




Figure 2 - Population per 100 ha of Utilised Agricultural Area (UAA), 2021




Figure 3 - Gross turnover and full time equivalent (FTE) workforce by food processing subsector in NI, 2020




Figure 4 - Proportion of gross turnover by subsector in NI, 2020














Figure 9 - Estimated value of recorded landings of fish into NI, 2013 - 2021
