FOREWORD BY THE EASTERN DIVISION ROADS MANAGER



Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors

I am very pleased to present my Spring Report to Belfast City Council.

Eastern Division covers the two Council areas of Belfast and Lisburn & Castlereagh. It is one of four Divisions, each of which manages, improves and maintains the transport network and is the primary contact point for road users and public representatives.

This report deals with works completed in the Belfast City Council area during the year 2019/20 and sets out our programme of schemes being undertaken in 2020/21.

It has been an unprecedented year so far, caused by the nationwide impact of Covid-19. This resulted in our contractors being unable to work from mid-March until around mid-May, which had a knock on impact on our work programmes. I am pleased to tell you that our contractors have been working again in May and June, to complete the schemes that were stopped and to carry out the remainder of our 2019/ 20 programme of works. These works are now fully completed and we are now planning and implementing our 2020/ 21 works programmes.

My allocations have now been confirmed and I am pleased to note that on the Capital side these are similar to last year, with additional funds being made available for walking and cycling, structural maintenance, safer routes to schools and traffic information and control. I am also pleased to report our Resource allocations will allow us maintain the road network in a similar way to last year, including sufficient funding to repair street lights across the year.

The overall 2020/21 structural maintenance capital budget is £75m for Northern Ireland and of this, £10m has been set aside for a roads recovery fund which is being used to address areas of immediate need across the road network.

My staff will continue to develop local transport and safety schemes and maintenance programmes to enhance safety, improve traffic flow and provide measures for pedestrians and cyclists. As the year progresses we will continue to bid for additional funding to maintain the integrity of the road network and additional schemes will be implemented as funding becomes available through the year.

I would encourage Councillors to continue to contact the relevant members of my staff in relation to operational matters and they will do their best to assist.




Figure 1 – Organisation Context



WHAT WE DO

Maintaining the road network

Structural maintenance

Maintaining the network in a safe and serviceable condition remains one of our highest priorities.

Structural maintenance includes:

- The resurfacing and surface dressing of roads and footways
- The repair of surface defects, such as potholes and broken flagstones
- The replacement and repair of road gullies, culverts and manholes

Within the Eastern Division area in 2019/20 we:

- Invested £13.45 million on structural maintenance
- resurfaced 83.60 lane km of the road network
- resurfaced 22.44 km of footways

Condition of the network

Monitoring the condition of our road network is an essential part of planning maintenance work and, in order to detect deterioration at an early stage, we undertake a number of annual road condition surveys using specialist vehicles to measure the strength, surface condition and skidding resistance of our roads.

In 2019/20, 92.7% of the motorway and trunk road network had a residual life of more than 5 years compared to a target of 85% respectively. The information from the survey gives us an indication of areas of the road network, which require further investigation and are likely to require maintenance.

Routine maintenance

Routine maintenance is important, both to enhance user safety and to help prevent more significant and costly maintenance problems building up over time.

In Eastern Division during 2019/20 we:

- Invested around £1.5 million replacing road markings, cutting grass verges to maintain visibility, emptying gullies and maintaining or replacing safety barriers, and maintaining street trees, verges and fences.
- Repaired 25,495 road defects following inspections.

Managing the road

The Traffic Information and Control Centre (TICC) is located within Belfast City Council area and from this location DfI Roads manage:

- 264 sets of traffic signal controller junctions
- 253 sets of traffic signal controlled pedestrian crossings
- 45 motorway gantries
- 74 motorway Variable Message Signs
- Use approximately 170 CCTV cameras to monitor the road network in real time

We also disseminate real time travel information through the use of Social media

- with 58,500 followers on Twitter,
- almost 700,000 unique users on Trafficwatchni.com website in 2019 and
- Approximately 2690 users registered to receive emergency e-mail alerts.

We manage the road network to promote its safety and efficient operation. We have continued to make use of the latest technology and traffic management techniques to improve road safety, provide facilities for all road users, and effectively manage the network. This has included:

- Monitoring and management of traffic signal timings to ensure they remain optimised for prevailing traffic conditions
- Responding to at least 98% of urgent traffic signal faults within 24 hours
- The use and extension of traffic control and monitoring systems
- The introduction of Puffin crossings
- The provision and management of motorway control systems
- Operate a Service Level Agreement with PSNI to manage critical incidents on the Strategic Road Network to ensure al incidents are dealt with safely and efficiently
- The supply and management of road traffic signs
- The internal dissemination of collision records to help target areas of safety concern
- The provision of accurate and reliable traffic information to the public including replies to traffic count queries and the provision of the annual traffic count census report.
- Future-proofing the road network to support growth in Intelligent Mobility and Connected Vehicles

Within Eastern Division during 2019/20 we:

- Provided pre-trip information on the trafficwatchni website, <u>www.trafficwatchni.com</u>, radio broadcasts and social media.
- Commenced the upgrade of traffic signals at 2 signalised junction. [DN: other parts of Eastern Division may have undertaken similar work as well as BRT].
- Commenced the Phase 2 upgrade of our Urban Traffic Control System (UTC) to ensure the system remains robust and secure and continues to maximise the efficiency of the signalised network. The upgrade will move the system onto a cloud-hosted environment removing hardware vulnerabilities in the Control Centre but also enabling access to the system remotely should the Control Centre become unavailable.

- Commenced designing further enhancements to the trafficwatchni website to increase sources of information displayed and to allow personalisation.
- Completed the upgrade of 4 pedestrian crossings.
- Substantially completed the migration of our urban CCTV system to a new digital operating platform to ensure its continued robustness and expandability.
- Commenced work to future-proof the road network by upgrading instation networks to support growth in Intelligent Mobility and Connected Vehicles

Winter Service

The aim of winter service is to help, as far as possible, main road traffic to move safely and freely in wintry conditions by spreading salt at the most effective times.

Eastern Division has a fleet of 23 gritters and over 100 personnel available to salt approximately, 1,306km of main roads.

There were 69 call-outs this year, using around 7,247 tonnes of salt, at a cost of approximately £15k per call-out to treat all roads on the salting schedule. Eastern Division completed 96% of winter salting actions within 4 hours.

Our total winter service expenditure was £1.04 million.

Emergency Response Service

We have procedures in place to assist with roads related emergency incidents to ensure a response, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Our emergency response procedures are supported by a well-established reporting system to gather operational information from across Northern Ireland during an emergency. A lead communicator is available out of hours all year round to ensure that the latest news on road conditions is available to the travelling public and we have enhanced the trafficwatch website to enable the lead communicator to keep this information updated including Social Media System and Twitter.

Development Control and Private Streets

Development Control staff act as consultee to Planning Service, providing advice on road safety, traffic progression, transportation, roads layout/standards and policy compliance. During the 2019/20 financial year, Eastern Division dealt with over 2,387 planning application consultations and processed an average of 60% of these within 15 working days. In relation to new housing developments, 7km of Private Streets have been determined in 2019/20. This means that if and when the streets are built to the agreed layout and standard, they will be adopted into the public roads network. 60 new development sites have started since April 2019 representing approximately 7km of new roads and footways. At 31 March 2020, we held £25.9M in bonds, and during 2019/20, £3.8M of new bonds were processed with £3.7M released on adoption.

Street Works

Our road network is a major public asset valued at over £32 billion. It accommodates a network of underground pipes and cables, which deliver key services to the public including water supply, wastewater disposal, electricity, gas and telecommunications.

Utility companies have the right to open the public road to place or maintain their equipment. In 2019/20, there were 49,987 utility company road openings across Northern Ireland, with some

13,480 in Eastern Division. We work closely with utility companies to minimise disruption caused by street works and ensure better quality reinstatements.

Our Inspectors in Eastern Division have carried out over 3,770 visits to street works sites to inspect work in progress and completed reinstatements.

Improving the Road Network

Major Road Improvements

Network Development Section progress the development of major road improvement schemes in the Strategic Road Improvement Programme. Delivery of these schemes is dependent on funding levels envisaged through the Investment Strategy for Northern Ireland 2011-21 and future budget settlements.

In Eastern Division the development of the York Street Interchange continues:

- The procurement process to award a contract for the detailed design phase of this scheme was halted in early 2017 as result of a legal action. This legal action concluded in September 2019, with the award of contract being set aside.
- A review of the potential options for a new procurement strategy for the project has been completed.
- The Minister is in the process of determining her priorities for capital programmes

The commencement of construction for the York Street Interchange will depend on the satisfactory completion of an economic assessment, completion of the statutory process and subject to funding being made available in future budget settlements.

Bridge Strengthening

Dfl Roads regularly inspects its stock of bridges and other structures on the public road network.

Last year across Eastern Division we inspected 116 structures and carried out maintenance and repair work to 11 structures. In 2019/20 we spent a total of £66k on strengthening and maintaining our current stock of bridges, culverts and retaining walls.

Local Transport and Safety Measures

In 2019/20 we spent over £4.4 million on a range of measures to improve the safety and efficiency of the road network. In Eastern Division this included implementation of:

- 3 Minor Works improvement schemes;
- 3 Collision Remedial measures at specific sites;
- 0 Traffic Calming measures;
- 0.12 kms of new cycle facilities;
- 1 Controlled Pedestrian Crossings;

 Improvements to the trafficwatch website and the motorway control system as well as continuously ongoing work to improve the performance of our traffic signals and pedestrian controlled crossing

Street Lighting

We provide and maintain street lighting on all adopted roads in urban areas and in certain circumstances, on rural roads.

In 2019/20 we spent £4.025 million installing new and maintaining existing lighting systems in Eastern Division. This excludes the energy costs, which were £2.584 million.

Budget constraints have meant that the Department has faced periods of significant street lighting resource pressures over the last two years. While budget pressures still exist this year, our initial allocation for street lighting maintenance allows us to continue using our external contractors to carry out street lighting repairs at this time. However, the continuation of this service for the full year will depend on the outcome of monitoring rounds.

Customer Service

Dfl Roads aims to inform, consult and involve customers by:-

- supplying up-to-date information through our publications, at shows and exhibitions and via our website http://www.drdni.gov.uk and;
- listening to customer needs; and
- remaining open, transparent and visible at all times.

We publish a wide range of information leaflets on specific road schemes and on the services we provide. Our free newspaper, "On the Move", is published twice a year and distributed through our local offices and public libraries.

We provide up-to-date travel news through our travel information website <u>www.trafficwatchni.com</u> and our traffic hotline for Greater Belfast on 08457 123321. Traffic information is updated at 10 minute intervals and broadcast on BBC Radio Ulster during peak times.

During the development phase of major roads projects, we consult with a wide range of stakeholders, including elected representatives and the public and, particularly, those likely to be directly affected by the works. We hold exhibitions at local venues and inform the public through press articles, leaflet drops and individual visits, as necessary.

During 2019/20, we received 4790 written enquiries from the general public and responded to 87% of these within 15 days.

2.1 YORK STREET INTERCHANGE SCHEME



Preferred Option to improve York Street Interchange

Delivery of the York Street Interchange scheme remains a high priority for the Department. This scheme will address a major bottleneck on the strategic road network, replacing the existing signalised junction at York Street with direct links between Westlink, M2 and M3, the three busiest roads in Northern Ireland.

The publication of the Public Inquiry Inspector's Report and the Departmental Statement have completed the statutory processes for the York Street Interchange with the exception of the Vesting of the required lands. The Vesting will take place at a later date.

The procurement process to award a contract for the detailed design phase of this scheme was halted in early 2017 as result of a legal action. This legal action concluded in September 2019, with the award of contract being set aside. A review of the potential options for a new procurement strategy for the project has been completed. The Minister is in the process of determining her priorities for capital programmes.

The commencement of construction for the York Street Interchange will depend on the satisfactory completion of an economic assessment, completion of the statutory process and subject to funding being made available in future budget settlements.

2.2 M1 and M2 BUS LANES

Work commenced in the week beginning 27 January 2020 to extend the hard shoulder bus lanes along the M1 motorway and is expected to last approximately 3 months. The existing Belfast bound bus lanes will be lengthened by 1.7 km from the approach to Junction 8 at Blaris to Junction 7 at Sprucefield. This will complete provision of hard shoulder bus lanes between Sprucefield Park & Ride at Junction 8 and Belfast. The work, to be carried out by Graham Construction, also includes provision of additional CCTV.

This investment of £1.1 million is being provided to help promote and encourage the use of public transport for travel into Belfast. It reflects the Department's policy to promote sustainable transport and assist key bus service routes into Belfast, by further extending bus lanes that were introduced on the M1 and M2 motorways in March 2019. Graham Construction postponed work on site on 27 March 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Work recommenced in May and the scheme is now complete.

2.3 BELFAST RAPID TRANSIT (BRT)

BRT Phase II

The proposal to extend the current BRT Glider network to serve North and South Belfast, together with an extension of the G2 Glider route to serve Queen's University and the City Hospital, is one of the infrastructure projects included in the recently announced Belfast Region City Deal.






