



## Week beginning 29<sup>th</sup> April 2024





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## **MANAGEMENT NOTES:**

- Last weeks more settled weather has seen a significant amount of 'catching up' on farm done, with fertiliser sown, surplus paddocks baled and a grazing wedge established.
- Growth has been less than the LT avg. but is expected to make a sharp increase in the next fortnight. Understanding grazing demand and supply on your own platform will be crucial make a grass walk a priority.
- Continue to review and cut surplus grass weekly to get heavy-covered paddocks back into the rotation as soon as possible this will help maintain grass quality.
- Where heavy covers have been grazed in the first rotation and a significant residual was left to avoid damage, focus on getting these grazed again (even at a lower cover) to enable a better clean out in the second rotation.
