

Northern Ireland Children's Social Services Data during COVID-19

The management information presented derive initially from a temporary weekly data collection for children's social care services during the period of COVID-19, and since October 2021 this data has been collected on a monthly basis. These data returns have been extracted from administrative systems for each of the five Health and Social Care Trusts in Northern Ireland. **Please note these figures are provisional and may be subject to change.**

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






Child Protection Register






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Child Protection Referrals

TECHNICAL NOTES

Temporary Data Collection

The figures presented in these tables derive from a temporary management data collection of Children's Social Care Services during the period of COVID-19. These data returns have been extracted from the administrative system and/or data warehouse for each of the five Health and Social Care (HSC) Trusts in Northern Ireland.

The data in this output is separate to any official statistics data series published by Department of Health (DoH) on children's social care.

Change to Data Collection from October 2021

This data collection has changed from weekly to monthly returns, with a two week reporting lag. This improves data quality as it increases the inclusion of input error corrections and any input delays will be minimised. Historic weekly figures prior to the monthly collection started has been grouped to display proxy monthly figures.

Data validation

The reports used to extract the contained management figures have been agreed between HSC Trust, the HSC Board (now SPPG) and DoH.

Although the data has been deemed to be of robust, and improved quality, it has not undergone the same rigorous quality assurance checks that are carried out prior to the publication of official statistics. Therefore, these figures are deemed provisional and may be subject to change.

Publication

As set out in the DoH press release (20 May 2020), these figures will be routinely updated without further notification. Data was published each week including December 2021. From January 2022, figures are published on a monthly basis. It is expected that DoH will continue to publish these figures until such time that the data collection is stood down.

DEFINITIONS

Children (Northern Ireland) Order 1995

The Children (Northern Ireland) Order was made on 15 March 1995. The Order deals with the care, upbringing and protection of children, including disabled children. It reforms, consolidates and harmonises most of the public and private law relating to children in a single coherent statutory framework along the lines of the Children Act 1989 in England and Wales.

Child

Under the Children (Northern Ireland) Order 1995, a child is defined as a person under the age of 18.

Referral to Children's Social Care

A referral is defined as a request for services to be provided by children's social care and is in respect of a child who is currently not assessed to be in need. A referral may result in an episode of care which may be an initial assessment of the child's needs, the provision of information or advice, referral to another agency or alternatively no further action. A **Child Protection Referral** is one for which the initial assessment indicates that there may be Child Protection issues.

Child Protection Register

A register must be maintained by each HSC Trust listing every child in the Trust area who has been abused or who is considered to be at risk of abuse, and who is currently the subject of a child protection plan.

Looked After Child / Child in Care

A child is looked after by an Authority if he or she is in their care or if he or she is provided with accommodation for a continuous period of more than 24 hours by the authority in the exercise of its Social Services function. Figures presented excludes any children who were looked after by virtue of short break arrangements only.
