Executive Summary



Elective care

April saw a further increase in elective activity as the Trust continues to recover from the impact of Covid-19. Antrim continues to see patients via the low risk pathway, while in Causeway some daycase procedures were restarted and endoscopy services were further increased. This gradual recovery should continue over the next few months, with anticipated volumes set out in the Trust's Rebuild Plan for April to June.

Outpatient referrals decreased slightly in April from March but still continue to approach pre-pandemic levels.

Outpatient activity marginally increased in April but was still 29% below SBA as services recover gradually from the impact of the third surge. Outpatient waits have continued to increase and there were 28,908 patients waiting over 52 weeks at the end of April, out of a total of over 56,500 patients waiting.

Inpatient and daycase activity continued to increase in March with 50% of SBA delivered. The number of long waits continues to rise. At the end of April there were just over 5,000 patients waiting longer than 52 weeks for surgery.

Use of Independent Sector capacity continues to have a positive impact on Diagnostic waits with the percentage of patients waiting less than 9 weeks increasing to 61% and the number waiting more than 26 weeks reducing to 2,698.

Endoscopy continues to increase capacity and in April there was a 37% increase over the activity delivered in March, this increased activity led to an increase in the percentage of patients waiting less than 9 weeks, and there was also a small reduction in the number waiting over 26 weeks, to 3,437.

As staff were returning from redeployment AHP activity also rose in April. April activity remains 25% behind SBA with numbers waiting more than 13 weeks rising slightly, but activity exceeds original Rebuild plans.

The rebuild plan covering April to June 2021 has been reviewed based on April activity and revised projections submitted to HSCB.

Cancer care

Further to recent discussions between the Trust and HSCB a regional approach to breast surgery has been agreed, whereby demand will be equitably shared across the region in line with available capacity, along with a commitment to report 14-day performance on a regional rather than a Trust-level basis. Investment into the Northern Trust service will also be required in the longer term to ensure we have the capacity needed to meet the demand from our population.

The number of red flag referrals decreased slightly on the significant growth in April, however, referral numbers in April were still 25% higher than April 2019 as a comparison. Breast, Lower GI, and Skin referral numbers continue to be particularly high. A Cancer Recovery workshop was held to begin to develop a Cancer Recovery Plan to bring a new focus to collaborative improvement work across all cancer sites in 2021/22.

Delays in access to endoscopy, diagnostic day surgery and inpatient surgery continue to contribute to the deteriorating 31- and 62-day performance. Given the large number of patients on a suspect cancer pathway, 62-day performance is unlikely to improve in the short term. The regional process for prioritisation of theatre capacity is still in place and will remain so over the next few weeks. This continues to ensure that patients are allocated to available theatre space across the region in line with clinical priority.

Unscheduled care

ED attendances increased in both Antrim and Causeway in April, coming closer to pre-COVID levels.

4-hour performance remained similar to March across both sites with Antrim achieving 60% and Causeway achieving 68%. The number of 12 hour waits decreased slightly across both sites, with 562 in Antrim and 141 in Causeway.

The 0% performance for stroke patients receiving thrombolysis in Antrim and Causeway was due to patients not being suitable for treatment: of the 51 patients who presented in Antrim 32 were outside the time window and 19 were clinically unsuitable, of the 8 who presented in Causeway, 3 were outside the time window, 2 were unknown onset and 3 were clinically unsuitable for treatment.

Mental health and learning disability

Due to the migration of the Mental Health Information system from EPEX to PARIS, Adult Mental Health performance data is not available for the month of March and April. The Trust is working with the system supplier to ensure reporting is available as soon as possible.

Learning Disability Day Care services have increased their activity above their reset projections. In April an increasing percentage of service users are starting to accept places in day centres due to the easing of restrictions, there is an expectation that this will continue in May and June.

Children's Services

The CAMHS service continues to rebuild and saw a slight increase in the number of patients waiting over 9 weeks from 89 in March to 101 in April.

Community Care

Quarter 4 direct payments position shows 93% of the target has been delivered by the Trust. The carers' assessment was achieved in 82% of cases in Q4 of 20/21 and short break made headway of 90% towards the actual increase of 5% required by HSCB.

Day Care services for older people is showing a reduction in attendances in April due to centres being closed for a week and a temporary issue with data capture. Looking forward new programmes are being introduced across centres so the expectation is that the service will hit the rebuild projections in the coming months.

HCAIs

There were no MRSA episodes in April. There were 4 CDiff episodes and 5 Gram negative which means the Trust is approximately in line with the target profile.


Ambulance arrivals






