5,000 respectively);
- Three annual cross-cutting themes to tackle a work activity known to be a cause of fatalities, serious injury or ill health;
- Prepare regulations and approved codes of practice to allow the maintenance of a regulatory framework which affords appropriate protections and conditions to workers;
- Meet the targets set out in our Customer Care Charter, notwithstanding any reductions to budget over lifetime of plan;
- Comply with relevant HM Treasury and DoF guidance on financial and risk management; and
- Ensure the highest level of corporate governance within the organisation.

The delivery of the priorities is dependent on factors which are not within HSENI's control such as receiving grant funding from DfE in line with the 2022-2023 settlement to allow us to fill vacancies and have sufficient programme resources to deliver both that occurred statutory and non-statutory functions in an effective manner. Other unforeseen issues such as occurred during the 2018 to 2023 CP also have the potential to inhibit the delivery of our published priorities. For these reasons HSENI remains alert to environmental conditions and operates with flexibility and agility as successfully demonstrated in recent years.

The detailed divisional and sectoral priorities in this Operating Plan will assist staff in understanding HSENI's overall aims and objectives and the role that each plays in contributing to HSENI realising its mission.

Annex 2: Resources and Risks

HSENI currently has 118 staff in post (131 Complement), of whom approximately 80% are engaged in frontline service delivery. HSENI is sponsored by the Department for the Economy.

Under the arrangements set out under Section 59 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998, HSENI will be allocated a budget settlement. At the time of seeking Board approval for this document, the budget settlement for 2023-24 has not issued. Historically, approximately 93% of HSENI's budget is used for salaries and approximately 7% is used for programme expenditure. HSENI normally receives a small amount of capital which is used to ensure that appropriate tangible and intangible fixed assets are available to support the organisation in pursuing its objectives.

The resources available to HSENI will be kept under constant review and, if appropriate, bids for additional resources will be made to the Department where these are needed to ensure that HSENI is equipped to deal with emerging pressures and to provide for future organisational development. Likewise, if appropriate, money will be surrendered to the Department for the Economy in the event that HSENI is unable to spend all of the budget.

HSENI maintains a corporate risk register that identifies the significant risks faced by the organisation which, if realised, may impact negatively on one or more of its key objectives being satisfactorily met. Current and emerging risks are discussed monthly by HSENI's Senior Management Team, and the risk register is reviewed by the Board's Audit and Risk Management Committee (ARMC) on a quarterly basis to ensure that there are adequate controls in place or to identify additional actions deemed necessary to manage the risks to an acceptable level commensurate with the agreed risk appetite. The risk register is also considered at Board meetings as part of the regular ARMC report to Board members and at quarterly Oversight & Liaison meetings with the Department for the Economy.
