Background to Source Data

Background to Source Data

- ✤ HMRC Regional Trade Statistics (RTS) have been the basis of the analysis.
- Data are downloaded from the HMRC website: <u>https://www.uktradeinfo.com/Statistics/RTS/Pages/default.aspx</u>
- ✤ Data are presented for the calendar years 2015, 2016 and 2017.
- A proportion of the import and export data from the HMRC database could not be attributed to any UK region. The data appear as 'unknown' within the tables.
- The HMRC database provided a figure for 'Low Value Trade' (LVT). LVT cannot be attributed to a geographical country therefore will only be included in the 'unknown' category in the slides for Total UK and Rest of World (RoW) Imports and Exports.
- The data are only available for goods. Trade in services is not included in this analysis.
- Note that NI imports / exports do not include trade from GB. EU trade does not include the rest of the UK / GB.
- ✤ The data from companies who are not registered for VAT are not included in RTS.
- Figures may not add due to rounding.
- The RTS data may be subject to quarterly revisions. 2017 data at the time of this analysis (March 2018) are still provisional and therefore subject to change.

Summary of Key Messages

Summary of key messages

- NI imports increased by 13% from £6,574m in 2015 to £7,443m in 2017, whilst exports increased at a slightly faster rate of 19% from £7,164m in 2015 to £8,553m in 2017.
- Rol is NI's biggest trading partner for both imports and exports. Outside of the EU the US is a key market for imports and exports.
- Other key trading countries in terms of imports are China (9%), the Netherlands (9%) and Germany (7%), with Canada (6%), France (5%) and Germany (5%) important export markets.
- From 2015-2017 NI experienced a trade surplus. NI's trade surplus in 2017 was £1,110m with total exports 15% higher than total imports.
- NI accounted for 2% of total UK imports from the EU and RoW, whilst 3% of the UK's exports were from NI.


- NI imports increased by 13% from \pounds 6,574m in 2015 to \pounds 7,443m in 2017.

- Exports to the EU increased from 54% in 2015 to 56% in 2017.

Imports from Rol accounted for 28% of total NI imports


Northern Ireland Imports by origin in 2017



- 63% of imports into NI came from 5 countries: Rol (28%), United States (10%), China (9%), Netherlands (9%) and Germany (7%).
- NI imports increased by 13% from \pounds 6,574m in 2015 to \pounds 7,443m in 2017.

43% of NI imports from the EU were from Rol


Northern Ireland Imports by origin from EU in 2017



- Four countries made up 76% of EU imports into NI: Rol (43%), Netherlands (14%), Germany (12%) and France (7%).
- NI EU imports increased by 16% from £4,139m in 2015 to £4,802m in 2017.




Northern Ireland Imports by origin from RoW in 2017



- 65% of imports from the RoW were from 4 countries: United States (29%), China (25%), Japan (6%) and Turkey (5%).
- NI RoW imports increased by 8% from £2,435m in 2015 to £2,641m in 2017.

Machinery & transport and food & live animals accounted for 45% of total imports


Northern Ireland Imports by Sector (SITC1) in 2017



• 78% of NI imports were from 4 sectors – machinery & transport equipment (25%), food & live animals (20%), manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (17%) and miscellaneous manufactured articles (16%).

Food and live animals and machinery and transport accounted for 46% of EU imports


Northern Ireland Imports by Sector (SITC1) from EU in 2017



78% of NI imports were from 4 sectors in the EU – food & live animals (26%), machinery & transport equipment (20%), manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (18%) and chemicals & related products (14%).

61% of RoW imports were from the machinery & transport and miscellaneous manufacturing sectors

Northern Ireland Imports by Sector (SITC1) from RoW in 2017




4 sectors accounted for 86% of NI imports from the RoW – machinery & transport equipment (35%), miscellaneous manufactured articles (26%), manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (16%) and chemicals & related products (9%).


Northern Ireland Exports by origin in 2017




- 65% of exports went to 5 countries: Rol (32%), United States (17%), Canada (6%), France (5%) and Germany (5%).
- NI exports increased by 19% from £7,164m in 2015 to £8,553m in 2017.

56% of NI's exports to the EU went to Rol in 2017

- 73% of NI EU exports went to Rol (56%), France (9%) and Germany (8%).
- NI's exports increased by 23% from £3,899m in 2015 to £4,812m in 2017.




Exports to US and Canada accounted for 52% of RoW exports

Northern Ireland Exports by destination to RoW in 2017

- 61% of exports to the RoW were to 4 countries: United States (39%), Canada (13%), Thailand (5%) and China (4%).
- NI exports increased by 15% from £3,265m in 2015 to £3,741m in 2017.


Machinery & transport and chemicals & related products produced 51% of total NI exports in 2017

• NI exports mainly to 4 sectors – machinery & transport equipment (34%), chemicals & related products (17%), food & live animals (16%) and miscellaneous manufactured articles (15%).

Food & live animals and machinery & transport sectors provided 50% of NI exports to the EU in 2017











Import of Goods to UK from EU



Import of Goods to UK from RoW








NI accounted for 3% of total UK exports from the EU and RoW

Total UK Export of Goods (EU + RoW)








