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Foreword

The Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors Mid & East Antrim Borough Council

I have pleasure in submitting the 2021-2022 Annual Report on the work of Dfl Roads across the Mid and East Antrim Borough Council Area.

This report deals with works completed across the Council area during the year 2020-2021 and sets out our initial proposals for schemes to be undertaken in the year 2021-2022. An update on the two Strategic Road Improvement schemes that are being taken forward in the Division is also provided.

2020/21 was an unprecedented year owing to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and thankfully our contractors have developed new working practices to enable much needed road maintenance and improvement work to proceed. The impact of COVID has been mitigated as far as possible and productivity has been such that most of our 20/21 programme was successfully delivered despite the absence of work over the first part of the year.

Since 2013 the Department for Infrastructure's baseline Resource budget has been insufficient to meet its needs and we have relied on in year funding to deliver core services including public transport and winter gritting. This continued to be the case for 2020-21.

I am pleased to advise that this year's initial capital allocation has been increased and this has allowed an increase in funding for structural maintenance across Northern Division in 2021-22 including within the 'road recovery fund'. This level of investment is very welcome as it moves towards the figures required annually to maintain the road network in a reasonable condition. Our main focus now is to seek to ensure that we have sufficient design and contracting resource available to deliver on this significant increase in capital funding.

Capital funding also influences our Local Transport and Safety Measures programmes which includes Safer Routes to Schools and funding this year will allow the introduction of a further tranche of part time speed limits at schools across the Council Area. In 2021/22 significant additional funding is also being made available for Blue Green and Active Travel programmes, details of which are also included within this report.

The opening allocation in 2021-22 for routine maintenance is also similar to that for 2020-2021 and I am pleased to report that, despite wider pressures, the Minister has allocated sufficient funding to allow a full street lighting repair service for the entire year and continuation of a limited service which will allow defects greater than 50mm depth to be repaired across all roads. On high traffic roads, defects greater than 20mm will also be repaired. Dfl Roads will aim to cut all roadside verges and sightline grass at least twice in the period April-October with sightlines at bends and junctions being cut more frequently as required to ensure public safety is not compromised.

I would encourage Councillors to avail of the online fault reporting system on NI Direct. My operational staff are of course also available to assist with queries.

I hope that you find this report informative. We value constructive comments on all of our activities and I, along with Network Maintenance Manager, Gary Quinn, look forward to meeting the Council.



STRATEGIC ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

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1.1 A6 Randalstown to Castledawson Dualling

(Being dealt with by Dawson Wray, supported by Philip McKeown)

This scheme will provide a continuous dual carriageway from the western end of the M22, near Randalstown, to the Castledawson Roundabout, reducing journey times and improving road safety. The £189m scheme is 15km (9 miles) long in two main sections each side of the Toome Bypass, and commenced in June 2017.

The opening of the first phase between M22 at Randalstown and Toome in August 2019 was a significant milestone for the scheme, and welcome news for the road users in the 22,000 vehicles along the route who are benefitting from safer, more reliable journeys.

During the past 12 months good construction progress was made within the sensitive swan area between Toome Bypass and Deerpark Road. Along this section all major earthworks and drainage were completed in line with Environmental commitments by the end of September 2020, permitting other minor construction activities to continue through the winter period.

With temporary traffic management (TTM) measures in place (one lane running in each direction, speed limit restriction and a short stretch of contraflow on east bound lane of the Toome Bypass) a further 5km (3 miles) of new dual carriageway between the Toome Bypass, and the area called the Broagh opened to traffic on the 23 November 2020.

Over the winter months works continued on the mainline with the main construction activities concentrated on the west bound carriageway tie-in to the existing Toome Bypass, other local network connections at Hillhead junction and B18 Creagh and subsequent removal of the contraflow arrangement on the Toome Bypass.

The Infrastructure Minister Nichola Mallon visited the site on Friday 28 May 2021 to speak to those involved in the delivery of the scheme. This was just in advance of the removal of Temporary Traffic Management and 40mph speed restriction, allowing the entire dual carriageway to open on Monday 31 May 2021. A great achievement for everyone involved in the delivery of such a major infrastructure project.

1.2 A6 Dungiven to Drumahoe Dualling

(Being dealt with by James Middleton, supported by Billy Miller, Colin Cochrane and Gareth Kerr)

This Executive Flagship project represents an investment in the region of £220 million and will upgrade 25.5km of the A6 between Drumahoe and Dungiven to dual carriageway standard, including a bypass of Dungiven.

Construction of this dualling scheme is progressing well with approximately 95% of the earthworks completed to date. Ten structures are also substantially complete and works are ongoing on a further eleven. Recently the steel beams on the Ardmore Road Bridge were lifted into place over the River Faughan and beams were placed on the new structure at Liberty Glen. In the coming weeks the existing Burntollet Bridge will be demolished to allow for the construction of the westbound section of the new Burntollet Bridge that crosses the River Ness.

Significant progress has also been made with the installation of culverts, mainline drainage, access tracks, the Park and Rides at Drumahoe and Claudy, utility diversions, and the pavement construction along the new mainline carriageway.

COVID-19 initially disrupted or stopped many activities due to difficulties in the supply chain, social distancing requirements and staff absences. Although the situation is now much improved, COVID-19 continues to have an impact, however the scheme is expected to be complete in 2022, largely as planned.

Winter Service 2020/21

The aim of Winter Service is to ensure, as far as possible, that main road traffic can move safely and freely in wintry conditions by spreading salt at the most effective times. Criteria have been devised to identify the most trafficked roads that carry approximately 80% of traffic and would provide the best cost benefits with the available budget.

The Mid & East Antrim depots (based at Ballykeel, Ballymena and Kilwaughter, Larne) grit 599km of roads during a scheduled action using 9 gritters and 34 staff on rota. Some of this salting is carried out on routes outside of the Council area and some routes within the Council area are gritted by depots from neighbouring Council areas. The aim to achieve optimum operational efficiency and complete a salting action in just over 3 hours.

Dfl Roads carried out 83 equivalent full salting actions during the 2020/21 Winter Season in Mid & East Antrim the first action being on 3rd November 2020 and the last on 10th April 2021. Approximately 6,334 tonnes of salt was used.

Due to the high costs involved to ensure salting is carried out only when necessary and at the appropriate time, Northern Division have 12 Duty Controllers on the Winter Service rota. Duty Controllers decide when to salt and use a range of information including Met Office forecasts, real time information available from the 21 Dfl Roads weather stations across Northern Ireland, and if necessary from scouting reports obtained from staff measuring road surface temperatures.

Information on our salting activities continues to be relayed electronically to the broadcast media to ensure that the latest news on road conditions is available to motorists across Northern Ireland. Additional information, including our Winter Service leaflet, can be found on our website along with advice on driving in poor weather conditions.




SECTION 3

NETWORK DEVELOPMENT

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3.1 Network Development

Completed Minor Works Improvement Schemes 2020/21

C53 Taylorstown Road, Grange - Footway - £23,500

The scheme to extend the footway from Grange View to the existing footway leading to Grange Corner has been completed. This scheme completes a section of footway along Taylorstown Road and will encourage active travel.

Proposed Minor Works Improvement Schemes 2021/22

The following schemes have been designed and are ready to proceed to construction, however delivery will be subject to the availability of funding.

Sand Road/Woodtown Road, Galgorm - Junction Upgrade - £410,000

It is proposed to upgrade the Sand Road/Woodtown Road junction just north of Galgorm on the outskirts of Ballymena. The primary aim of the scheme is to change the junction priority from Woodtown Road to Sand Road, to accommodate the predominant traffic movements. The proposed new junction layout and re-alignment of Sand Road will improve stopping sight distances on the approaches and enhance road safety.

Cloughwater Bridge, Clough - Vehicle Restraint System - £30,000

The proposed scheme will provide a safety barrier along the river bank and raise the existing parapet approaching the bridge from the Clough side.

Completed Active Travel Schemes 2020/21

Grove Road, Ballymena - Footway/cycleway - £212,500

Work to provide a 2.5m shared footway/cycleway on Grove Road and Doury Road along existing narrow footway, verge and hard shoulder is complete. This 1400m scheme commences at Cushendall Road Roundabout, continues along Grove Road to Doury Road and then along Grove Road from Doury Road to the Dunclug Schools.

Fry's Road, Ballymena - Footway/cycleway - £260,000

A 2.5m shared footway/cycleway has been constructed on existing narrow footways, verge and hardshoulders along Fry's Road. This 1400m long scheme, commences at Cushendall Road Roundabout and continues along Fry's Road to St. Patrick's College on Broughshane Road.

Completed Active Travel Schemes 2020/21 (continued)

A26 Larne Road Link, Ballymena – Footway/Cycleway - £175,000

Work to provide a 2.5m shared footway/cycleway on the existing hard shoulder along Larne Road Link is complete. This 590m long scheme commences at Pennybridge Roundabout and continues along Larne Road Link towards Larne Road Roundabout. On the approach to Larne Road Roundabout, the footway/cycleway changes to the opposite side of the carriageway to connect with the footway/cycleway provided by the Green Pastures development.

Proposed Active Travel Schemes 2021/22

As a result of funding received from the Blue Green Fund, the following schemes will be progressed.

A26 Larne Road Link, Ballymena - Footway/Cycleway - £170,000

The scheme will provide a footway and cycleway on the existing hard shoulder, footway and verge from Ballykeel Bridge to the recently completed footway/cycleway at Pennybridge Roundabout. The scheme will also provide a link to the existing facility on Crebilly Road. These works will extend the existing provision along Larne Road Link and further promote active travel in the area.

A26 Larne Road Link, Ballymena – Footway/Cycleway - £211,000

The scheme will provide a footway and cycleway on the existing hard shoulder and verge from the recently completed footway/cycleway, adjacent to Larne Road Roundabout to Braidwater Retail Park. These works will also extend the existing provision along Larne Road Link and further promote active travel in the area.

Larne Road, Ballymena – Footway/Cycleway - £85,000

The scheme will provide a footway and cycleway on the existing footway from the access to Slemish College to Larne Road Link. These works will also extend the existing provision in the area, encourage pupils from the adjacent school to walk or cycle to school and further promote active travel.

A8 Ballymena Road, Larne - Footway/Cycleway - £382,000

The scheme will provide a footway and cycleway on the existing hard shoulder from Ballyrickard Roundabout to Old Belfast Road. These works will extend the existing provision at Drumahoe Roundabout and further promote active travel in the area.

3.2 Traffic

Completed Traffic Schemes 2020/21

Traffic Management Schemes

Dedicated Left Turn Lane, Prince Andrew Way - North Road, Carrickfergus. £15,000

A dedicated left turn lane has been provided at the junction of Prince Andrew Way and North Road in Carrickfergus. This scheme will reduce delays and improve traffic progression especially at school times.

Traffic Management Schemes (continued)

Re-designation of traffic lanes on the Galgorm Rd / Linenhall St. / A26 Larne Rd Link Corridor. £10,000

In order to reduce delays and improve traffic progression, the traffic lanes on the Galgorm Rd / Linenhall St. / A26 Larne Rd Link corridor have been redesignated. The new road layout allows two lanes of traffic to run from Galgorm Road through Linenhall Street and onto the Larne Link Road. These measures are complemented with 'Get in Lane' signs and lane destination road markings.

The intention of the scheme is to maximise capacity for the major turning movements that account for the largest volume of traffic at the junction, namely traffic going straight ahead to the town centre or traffic going right to Belfast/Larne/Antrim/Harryville.

The traffic signals at Pat's Brae and Bridge Street have also been synchronised with the other junctions to aid traffic progression through one of the town's busiest corridors.

Traffic Management Schemes (continued)

A26 Crankill Road, Ballymena - Stopping-up of Crossover point. - £5,000.

Following a number of collisions, the crossover point to the southern side of the Apple Green Service Station on the A26 Crankill Road has been stopped up. This scheme has been implemented to improve road safety on one of the busiest roads in the council area, and had the full support of the PSNI and local residents.

Collision Remedial Schemes

Mount Pleasant - Townhill Road, Portglenone. - £5,000.

Following a number of high profile collisions at the entrance to Mount Pleasant estate, off the Townhill Road in Portglenone, a collision remedial scheme has been implemented to improve traffic safety by formalising the entrance arrangement. This scheme utilises the Southern entrance, which has better sight lines when exiting the estate and improved forward visibility for traffic on Townhill Road.

Transportation - Pedestrian Measures

Zebra crossing, Tullygarley Road, Ballymena - £25,000

A zebra crossing has been provided on Tullygarley Road in Ballymena. The scheme includes the provision of pedestrian guardrail, LED street lighting and Belisha Beacons. This scheme will improve pedestrian safety for users accessing the shops, Tullygarley Community Centre and Mid and East Antrim Borough Council's newly constructed children's play park.

A43 Glenravel Road, Provision of new footway link and Bus Stop relocation - £15,000

A visually impaired road user requested a scheme to provide a new footway with crossing points on the A43 Glenravel Road from the Craigdunloof side, in order to use the bus stop at the top of Glen's Brae Road.

The scheme is now complete and included the provision of approximately 50 metres of new footway construction, pedestrian guardrail, dropped kerb crossing points with tactile paving, pedestrian bollards and the relocation of the existing bus stop. The bus stop was relocated in conjunction with Mid and East Antrim Borough Council who provided the bus shelter and Translink who agreed to the position.

Transportation - Pedestrian Measure (continued)

Circular Road, Larne. Zebra crossing upgrade - £25,000

The zebra crossing on Circular Road, Larne, outside Larne Bus Station, has recently been upgraded. The work included the provision of improved LED street lighting and provision of Belisha Beacons, as well as 'staggering' the crossings so that users in the centre island are facing oncoming traffic when crossing. Buff coloured High Friction Surfacing on both approaches will highlight the presence of the crossing, and improve pedestrian safety.

A2 Belfast Road, Carrickfergus. Puffin Upgrade - £15,000

The Pelican Crossing outside Model Primary School on the A2 Belfast Road, has now been upgraded to a Puffin crossing.

The Puffin crossing has sensors on top of the traffic lights which detect if pedestrians are crossing slowly and can hold the red traffic light for longer if required. In addition, if a pedestrian presses the button but then walks off, the sensor will cancel the request making the lights more efficient both from a pedestrian safety and traffic progression perspective.

Dropped Kerbs/Pedestrian Guardrail/Bollards Provision

Pedestrian Guard Rail, A2 - Shorelands, Jordanstown and Curran Road, Larne-£8,000

New pedestrian guardrail has been provided at the junction of A2 Shore Road and Shorelands in Jordanstown, and on Curran Road at Harbour Bears pre-school in Larne. These rails provide improved pedestrian safety at designated crossing points, busy road junctions and particularly vulnerable locations, such as schools and playgrounds.

Installation of traffic Bollards, A8 Larne – at the exit of the newly upgraded Kilwaughter SPAR - £1,000

After complaints about lorries parking on the hard shoulder adjacent to the exits from the Kilwaughter SPAR service station, reports of near misses and site visits to evidence the issue, Dfl Roads erected a number of bollards in order to maintain visibility in the direction of Larne.

Dropped Kerbs.

A number of kerbs have been dropped to improve the mobility of all users. Specifically those of limited mobility and wheelchair users when crossing the road, at Belgrano in Ahoghill, Glenvale Park in Glynn, Old Glenarm Road in Larne and Taylors Avenue in Carrickfergus.

Part-time 20mph Speed Limits at Schools

Infrastructure Minister, Nichola Mallon announced on the 7 September 2020 the roll out of part time 20mph speed limit schemes at approximately 100 schools across Northern Ireland so that parents, children and staff will be safer as they go to and from school.

At each of the schools, new standard fixed speed limit roundel signs are erected with flashing amber lights set to come on at the times that the reduced speed limit applies. This follows trials at a number of schools to determine the effectiveness of this arrangement. It was found they have a positive impact on the reduction in mean speed.

In line with the Departmental policy an assessment was carried out at each school within the borough and the following schools now have part-time 20mph speed limits.

- Upper Ballyboley Primary School,
- Islandmagee Primary School,
- Carrickfergus Academy,
- Carrickfergus Grammar,
- Ballymena Academy,
- Millguarter Primary School,
- The Diamond Primary School,
- St Paul's Primary School,
- Moorfields Primary School.

Traffic Signs and Carriageway Markings

Lough Road, Ballycarry Halt, Ballystrudder

2 No. Green High Friction Surface Cycle Patches have been provided at the STOP bars of each set of traffic signals to give cyclists a safe area to wait and restart their journey at the traffic signals.

Raceview Road, Broughshane

After consultation and agreement with the PSNI, the 30mph speed limit has been extended from its original location of the village side at Rectory Fields to the Ballymena side of Whinsmoor Road.

The Roddens, Larne

After receiving complaints from members of the public and discussions with the PSNI, the existing 30mph speed limit terminal signs have been upgraded.

Dan's Road, Ballymena

Hatching to the centre of Dan's Road has been provided near the Sourhill Road to narrow the two carriageway lanes and subsequently slow the speed of traffic.

Glenkeen Avenue, Greenisland

A set of existing speed cushions, which had allowed motorists to drive between them, have been replaced to ensure the necessary traffic calming effect is provided.

Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders (TTRO's)

To date, Traffic Management have assessed and approved over 1100 applications for TTRO's in the Council area, to allow utility work on the network that requires traffic control and has potential to cause traffic impact.

Proposed Traffic Schemes 2021/22

Traffic Management Schemes

Left Hand Turn Lane on Linn Road at The Roddens, Larne, - £100,000.

Plans are currently being developed to provide a dedicated left turn lane from Linn Road onto The Roddens, Larne. It is hoped this will reduce queuing times and congestion in the area, especially during peak times.

Traffic Signal upgrade. Old Glenarm Road - Greenlands Road, Larne, - £80,000.

Work has begun to upgrade the traffic signals at Old Glenarm Road / Greenlands Road in Larne. This traffic signal installation is coming to the end of its serviceable life and requires upgrading to include the latest traffic signal technology.

Stopping up of central median crossing points on A26-Crankill Road, Ballymena. £15,000

Legislation is currently being progressed to reduce the number of crossing points in the central median of this busy dual carriageway. Two crossing points, serving private entrances, are being stopped-up. Traffic Management officials have visited the adjacent properties to ascertain if the residents utilise the crossing points and they have confirmed they have no objections. This scheme will improve road safety by reducing the number of vehicles slowing in lane two of this high speed road.

High Friction Surfacing Carrickfergus Road - Glenford Road, Gleno - £15,000

A scheme is proposed to provide high friction surfacing on the series of bends on the Carrickfergus Road at Glenford Road. This location has recently seen a number of collisions.

Transportation - Pedestrian Measures

Traffic Signal Upgrades, Carrickfergus. - £45,000.

Work is underway to upgrade the existing pelican crossings on the A2 at Sainsbury's, Albert Road and North Road in Carrickfergus. These crossings are nearing the end of their serviceable life and will be replaced with 'Puffin' style crossings.

Puffin Crossing's utilises the latest traffic signal technology and allows sensors on the pole tops to detect if pedestrians are crossing slowly and subsequently hold the red traffic signal longer to allow pedestrians to cross in safety. In addition, if a pedestrian presses the button and walks off, then the controller will cancel the pedestrian request, making the lights more efficient for all road users.

Proposed Traffic Schemes 2021/22 (continued)

Collision Remedial Schemes

M2 North-bound off-slip - Raceview Road, Ballymena - £45,000

A scheme is being developed to signalise the junction of the M2 (Ballymena by-pass) North-bound off-slip with Raceview Road. This location has history of collisions with large vehicles overhanging the central reservation into lane two of the Ballymena bound carriageway. The proposed signalisation will eliminate any conflict and improve road safety.

Traffic Calming Scheme

Downshire Road, Carrickfergus - £15,000

Consultation will soon be starting to implement a traffic calming scheme on Downshire Road in Carrickfergus. This road leads to Downshire secondary school and carries school buses, school traffic and school children walking to school. The road will benefit from traffic calming and improved road safety.

Bus Measures

Extension to Glarryford Park and Ride site, Ballymena - £10,000

Plans are being developed to extend the Glarryford Park and Ride site in Ballymena. On site observations show the facility to be oversubscribed and cars have been parked in such a manner that has occasionally obstructed the bus service. It is anticipated that the additional seven spaces will improve parking behaviour and maintain access for the bus service.

Safe Routes to School

Part-time 20mph Speed Limits at Schools

Infrastructure Minister, Nichola Mallon MLA announced that it is her intention to take forward further tranches of part-time 20mph speed limits at schools. All schools in the Mid and East Antrim area will be assessed and prioritised for inclusion in the 2021/22 programme, the extent of which will depend on the funding allocated and the requirements of the schools being treated.

3.3 Street Lighting

The total number of lights in the Council area is now 22,838. The Minister has confirmed funding this year to ensure a full 12 month repair service can be provided. As part of the Department's continued invest to save initiative, it is proposed to retrofit 4,000 old sodium lanterns with more cost effective LEDs throughout the borough this financial year.

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4.1 Development Control

Planning Applications 2020/21

The Council forward planning applications to the Development Control Section of the Department for scrutiny of the road issues, including access arrangements, parking standards and provision, and road layout and geometry. The road widths, radii, gradients, drainage and other construction data are checked against departmental standards. Development Control also checks the visibility splays and forward sight distances at the vehicle access points.

The Private Streets Order 1980 is applied if the street is to become public and maintained by the Department. The Development Control Section determines the area to be adopted, calculates the bond amount, arranges the supervision of the construction of the private street and, following satisfactory completion of the streets by the developer, and arranges for adoption into the public road network. In certain circumstances, the Department can take enforcement action to ensure completion of the street.

Other work includes Property Enquiries, Planning Appeals and the approval of road access works under the terms of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993.
