DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, ENVIRONMENT AND RURAL AFFAIRS

The Radioactive Substances (Fees and Charges) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 2021

The Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs, with the approval of the Department of Finance, makes the following Scheme in exercise of the power conferred upon it by section 43 (1) and 43 (6) of the Radioactive Substances Act 1993.^(a)

Citation and Commencement

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Radioactive Substances (Fees and Charges) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 2021 and shall come into operation on the 1st April 2021.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Scheme-

“the Act” means the Radioactive Substances Act 1993;

“the Chief Inspector” means the Chief Inspector appointed by the Department under Section 4(7) of the Act; and

“the Department” means the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs;

“HASS” means a high activity sealed radioactive source and has the same meaning as the High Activity Sealed Radioactive Sources Regulations 2005^(b);

(2) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954 (a) shall apply to this Scheme as it applies to an Act of the Assembly.

Application

3. This Scheme applies to:

- (a) an application for registration made under Sections 7 or 10 of the Act;
- (b) an application for authorisation made under Section 13 and 14 of the Act;
- (c) the subsistence of a registration under Section 7 or 10 of the Act;
- (d) the subsistence of an authorisation under Section 13 and 14 of the Act; and
- (e) the variation of a registration or authorisation.

Application Fee

- 4. The prescribed fee for an application specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 shall be the amount mentioned opposite thereto in column 2.

Subsistence Charge

- 5. (1) An annual charge shall be payable in respect of the subsistence of each registration or authorisation.

(2) In the case of a registration or authorisation in operation during any financial year the charge shall be the annual subsistence charge as provided for by sub-paragraph (4) and shall be payable on demand to the Department.

(3) In the case of a registration or authorisation coming into operation during any financial year the charge for that financial year shall be the annual subsistence charge as provided by sub-paragraph (4) calculated pro-rata for the period between the date on which the registration or authorisation comes into operation and the end of the financial year, and shall be payable on demand to the Department on or after the date the registration or authorisation comes into operation.

(4) The annual subsistence charge for the registration or authorisation specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 shall be the amount mentioned opposite in column 2.

Fee for variation of Registration or Authorisation

- 6. (1) A variation fee shall be payable on demand to the Department when the Chief Inspector gives notice of a variation under Section 12(2) or Section 17(3) of the Act.

(2) The fee for the variation of a registration or authorisation specified in column 1 of Schedule 3 shall be the amount mentioned opposite thereto in column 2.

2. Registration under Section 10 of the Act for the use of mobile radioactive apparatus for testing, measuring or otherwise investigating any of the characteristics of substances or articles.	£311
3. Registration under Section 10 of the Act for the use of mobile radioactive apparatus for releasing quantities of radioactive material into the environment or introducing such material into organisms.	£0
4. Registration under Sections 7 and 10 of the Act for the use of HASS material.	£379
5. Registrations under Section 7 and 10 of the Act for the use of "sources of a similar level of potential hazard" ^(a)	£379
