

Public Bodies Annual Report for Northern Ireland, 2015/16

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Introduction

This report presents data on Public Bodies sponsored by the Executive as at 31st March 2016. The report has been prepared using information supplied by the twelve Government Departments¹ and the Food Standards Agency (FSA). It does not include Public Bodies operating here which are sponsored by the Northern Ireland Office (NIO).

Public Appointments and Public Bodies

A Public Body is not part of a Government Department, but carries out its functions to a greater or lesser extent at arm's length from central Government. For this reason Executive Agencies are not included in the Public Appointments presented within this report.

Ministers are ultimately accountable to the Assembly for the activities of the Public Bodies sponsored by their departments and in most cases, except, for example, where there is separate statutory provision, Ministers make the appointments to the boards of Public Bodies.

For the purposes of this report, the term 'Public Body' is a general one which includes Non-Departmental Public Bodies (NDPBs), Public Corporations and Health and Social Care Bodies / Special Agencies. NDPBs are the most common Public Bodies and there are three main types:

Executive NDPBs – established in statute and carrying out administrative, regulatory and commercial functions. They employ their own staff and are allocated their own budgets.

Advisory NDPBs – provide independent and expert advice to Ministers on particular topics of interest. They do not usually have staff but are supported by staff from their sponsoring department. They do not usually have their own budget, as costs incurred fall within the department's expenditure.

Tribunal NDPBs – have jurisdiction in a specialised field of law. They are usually supported by staff from their sponsoring department and do not have their own budgets.

¹ On 8 May 2016 the number of Northern Ireland Civil Service departments were reduced from twelve to nine. This departmental restructuring was subsequent to the time frame of data presented in this report. As such, the previous departmental structure will be used throughout the report.

The overarching principle underpinning the appointment of board members to Public Bodies is that selection should be made on merit, using fair, open and transparent procedures that ensure that the best available candidate is selected and appointed to each post.

The Commissioner for Public Appointments for Northern Ireland (CPANI) regulates the Public Appointment process to ensure that appointments are made on merit and in accordance with the principles set out in the Commissioner's Code of Practice. All Public Bodies and Public Appointments falling within the Commissioner's remit are shown in this Report as 'CPANI Regulated' and all other Public Bodies and Public Appointments are shown as 'Unregulated'. Departments, when making Public Appointments to unregulated bodies, apply the Commissioner's Code of Practice which sets out the principles and procedures to be followed. The Code of Practice is available on the <u>CPANI website</u>.

Non-Departmental Public Bodies

There were **110** Non-Departmental Public Bodies sponsored by the Executive as at 31 March 2016. This figure is made up of **59** Executive NDPBs, **11** Advisory NDPBs, **5** Tribunal NDPBs, **13** Health and Social Care Bodies / Special Agencies, **3** Ad-hoc advisory groups, **19** Other Bodies (including 1 public corporation). Tables 1 provides a breakdown of the number and type of Public Bodies by department. Table 2 provides a list of all public bodies by type and department.

Departmental Public Appointment Plans and Statistics: DARD

1. Policy

During the period of this Report the Department sponsored the following five public bodies:-

- Agri-Food and Biosciences Institute (AFBI)
- Agriculture Wages Board for Northern Ireland (AWB)
- Livestock and Meat Commission for Northern Ireland (LMC)
- Northern Ireland Fishery Harbour Authority (NIFHA)
- Drainage Council for Northern Ireland (DC)

In addition the Department also sponsored two Ad-hoc Advisory Groups – the Agri-Food Strategy Board (AFSB) (sponsored jointly with DETI (Invest NI)) and the TB Strategy Partnership Group (TBSPG). Although membership of these short-term bodies is not regulated by the Commissioner, appointments are made in keeping with the principles of the Commissioner's Code of Practice.

The Department is committed to following the Commissioner's Code of Practice when making appointments to its public bodies. It adheres to the principles that underpin the appointments process including the principles of appointment on merit and equality of opportunity. The Department's Public Appointments Officer is the central point of contact for CPANI and the Central Appointments Unit and disseminates information and provides advice to its sponsor branches responsible for carrying out public appointments competitions. During the appointment process sponsor branches seek to identify a wide field of candidates through public advertisement in the local and agricultural press, by placing the advertisement and candidate information pack on the Department's and NI Direct websites. Sponsor branches also write to a range of organisations and individuals, including those which have potential to identify suitable candidates from under-represented groups

The Department is committed to increase the number of women on its public bodies and to improve diversity generally. Sponsor Branches continue to review their procedures for making appointments with the aim of encouraging more women and other underrepresented groups to apply for positions on the boards of their public bodies. This review includes the scope to adjust selection criteria to widen the pool of potential applicants for appointment competitions.

2. Activity

One Independent Member was appointed to the Agricultural Wages Board (AWB) with effect from 1 April 2015.

Two new board members were appointed to the NI Fishery Harbour Authority (NIFHA) with effect from 1 December 2015. Prior to the appointments competition being advertised, NIFHA staff and Board Members visited the three fishing ports for which NIFHA has responsibility and provided information sessions for potential applicants. The aim was to encourage local people with an interest/knowledge of the industry to submit applications and to encourage more applications from women.

During 2005 a Chair and four Members were appointed to the Livestock and Meat Commission (LMC). These vacancies arose as a result of periods of extension for existing Members coming to an end in the 2015/2016 year. The vacancies were widely advertised and included a welcoming statement focusing on the Department's commitment to equality and encouraged applicants from under-represented groups on DARD's public bodies. Letters were also issued to relevant industry organisations, relevant professional bodies and those on the Department's Section 75 consultee list.

The Drainage Council was reconstituted for a further 4 years with five Council members reappointed and nine new Council members (including two ex officio members) appointed during 2015.

Three new members were appointed and eight members re-appointed to the Agri-food and Biosciences Institute (AFBI) with effect from 1 April 2015. In September a competition was launched to appoint further members to the AFBI Board, to take effect from 1 April 2016. In order to help address under-representation and to encourage more applications from women, in addition to advertising by publication in the press, an information email was issued to various groups on the Department's Section 75 consultee list, augmented by further groups provided by the office of the Commissioner for Public Appointments. Organisations contacted were invited to make their members aware of the appointment opportunities.

3. Future Plans

In 2016/17, a competition will be undertaken to appoint a Deputy Chair to the AFBI Board. Advance notification will be provided to a range of groups representing women, and minority/under-represented groups.

In addition re-appointments will be considered for one board member of the Livestock and Meat Commission and three board members of the NI Fishery Harbour Authority.

The Department ensures that all individuals appointed are committed to the principles of public life and values of public service.

2. Activity

The Department continues to observe its responsibilities in terms of applying equal opportunities considerations to the appointment process within the overriding principle of merit. To encourage diversity in its public appointments, the Department aims to attract as wide a field as possible through, for example, the advertisement of appointments, use of the "All Aboard" publication and by contacting Section 75 groups. All selection panels, for each of the Department's public appointment competitions, contain an Independent Assessor, as supplied by CPANI, and an expert from the field in which the appointments are to be made.

3. Future Plans

The Department of Culture, Arts and Leisure will cease to exist from 8 May 2016. Responsibility for its public appointments will be taken over by the Department for the Communities (DfC).

Departmental Public Appointment Plans and Statistics: DE

1. Policy

The Department of Education (DE) makes appointments to a wide range of public and other bodies serving the education sector ranging from Non Departmental Public Bodies (NDPBs) to school Boards of Governors. The majority of the appointments listed in the DE section of this Annual Report are made by the Minister for Education. The only exception is the appointments the Department makes to the Exceptional Circumstances Body; these are not made by the Minister.

The Department remains committed to the application of public appointment policy and in particular the overarching principle of selection on merit.

Most of the appointments the Department makes to the Boards of the non-departmental public bodies it sponsors are regulated by the Commissioner for Public Appointments for NI (CPA NI) and the Department seeks to comply with the provisions of the Commissioner's Code of Practice when making these appointments.

The Department has a Central Appointments Unit which is responsible for disseminating information on policy, procedures and the Commissioner's Code of Practice, for providing advice and guidance on appointment issues and for liaising with the Commissioner's Office and other Government Departments.

2. Activity

In the period from 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2016, the Department made a total of 156 appointments, 102 of these appointments were to school Boards of Governors and 54 were to several of its NDPBs including the appointment a Chair and 20 members to the Education Authority (the Education Authority replaced the five Education and Library Boards and their Staff Commission), the Council for Catholic Maintained Schools (17), the Council for the Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (3), the Northern Ireland Council for Integrated Education (4), the General Teaching Council for Northern Ireland (4) and the Middletown Centre for Autism (5).

Of the 156 appointments made during 2015/16, 48% of those appointed were male and 52% female.

During this period the Department also appointed a Trustee to the Board of Vaughan's Trust, a charitable body based in Enniskillen and supported by the then Department for Social Development.

As at 31 March 2016, the total number of DE appointments to NDPBs and school Boards of Governors was 393. Of these appointments, 51% were held by men and 49% by women. The comparable figures at 31 March 2015 were 54% and 46% respectively. This means that during the 2015/16 financial year the number of women holding DE public appointments increased by 3%.

The department is also a member of the cross departmental Public Appointments Forum which currently meets quarterly.

3. Future Plans

In the period from 1 April 2016 to 31 March 2017, the Department expects to commence appointment processes seeking candidates for several of its non-departmental public bodies, principally the Council for the Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (CCEA) and the Diocesan Committees of the Council for Catholic Maintained Schools (CCMS) and the Comhairle na Gaelscolaíochta.

Other appointments might need to be made during the course of the year depending on circumstances.

In March 2016, the Executive agreed to set targets for greater gender diversity in public appointments. The targets are:

- to achieve gender equality for appointments made in year by 2017/18; and
- to achieve gender equality for all other appointments by 2020/21.

The Department will continue to advertise its public appointment opportunities widely - in the press, in All Aboard (the six monthly public appointment vacancy bulletins published by OFMDFM), on NI Direct and departmental websites and directly to interested parties and stakeholders – for the purposes of attracting the widest possible pool of applicants.

Departmental Public Appointment Plan: DEL

1. Policy

The Department for the Economy (DfE) came into effect on 8 May 2016 and assumed most of the roles and responsibilities of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Investment (DETI), as well as the functions of the former Department for Employment and Learning (DEL) with the exception of the Employment Service.

DfE is fully committed to the seven key principles which underpin the Code of Practice of the Commissioner for Public Appointments in Northern Ireland. It is our policy to comply in full with the Code; this is reflected in the detailed procedures, which incorporate Central Appointment Unit guidance, and which will be followed by the Department's dedicated Public Appointments Unit in making appointments.

An appointment plan for each competition will be agreed with the Minister before advertising takes place. This will include a diversity section detailing the effort to be made in terms of outreach and process to encourage applications from as wide a range of people as possible. In addition to publicising our public appointment vacancies in the three main newspapers, we will send an e-mailshot out to a large and diverse range of individuals and under-represented groups and organisations for dissemination to their membership and posting to their websites.

2. Activity

DEL's Public Appointments Unit continued to provide guidance and support to sponsor branches on completion of the appointments process by ensuring that a consistent approach was taken. We worked closely with CPANI Independent Assessors, who provided scrutiny of the information we provided to applicants and of our processes. We held diversity workshops with sponsor branches to ensure they are aware of the need to attract a wider pool of diverse applicants, particularly those currently under-represented in NI.

During the period covered by this Annual Report, DEL made a number of public appointments to the governing bodies of its six further education colleges. In making the appointments, we utilised various publicity methods and sought to target groups supporting a wide range of interests including those representing women, people with a disability, ethnic minority communities and young people, all of whom are under-represented on FE college governing bodies. Approaches adopted by the Department included:

- advertising in newspapers, relevant business periodicals, the CPANI website and NI Direct;
- using Departmental and college websites and social media;
- issuing a mailshot to a range of diversity groups and business organisations; and
- Issuing letters to existing members of the relevant governing body and the college Principal asking them to promote the opportunity via personal and college networks, as well as college business/employer contacts.

Consultation with CPANI and the independent assessors led to advertising the vacancies via the Women's' Inspiration Network

(WINET) and direct engagement with local council equality teams to help promoting vacancies within their areas. .

Drawing on Independent Assessors' feedback we introduced Competition Initiation meetings for selection panels. This helped to:

- better set out the context for each competition and gain a shared understanding of the process that would be followed;
- reach early agreement on draft competition documentation;
- provide for more focussed short listing meetings (as introductory discussions had established relationships and agreed standards); and
- enhance the approach to advertising and outreach work to seek increased diversity amongst the potential applicant pool.

From 1st January 2016, the Department introduced remuneration for governing body chairs and members. Chairs are paid at a rate of £20,000 per year and other governing body members (with the exception of college staff members and the Principal) receive remuneration at a rate of £250 for a Governing Body meeting and £150 for a committee meeting or event sanctioned by the Chair. It is envisaged that the benefits will include increased competition for governing body membership, increased retention of governors, increased attendance of governors at meetings, improved skills on the governing body, improved knowledge of governors, and increased diversity of governing body members.

The Department is committed to improving its public appointments policies and processes and will act upon the recommendations and best practice guidance which emanate from the CPANI audit reports.

3. Future Plans

Increasing diversity will be a key challenge to the new Department as the DETI and DEL Public Appointment Units merge and move forward. We will continue to work with sponsor branches to ensure all possible action is being taken and explore how online technologies and PR activities might enhance our capacity to communicate with a broader and more diverse group of people. We will continue to expand and develop the knowledge base of staff working in public appointments

During the forthcoming year the Department will be running the following competitions:

- Industrial Court NI (unregulated) Chair; Deputy Chair; and three Members
- Consumer Council Deputy Chair
- Tourism NI 1 Member
- HSENI Chair
- NI Screen 2 Members

With respect to public appointments to further education colleges, the Department intends to:

 review many aspects of its appointments process, which will include consideration of the application form, the short-listing process and the scoring mechanism in use for recent vacancies; • consider a change to the Further Education (NI) Order 1997 to remove the statutory right of the Education Authority, successor to the five education and library boards, to nominate two persons to the governing body of each of the six colleges. It is envisaged that positions freed by this move will be used to increase the number of CPANI regulated publically appointed governing body members; and commence a review of the remuneration of governing body members after one year of operation.

Departmental Public Appointment Plans and Statistics: DETI

1. Policy

The Department for the Economy (DfE) came into effect on 8 May 2016 and assumed most of the roles and responsibilities of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Investment (DETI), as well as the functions of the former Department for Employment and Learning (DEL) with the exception of the Employment Service.

DfE is fully committed to the seven key principles which underpin the Code of Practice of the Commissioner for Public Appointments in Northern Ireland. It is our policy to comply in full with the Code; this is reflected in the detailed procedures, which incorporate Central Appointment Unit guidance, and which will be followed by the Department's dedicated Public Appointments Unit in making appointments.

An appointment plan for each competition will be agreed with the Minister before advertising takes place. This will include a diversity section detailing the effort to be made in terms of outreach and process to encourage applications from as wide a range of people as possible. In addition to publicising our public appointment vacancies in the three main newspapers, we will send an e-mailshot out to a large and diverse range of individuals and under-represented groups and organisations for dissemination to their membership and posting to their websites.

The Department is committed to improving its public appointments policies and processes and will act upon the recommendations and best practice guidance which emanate from the CPANI audit reports.

2. Activity

DETI

In April 2015, DETI began the process to appoint five new CCNI Board members, with effect from 1 January 2016. With "diversity" a key driver, the selection panel devised the selection criteria and a set of measures to help broaden the pool of potential applicants which included:-

- the use of "welcoming statements" in all of the competition literature and publicity;
- offering applicants a choice for their fourth criterion either 'Governance in an organisation' or 'Practical experience of consumer issues and representation' and reworking the wording of some of the criteria;
- providing applicants with guidance of the criteria-based application process which requires them to demonstrate their personal role and contribution within their examples;
- providing applicants with examples of the types of evidence the panel were looking for;
- emphasising the Department's wish to recognise less traditional career patterns and experiences such as community involvement or voluntary work, as well as those experiences found within the employment field;
- the issue of a targeted mailshot to relevant groups and organisations;
- the issue of a Ministerial press release on the same day as the public advert to maximise publicity throughout Northern Ireland; and
- anonymising the sift and short-listing process.

The selection panel also considered the three main under-represented groups on Boards (women, people with a disability and those from an ethnic-community background), and took additional measures, including:-

- employing the use of the Guaranteed Interview Scheme (GIS) which allowed those
 applicants with a disability who met all of the essential criteria, to be guaranteed an
 interview ie they were not subjected to short-listing;
- issuing a large targeted mail-shot to a number of umbrella groups and organsiations;
- interviewing a larger number of candidates than usual in order to give more people the
 opportunity to experience the public appointment interview process and also to provide
 the Minister with a wider selection of individuals to choose from; and
- providing feedback to those unsuccessful at interview to encourage them to pursue public appointments in the future.

The design of this competition, the criteria used, the publicity and positive action taken to attract people from a variety of backgrounds and experiences all contributed to a successful outcome.

A total of 71 applications were received compared to 29 in the 2012 Board member competition and 40 in the 2014 Chair & Deputy Chair competition. The panel welcomed the greater interest shown in this particular competition and noted the gender breakdown of 44% female / 56% male, as this also represents an increased percentage in female applicants and is more reflective of the gender breakdown of society within Northern Ireland. (This compares with 38 % female applicants in 2012 and 31% in 2014).

The breakdown in applications shows other achievements such as 48% rural / 52% non-rural and 32% from a voluntary/community sector background. There were six applications (8%) under the Guaranteed Interview Scheme and the ethnic-communities were also represented. The selection panel invited 25 candidates to interview on the basis of their application form and 22 subsequently attended. As a result, the Minister was presented with a pool of 14 candidates considered suitable for appointment. From this list he appointed the 5 new Board members.

3. Future Plans

Increasing diversity will be a key challenge to the new Department as the DETI and DEL Public Appointment Units merge and move forward. We will continue to work with sponsor branches to ensure all possible action is being taken and explore how online technologies and PR activities might enhance our capacity to communicate with a broader and more diverse group of people. We will continue to expand and develop the knowledge base of staff working in public appointments

During the forthcoming year the Department will be running the following competitions:

- Industrial Court NI (unregulated) Chair; Deputy Chair; and three Members
- Consumer Council Deputy Chair
- Tourism NI 1 Member
- HSENI Chair
- NI Screen 2 Members

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With respect to public appointments to further education colleges, the Department intends to:

- review many aspects of its appointments process, which will include consideration of the application form, the short-listing process and the scoring mechanism in use for recent vacancies;
- consider a change to the Further Education (NI) Order 1997 to remove the statutory
 right of the Education Authority, successor to the five education and library boards, to
 nominate two persons to the governing body of each of the six colleges. It is envisaged
 that positions freed by this move will be used to increase the number of CPANI
 regulated publically appointed governing body members;
- commence a review of the remuneration of governing body members after one year of operation.

Departmental Public Appointment Plans and Statistics: DOE

1. Policy

The Minister of the Environment has responsibility for approval of all public appointments. His role includes agreeing the role and person specifications, the appointment timetable, the selection method and the final selection of successful candidates from those deemed suitable for appointment. The department has a central unit which is responsible for running the appointment process for all public bodies.

The department is committed to following the Commissioner for Public Appointments' (CPANI) Code of Practice for Ministerial Public Appointments, and is mindful of the seven key principles which underpin this code. The department also follows the Commissioner's Code of Practice for appointments to bodies which are not CPANI regulated.

All appointments are made on the basis of merit; however the department is committed to improving diversity on the Boards of all its public bodies and endeavours to attract as diverse a range of candidates as possible. The department advertises its public appointment opportunities in the Irish News, the Newsletter, the Belfast Telegraph, CAU (OFMdFM), All Aboard Newsletter and on the department's website. They are also promoted on Disability Action's website as well as NICVA's newsletter and an article on each competition is issued to all Section 75 groups with the request that it is brought to members' attention via email, website or newsletter.

2. Activity

Historic Buildings Council (HBC) - The appointment term for all 11 members expired on 29 February 2016. Five members, who were eligible and willing, were reappointed for a second 3 year term. Remaining members, with the agreement of the Commissioner for Public Appointments, had their term of appointment extended until 31 May 2016. A public appointment competition commenced in late 2015 to appoint 9 new members for a three year term with effect from 1 June 2016, and is still ongoing. The competition is regulated by CPANI and the appointments process follows the CPANI Code of Practice for Ministerial Appointments to Public Bodies.

Historic Monuments Council (HMC) – A public appointment competition commenced in late 2015 to fill vacancies that had arisen on HMC and is still ongoing. It is anticipated that up to four new members will be appointed for a five year term from 1 June 2016. The competition is regulated by CPANI and the appointments process follows the CPANI Code of Practice for Ministerial Appointments to Public Bodies.

Northern Ireland Local Government Officers Superannuation Committee (NILGOSC) – The appointment term for 5 members expired on 30 September 2015. Four members, who were eligible and willing, were reappointed for a second four year term. A public appointment competition commenced in June 2015 to appoint a new member for a four year term with effect from 1 March 2016. The competition was regulated by CPANI and the appointments process followed the CPANI Code of Practice for Ministerial Appointments to Public Bodies.

3. Future Plans

From 9 May 2016, DOE will no longer exist as a department. Responsibility for running public appointment competitions for LGSC, NILGOSC, HMC and HBC will fall to the new Department for Communities. Responsibility for running public appointment competitions for CNCC will fall to the new Department for Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs.

Departmental Public Appointment Plans and Statistics: DFP

1. Policy

Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (The Utility Regulator)

The Utility Regulator is a non-ministerial government department established by the Energy (Northern Ireland) Order 2003, amended by the Water and Sewerage Services (Northern Ireland) Order 2006. It is responsible for regulating the electricity and gas industries and water and sewerage services in Northern Ireland, to promote the short and long-term interests of consumers.

Members of the Board of the Utility Regulator are appointed by the Minister of Finance and Personnel. The Board consists of a Chairperson and at least 3 other members. The terms of appointment of the Chairman and other members are determined by the Minister. A competition to appoint new members took place during 2015-16, with two new members appointed to the Board.

Statistics Advisory Committee (SAC)

SAC is a statutory committee which provides advice to NI Departments on matters relating to the collection and disclosure of statistical information under the Statistics of Trade and Employment (Northern Ireland) Order 1988. It also advises on such matters as may be referred to it by Departments.

Northern Ireland Building Regulations Advisory Committee (NIBRAC)

NIBRAC is a statutory committee established by Article 4 of the Building Regulations (NI) Order 1979 (as amended). Its function is to advise the Department on amendments to building regulations or other connected matters that the Department may bring to it. The Minister appoints members to the Committee. The Department seeks to ensure that the Committee represents a broad spectrum of construction related skills and gender diversity.

2. Activity

Northern Ireland Authority for Utility Regulation (The Utility Regulator)

The Utility Regulator Board and its sub committees continued to meet on a regular basis throughout the year.

Statistics Advisory Committee (SAC)

Departmental Public Appointment Plan & Statistics: DHSS&PS

1. Policy

The Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety (DHSSPS) makes appointments to a wide range of public and other health related bodies. The Department is committed to following the Code of Practice issued by the Commissioner for Public Appointments for Northern Ireland.

The Department's Appointments Unit has responsibility for managing the procedures which reflect this Code of Practice. The Unit provides advice and guidance on appointment issues to organisations and individuals and consults and liaises with the Office of the Commissioner for Public Appointments. Staff in the Unit manage the entire process from advertising, facilitating the short-listing and interview panels and drafting the initial and final submissions to the Minister, requesting ACCESS NI checks and notifying the outcome of the competition to all applicants. Appointments Unit is also responsible for co-ordinating action on queries, challenges and complaints and represents the Department on the cross departmental Public Appointments forum which meets quarterly.

All Departmental public appointments are the responsibility of the Minister who at the outset of each competition approves the Role Profile, Person Specification, Length of Appointment and Appointment Plan.

An Independent Assessor allocated by the Office of the Commissioner for Public Appointments Northern Ireland is a member of all our short listing and interview panels alongside a Senior Civil Servant and a third panel member who has expertise either in the work of the organisation or within that field of expertise.

The Department is committed to the principle of selection on merit and to improving diversity on the boards of the public and other bodies for which it has responsibility.

2. Activity

As at 31 March 2016, the Department was responsible for 160 public appointments across 18 Health & Social Care (HSC) bodies, all of which are regulated appointments. In addition the Department is responsible for a further 22 appointments across 2 bodies which are unregulated.

Appointments Unit has developed a competition timetable in order to ensure that all positions are filled as soon as practically possible.

During the year 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2016, 6 competitions were conducted resulting in a total of 36 appointments. being made; 28 initial/first term appointments and 8 re-appointments. In addition, 30 extensions to appointments were made.

Appointments Unit liaised with both the Departmental business areas and the Chair of the relevant organisation at the outset of the competition to identify any potential 'skills gaps' and to agree the Role Profiles, Person Specifications and selection criteria. The Unit has ensured that all panel members have had the appropriate training as required by the Commissioner for Public Appointments Northern Ireland.

In order to promote and improve Diversity the Department has taken the following actions to ensure that the widest pool of individuals were aware of the Department's appointment opportunities:

- Appointments Unit has bench- marked with other Government Departments to identify additional actions to increase diversity in its public appointments.
- Advertisements were placed in the three Regional newspapers, on the Department's website, on social media and with relevant organisations/individuals e.g. if appointing a locally elected representative member each elected representative and Council receives notification.
- The Department has developed a Public Appointments mailing list and has taken steps encourage both individuals and organisations to be included.
- Forthcoming vacancies were listed in the 'All Aboard' Bulletin issued by Central Appointments
- A "Welcome Statement" on all our advertisements for appointment to Health and Social Care bodies has stated that we welcome applicants from all Section 75 categories.
- The Department has added an additional number of umbrella organisations to our mailing list including additional organisations representing those groups currently under represented on DHSSPS public bodies
- A concerted effort has been made to target groups representing women in addition to groups representing people from an ethnic minority background and those representing people with disabilities.

The composition of members of our public bodies at 31 March 2016 was 61 female (38%) and 98 male (62%).

Of the total membership of 159 one has recorded a disability and one member is from an ethnic minority background

3. Future Plans

Increasing diversity remains a key challenge for the Department in the 2016/2017 year. We will continue to liaise with the Office of the Commissioner for Public Appointments and with other Government Departments to identify best practice and ensure that all possible positive action is taken. The Department will continue to seek out and avail of opportunities to raise awareness and engage with groups and the wider public.

We will expand and develop the knowledge of staff working in public appointments and work with sponsor branches in the Department to ensure the best service possible is delivered.

Following restructuring of Government Departments in May 2016 the Department will be known as the Department of Health however there will be no change in its responsibilities for public appointments.

Departmental Public Appointments Plan & Statistics: DRD

1. Policy

The Departments Minister makes appointments to five public bodies as follows:

- Northern Ireland Water
- Northern Ireland Transport Holding Company
- ➢ Belfast Harbour Commissioners
- Londonderry Port and Harbour Commissioners
- Warrenpoint Harbour Authority

The Department is committed to complying with the provisions of the Commissioner for Public Appointments for Northern Ireland (CPA NI) Code of Practice for Ministerial Appointments and regularly reviews CPANI Audit Reports to identify best practice approaches.

Going forward the <u>Department will strive to work towards the targets agreed by the Executive for gender equality</u> subject to the overriding principle of selection based on merit.

All public appointment vacancies are advertised to ensure as wide a pool of applicants as possible. Advertisements appear in all the main local papers, appropriate trade publications, NI Direct and the Department's website.

In an effort to increase the diversity of Boards, a wide range of groups, including groups which are representative of women, people with disabilities and ethnic minorities, are notified of planned competitions and advertisements and encouraged to disseminate the information across their networks.

The Department continues to operate a central Public Appointments Unit to manage all aspects of the public appointments process in consultation with three Sponsor Divisions. The Public Appointments Unit runs all of the Department's appointment competitions in line with best practice to ensure greater consistency and compliance with the CPA NI Code.

2. Activity

The Minister appointed a Chair to Northern Ireland Transport and Holding Company effective from 1 July 2015 and a Chair to Warrenpoint Harbour Authority effective from 1 October 2015. During 2015/2016 the Department also completed the following competitions:

- NI Water five Members appointments effective from 1 August 2015
- Northern Ireland Transport Holding Company five Members appointments effective from 1 January 2016
- Belfast Harbour Commissioners nine Members appointments effective from 1
 February 2016
- Belfast Harbour Commissioners Councillors four Councillors appointments effective from 25 January 2016
- Londonderry Port & Harbour Commissioners Councillors three Councillors appointments effective from 21 July 2015

 Warrenpoint Harbour Authority Councillors - three Councillors - appointments effective from 8 June 2015

DRD continues to be represented on the NICS Public Appointments Forum which helps develop policy and the sharing of best practice across the NICS in public appointments.

DRD has taken a range of measures to make public appointment competitions more accessible and attractive to women, younger people, people with disabilities and ethnic minorities. Each competition launched in 15/16 was notified in advance to around 400 groups by targeted email Measures also include making all reappointments subject to public competition. The policy on reappointments took effect from 1 April 2015. The Department has also introduced a menu approach to the selection criteriain several member competetions to try to encourage greater diversity of applicants.

The Department has introduced a Guaranteed Interview Scheme for disabled applicants.

The Department follows best practice drawing on the NICS Common Guidance – Principles and Practice developed by the Public Appointments Forum.

The Department continues to use an Independent Assessor provided by CPANI for each selection panel for each of the DRD public appointments competitions.

3. Future Plans

The Department plans to complete and launch the following competitions throughout 2016/2017

Warrenpoint Harbour Authority two Members - appointments effective 1 November 2016

Members of the Public Appointments Unit will promote best practice in public appointments in association with the Public Appointments Forum and CPANI advice and guidance.

The Department monitors progress closely in terms of diversity of applicants, and to continuously improve the appointment process and increase awareness of public appointments opportunities.

Departmental Public Appointment Plan: FSA

1. Policy

The Food Standards Agency (FSA) is a non-ministerial, UK Central Government Department. The non-executive Board of the FSA holds most of the responsibilities that would otherwise be within the purview of a Minister. Appointments to this Board are recommended to the UK Minister for Health with the exception of those Board members appointed to represent Wales and Northern Ireland whose appointment is officially made by the Minister in each of those devolved administrations with responsibility for Health. The Board member representing Northern Ireland also chairs the Northern Ireland Food Advisory Committee (NIFAC). Appointments to NIFAC are made by the Northern Ireland Executive department with responsibility for health. However, while in the event of there being several, equally appointable candidates, the decision on who to appoint would be deferred to the Minister, the FSA's Commitment to the principle of selection on merit, along with the fact that the FSA is not the department of any Minister, means that a ministerial intervention or veto of recommendations would be unusual.

Community background monitoring forms are circulated to all applicants to NIFAC and also to the FSA Board where the position is that of NI Board member and NIFAC Chair;

The FSA in NI has sought to encourage female applicants to NIFAC in its advertising as these have historically been under-represented on the Committee;

2. Activity

A process was run in 2015 to appoint new members to NIFAC. Advertising for this process reflected the historical under-representation of women on the Committee. Two appointments were subsequently made as a result of this process with one man and one woman appointed to NIFAC.

Though not regulated by the CPANI, the FSA in NI conduct their appointments in line with CPANI guidance and appoint a registered independent assessor to sit on the panel for the process. The panel is completed by the NIFAC Chair and a representative of the Department with health responsibility in Northern Ireland, selected by their Minister.

A process to appoint a new Board member to represent Northern Ireland on the FSA Board is ongoing. The successful candidate will automatically become the new Chair of NIFAC. This position is remunerated but is funded from the FSA's central budget for the FSA Board and not from the FSA in NI's allocation from the Northern Ireland Executive.

3. Future Plans

A process will be undertaken to replace one outgoing member of NIFAC whose term of appointment ends in July 2016. The decision has been made, however, to postpone this process until a new NIFAC Chair has been appointed, giving him or her chairmanship of the selection panel for the process.
