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Context

Phase 6 Rebuild plans were submitted mid-June 2021, and these have now been termed 'delivery plans' going forward. Up to this point the Minister has requested quarterly plans, however the Phase 6 plan will be for the period July and August 2021.

The Trust has also been asked to revert to its pre-pandemic elective monitoring processes, and to produce activity projections for elective hospital care. The approach to activity projections for community services (AHP, mental health, etc.) remains unchanged from previous phases. Activity delivered in 2019/20 is being used to make an assessment of how the Trust is delivering against pre-covid levels.

Delivery across many service areas are showing good progress towards attaining the pre-pandemic level of delivery, and the currently attained level of delivery is summarised on Page 9-11. While overall demand is not at pre-pandemic levels, the pattern of referrals shows significant growth in urgent and crisis referrals, and this continues to impact routine waiting times.

Regionally, the work programme to increase capacity has focussed on Waiting List Initiative (WLI) plans which have been agreed with Trusts for the first half of the year. In year funding has been confirmed and the Trust plan involves utilising available non-recurrent funding to increase inhouse capacity where this is possible, and to secure capacity from independent sector providers to see and treat patients of the highest clinical priority.

Key issues during this month were:

- During May 2021 there has been a marked increase in Emergency Department attendances
- 14 Day breast cancer pathway continues to remain challenging with some improvement demonstrated at end of June 21
- Emergency and Urgent demand has increased across a range of services, and complexity of patients presenting across CAMHS and Psychological Therapies

Acute Services

Cancer Care

Cancer performance has been impacted by a number of ongoing challenges in particular Consultant capacity to deliver Oncology services (currently 6.8 in post against funded 11). The service are working collaboratively with the Commissioner on regional workforce planning and support had been secured from Belfast Trust but has not yet been mobilised due to unforeseen circumstances.

The number of red flag referrals received for all suspect cancer tumour sites during May 2021 has increased by 12% overall compared to May 2019. The increase in red flag referrals is particularly evident in head & neck [15%], lower GI [7%], skin [111%] and urology [19%] suspect cancer tumour sites.

During May 2021, patient activity delivered as compared to May 19 showed that the services have largely recovered to pre-pandemic levels, at 97% on the breast 14 day pathway, 95% on 31 day pathway and 94% on 62 day pathway.

14-Day Breast Pathway

The Breast service continues to face significant challenges in meeting the 14 day target. During May 2021, Phase 5 Rebuild of Services, of the 304 patients seen, **22%** were seen within 14 days of referral and **236 patients** waited >14 days. The service has delivered additional clinics during June 21, which is showing an improving position. From 1-27th June 21, **56%** of patients were seen within 14 days of referral and 177 patients waited >14 days with a longest wait of 35 days. The Trust has been exceeding its commissioned capacity level for some years in this service and WLI additional activity has been used to bridge this gap. At a recent HSCB/Trust Performance Board meeting the Board had indicated that they intend to continue to support the service with in- year WLI allocation.

31 Day Pathway

During May 2021, of the 132 patients treated, 100% received their first definitive treatment within 31 days of a decision to treat.

62 day Pathway

62 day pathway continues to be challenged by the reduced outpatient capacity, and access to surgery, and endoscopy. Services are working collectively to re-set as surgery capacity is increasing.



During May 2021, of the 67.5 treated, 53% received their first definitive treatment within 62 days of referral and 31.5 (35 patients) waited >62 days. In daycase services, during May 2021, Phase 5 Rebuilding of Services, the trust over-delivered with 1,287 day cases against a predicted 974.	During May 2021, Phase 5 Rebuilding of Services, the Trust significantly over- delivered against its plan, with 312 inpatient treatments against a predicted 227.
Elective Care A revised Waiting List Initiative (WLI) plan has now been developed which covers both Quarter 1 and Quarter 2. The total cost of the plan is £4.2m which will deliver additional in-house and independent sector activity across new and review Outpatients, Inpatient and Day Case, Echoes, Scopes and Imaging diagnostics. At the request of the HSCB, the Trust has also scoped the available orthopaedic Independent Sector capacity until March 2022 and a plan is currently being developed to use this capacity regionally focusing initially on urgent patients which will be submitted to HSCB for approval. This will include proposals to transfer patients to North West Independent Clinic as well as providers in Rol.	Delivery against predicted activity has varied widely in the last year, particularly as services responded to surges in COVID-19 admissions to hospital across the months, overall 114% of the predicted activity for July 2020 – May 2021 was delivered. (<i>Figures</i> <i>exclude January 2021 when predicted activity was not submitted due to the expected</i> <i>surge 3</i>). Outpatients During May 2021, the Trust delivered 82% (76% New & 85% Review) of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019 showing a slight reduction of 2% on April 2021. As referrals have started to increase, during May 2021 the Trust received 87% of the consultant led referrals that were received during May 2019, indicating demand is close to reaching pre-pandemic levels.
The Trust has also been advised of the potential for WLI funding to undertake additional AHP, psychological therapies and dementia activity and this is currently being scoped. Consideration is also being given to bringing an external provider to utilise SWAH theatre facilities in support of the regional WLI Plan. Inpatients, Daycases During May 2021, the Trust delivered 84% (<i>58%IP & 94%DC</i>) of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019 indicating good progress to attaining the pre-pandemic level of delivery. At the end of May 2021 the total inpatient & day case waiting list has grown to 23,122 patients, reflecting a 14% (2,846) increase from April 2020, and 57% of these patients are now waiting >52 weeks compared to 36% at the end of April 2020.	 The Outpatients waiting list has grown to 50,768 people waiting, a 23% (9,588 patients) increase from April 2020. 51% of these people are now waiting >52 weeks compared to 36% at the end of April 2020. During May 2021, the Trust delivered 4,223 new outpatients against a predicted 3,935. There were 3,534 face to face appointments delivered against a predicted 3,195 and 689 virtual appointments delivered against a predicted 740. 9,442 review outpatients were delivered against a predicted 8,840. There vontinues to be a considerable use of vitual processes with people, however 5,942 face to face appointments were delivered against a predicted 5,493, attaining a significant level of overdelivery to plan in this month and indicating a shift toward resumption of face to face appointments, and there were 3,500 virtual appointments delivered against a predicted 3,347.



Diagnostics	
 The Trust is utilising waiting lists initiative funding for Imaging and Echoes and a bid is included in our WLI plan, where HSCB have agreed to continue to fund 5 sessions per week for Western and Northern Trust patients. During May 2021, the Trust delivered 7,137 diagnostic imaging tests for 5 modalities against a predicted 7,112. The Trust exceeded the overall monthly target in all of the 11 months during rebuild, delivering 119% of the predicted rebuild activity to date. The Trust delivered 724 echo's against a predicted 600, meeting or exceeding the rebuild target during all 11 months of rebuild and delivering 139% of the predicted activity to date. During May 2021, the Trust delivered 88% of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019 for Imaging and 77% for Echo's. 	 Unscheduled Care The number of patients attending ED at Altnagelvin and SWAH have continued to grow over the last 3 months whilst the 4 hour and 12 hours performance has deteriorated, EDs and wider hospital flow remains affected by the maintenance of COVID-19 pathways in our hospitals. Altnagelvin Hospital: During May 21, ED attendances continued to increase with a further 5% increase on April 2021 attendances. 42% of patients were admitted or discharged within 4 hours and 543 patients waited >12 hours. The conversion of ED attendance to admission remains stable at 17% of the total patients seen in ED, but overall there was a 3% increase in Adult Unscheduled admissions. Overall average length of stay decreased slightly by 0.33 days when compared to April 2021.
, Endoscopy The service continue to be impacted by medical and nursing sickness absence, and IPC measures. During May 2021, the Trust delivered 65% of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019. At the end of May 2021 the total endoscopy waiting list has grown to 5,127 patients, reflecting a 36% increase from April 2020. 46% of these patients are now waiting >52 weeks compared to 6% at the end of April 2020. During May 2021 the Trust delivered 684 endoscopies against a predicted 540.	 90% of Complex Discharges were discharged within 48 hours and 4 waited >7 days. South West Acute Hospital: During May 21, ED attendances continued to increase with an 17% increase on April 2021 attendances. 56% of patients were admitted or discharged within 4 hours and 206 patients waited >12 hours. The conversion of ED attendance to admission was 17% of the total patients seen in ED. Due to the increasing atendances, there was a 20% increase in Adult Unscheduled admissions. The overall average length of stay decreased by 0.92 days when compared to April 2021. 63% of Complex Discharges were discharged within 48 hours and 10 waited >7 days, indicating considerable issues with flow on the site.



Community Services Adult Mental Health Access to this service area has continued to improve during May 2021 with 93 people waiting more than 9 weeks, an 11% improvement compared to the previous month. The total number waiting has remained static at the end of May 2021 reflecting a sustained level of new demand from January 2021 to April 2021. Of the total number of referrals received during May 2021, 37% of these were emergency and urgent referrals (35% Urgent and 2% Emergency). New referrals received during May are now at 81% of the level in May 2019. During May 2021, the Trust exceeded the New Outpatients rebuild plan delivering 472 against a predicted 431 (110%) and achieved 99% of the Review Outpatients plan delivering a total of 4,395 appointments against a predicted 4,433. The Trust is broadly in line with pre-pandemic activity levels within Adult Mental Health services with 93% activity delivered (83% New and 95% Review) in comparison to the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019.	 During May 2021, the Trust exceeded the New and Review Outpatients Rebuild Plan delivering 226 new outpatients against a predicted 216 (105%) and 1,330 review outpatients against a predicted 1,305 (102%). The Trust continues to deliver an activity level in excess of pre-pandemic levels at 116% (148% New and 112% Review) of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019. Dementia Services During May 2021, access to this service has further improved, with 332 people waiting more than 9 weeks. Overall there has been an increase in new demand, particularly urgent priority referrals. During 2020/21, the service experienced a 22% reduction in the Total Number of referrals received in comparison to 2019/20. Despite this overall reduction, there was a 90% increase in the total number of Urgent referrals received during 2020/21 (131) in comparison to 2019/20 (69). This increase in Urgent referrals received is particularly evident from September 2020 . During May 2021, this service under-delivered against its New and Review Outpatients Rebuild Plan delivering 35 new appointments against a target of 39 (90%), and 401 review appointments against a target of 495 (81%). The Trust is now delivering 84% (97% New and 83% Review) of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019.
Psychological Therapies At the end of May 2021, there was 1,315 people waiting >13 weeks; a marginal decrease from the previous month. Overall the total number waiting has remained static or incrementally increased since September 2020; reflecting a continued growth in new demand. During 2020/21, services experienced a 35% reduction in the total number of referrals received in comparison to 2019/20. Despite this reduction, there was a 31% increase in the total number of urgent referrals received during 2020/21 (201) in comparison to 2019/20 (154). The increase in urgent referrals received impacted on various months throughout 2020/21 and has continued with the highest levels of referrals received during March (29) and April 2021 (25).	Allied Health Professional (AHP) Services The service has shown further improvement (5%) in the total number waiting >13 weeks (4,054) to access AHP Services at the end of May 2021. Improvement in performance is noted within Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Podiatry and Speech and Language Therapy. Despite the improvement in performance for Occupational Therapy during May, 56% were waiting >13 weeks to access this service. Workforce challenges continue to impact this service; at the 1 st June 2021 they had 20.3wte (12%) vacant posts. Recruitment is ongoing for these posts. The Total Number Waiting has increased in May 2021 reflecting further increase in new demand. Overall the AHP New referrals accepted in May 2021 remain below pre- pandemic levels and reflects 78% of new referrals accepted in May 2019. However, Occupational Therapy (110%) and Orthoptics (116%) are experiencing higher levels of demand in May 2021; with Speech & Language demand broadly in line with May 2019.



During May 2021, the Trust significantly over-delivered against its AHP New Outpatient Rebuild plan delivering 3,466 appointments against a predicted 3,017 (115%) and achieved 98% of the Review Outpatients plan delivering 13,510 appointments against a predicted 13,813.	Service reconfiguration remains in place with staff diverted to provide support to urgent and complex cases. As a result, additional new patient activity was delivered during May. The Trust delivered 91 CAMHS New Outpatients against a predicted 55 (165%) and a total of 752 Review Outpatients against a predicted 750 (100%). Of the 91 New outpatient appointments seen, 27% relate to crisis activity.
Childrens Services	The Trust is over-delivering on pre-pandemic levels of activity at 124% (97% New & 128% Review) of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019.
Child & Adolescent Mental Health Service	Childrens Autism Service
There has been a continued increase in complex cases and eating disorder presentations. During May 2021, 41% (33% Urgent and 8% Emergency) of the total referrals received were emergency and urgent priority referrals. As priority referrals need to be seen within specific timescales, this has an impact on routine access to the service. At the end of May 2021, the total number waiting for a New CAMHS outpatient appointment increased by 12% in comparison to the previous month, with 175 children waiting more than 9 weeks. The service continues to work intensively with young people requiring inpatient assessment and treatment. In some instances young people are seen 3-4 times per week within the community and/or inpatient wards.	The Diagnostic Access Target remains challenging however there was some improvement in waiting times during May 2021, nevertheless 950 young people are waiting more than 13 weeks. During May 2021 the Trust delivered 80 New Diagnostic appointments against a predicted 80 (100%). Delivery of this Target was achieved with the support of additional Diagnostic assessments completed by IS. The Trust delivered 151% of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019. The service continue to meet the New Intervention Target with waiting times within 13 weeks. During May 2021, the Trust marginally under-delivered on its plan with 22 New Intervention appointments against a predicted 25 (88%). Achievement of this plan is dependent on the number of children/young people that receive a confirmed diagnosis in the previous two months.
The lack of available beds within the Regional Children & Young People Inpatient Unit (Beechcroft), remains a challenge for this service. In addition, the service continue to experience very significant staffing challenges due to vacant posts and sickness leave.	The Trust delivered 100% of the level of activity that was delivered during May 2019. Domiciliary Care
Recruitment to vacant Mental Health Practitioner posts is progressing and it is anticipated that staff should be in post by September 2021. The service have secured in year funding from HSCB to support eating disorder cases and to procure a project which will focus on sport/activity at weekends for children and young people known to the service. Additional recurrent funding from HSCB to support Eating Disorder and a Transition worker has also been approved.	During May 2021, the Trust was broadly on plan with 33,612 Statutory Hours against a predicted 34,325 (98%) and exceeded the plan for Independent Hours with 113,915 delivered against a predicted 112,104 (102%) . The Trust is now largely at the pre-pandemic activity levels in its statutory services with 102% of the Statutory Hours delivered and 93% of the Independent Hours delivered during May 2019.




