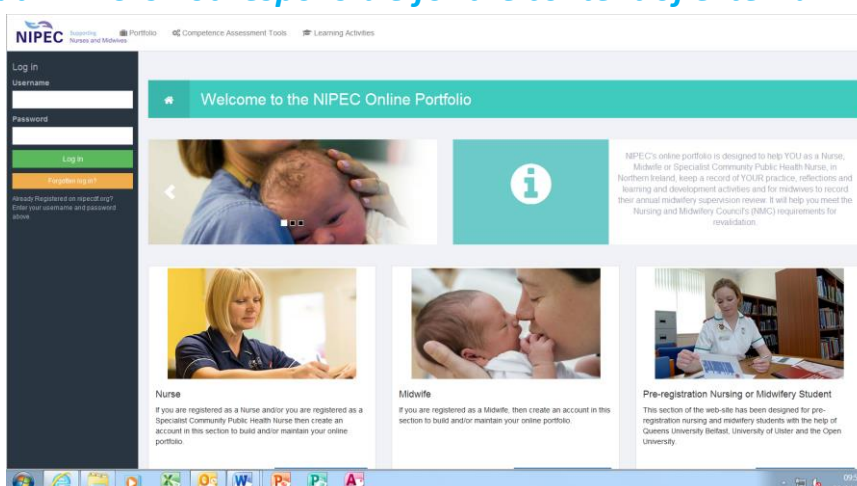

RQIA's report of its Review of Operation of Health and Social Care Whistleblowing Arrangements September 2016

This review is part of a wider Department of Health review in response to Sir Liam Donaldson's Report, *The Right Time The Right Place* (December 2014) . RQIA's independent review team, which included representation from whistleblowing charity - Public Concern at Work, examined whistleblowing arrangements in HSC organisations across Northern Ireland. This review makes 11 recommendations to improve whistleblowing arrangements within HSC organisations, including: the development of a model policy for raising concerns in HSC bodies; and piloting a confidential helpline to advise and support staff in raising concerns.
