




Statutory consultations response times




Responses to statutory consultations received by

Statutory Consultations Quarterly Report – Q3 2020/21

Introduction

This is the third quarterly report highlighting the performance of statutory consultees in the planning process. This report provides details of the volume of statutory consultation that has taken place during the first nine months of 2020/21 with comparative data from 2019/20. <u>The figures contained in this report are extracted from the NI Planning Portal, are provisional, and should not be treated as official statistics.</u>

Statutory consultations

During the first nine months of 2020/21 (April to December 2020) there were 28,262 consultations/advice queries raised. Of these, three-quarters (21,156; 75%) were sent to key statutory consultees¹. Of these 21,156 consultations/advice queries raised, four-fifths (17,002; 80%) were deemed to be statutory consultations².

The number of statutory consultations raised fell during Q4 2019/20 (January to March 2020), compared with previous quarters. A further decrease was reported for Q1 2020/21 (April to June 2020), with the number of statutory consultations raised down by over one-third (34%) compared with the same quarter a year earlier. It is likely that this decrease was related to the reduction in the number of planning applications received over the same period, as a consequence of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. During Q2 2020/21 (July to September 2020), 6,346 statutory consultations were raised; an increase of almost one-half (47%) from the previous quarter and similar to pre-Q4 2019/20 levels. In the most recent quarter (October to December 2020), 6,331 statutory consultations were raised; similar to the previous quarter and up 4% compared with the same period a year earlier. As in previous quarters, statutory consultations on local planning applications accounted for the vast majority of those raised in Q3 2020/21 (95%).




Chart 1: Number of statutory consultations raised by planning application type

Statutory consultations response times

During 2019/20 the proportion of statutory consultations responded to on time³ each quarter remained fairly consistent (ranging from 68 - 71%). During Q1 2020/21 this increased to 79% and although the proportions reported for the most recent two quarters have declined from this high to 75% in Q2 2020/21 and 74% in Q3 2020/21, these levels are still higher than any quarter in the previous year. As would be expected, the proportion of outstanding statutory consultations is highest in the most recent quarter (Charts 2 and 3).




Chart 2: Number of responses to statutory consultations received by response status

During 2019/20 as a whole, 71% of all statutory consultations for local planning applications were responded to on time⁴. This figure was just over one-half (52%) for major applications over the same period. During the first nine months of 2020/21, 77% of statutory consultations for local applications were handled on time, with majors reported at 54% (Charts 4 and 5). In Q3 2020/21 nearly three-fifths of statutory consultations for majors were responded to on time (59%); the highest proportion reported for any quarter in the time series presented.






Chart 4: <u>Number of responses to statutory consultations received by planning application type and</u> <u>response status</u>

2020/21 in more detail – statutory consultee analysis

Statutory consultations received by statutory consultees for the first three quarters of 2020/21 are presented in Table 2 below⁵. During the first quarter of 2020/21 there were 4,325 statutory consultations received, increasing to 6,346 in the second quarter with numbers returning to a similar level to those in the first three quarters of 2019/20. In the most recent quarter (October to December 2020), 6,331 statutory consultations were raised; similar to the previous quarter.

Of the 6,331 statutory consultations received in Q3 2020/21, DfI Roads received 47%, DAERA EMF NIEA 16%, NI Water 15%, DfC / HED 12% and DfI Rivers 9%; together these five consultees accounted for 98% of the statutory consultations raised during the quarter (Chart 6).⁶ This is similar to the position recorded in previous quarters.



During Q3 2020/21 across all statutory consultees the proportion of responses received on time⁷ ranged from 63 - 100%. In all, 74% of statutory consultation were responded on time during this quarter; below the 79% reported for Q1 but similar to the previous quarter (75%). This reduction from the Q1 position is likely to have been driven by the increased levels of consultations received during the second and third quarters (Table 3). It is noteworthy however that the overall quarterly response rates this year have been higher than any quarter in the previous year.

Notes on data source

An extract of all consultations/advice queries raised from 1 April 2020 to 31 December 2020 were transferred on 1 February 2021 from the Northern Ireland Planning Portal. The data were then validated. The relevant data is lifted at least one month after the end of the reference period to allow for the 21 day target response date, which applies to most statutory consultations, to have elapsed.

Future developments

As work progresses in this area it is intended to widen the list of key statutory consultees to include local planning authorities.
