Dungannon Neighbourhood Renewal Area

Introduction

The aim of the People and Place Strategy is to help close the gap in the quality of life between the most deprived and the rest of society. In pursuing that aim it is important to understand what the key issues are and what needs to be addressed if we are to tackle the complex and multi-dimensional nature of deprivation.

Without knowing the full nature of the problem we were facing it is difficult to see how we can make reasoned decisions regarding the strategic priorities across patterns of deprivation within this area and monitor and evaluate those actions to effect change.

Whilst there have been a number of improvements over recent years, it is essential that we continue to develop the evidence base to better inform our decision making. To do that we need to rely on high quality information, derived from a variety of sources - expert knowledge; stakeholder consultation and existing statistics.

By using small areas geographies that best fit the current targeted areas we have been able to significantly improve the sources of data available to us. This enhanced evidence base provides us with robust and reliable statistics which will allow us to better understand and identify the key issues faced in this area.

This Area Profile report provides statistical data which underpins the 2017 multiple deprivation measures for this area. It provides a statistical evidence baseline for this area in terms of the seven domains of deprivation.

User Notes

- i. The information is broadly split into three parts:
- Multiple Deprivation Ranking for each Domain (MDM 2017)
- Summary
- · Measuring of impact across each Key Outcome Indicator.

As the Neighbourhood Renewal Areas are defined by the Multiple Deprivation, MDM rankings are included at the beginning of each section (where available)

The summary infographics of the key background data are provided for each of these.

The measuring of the individual key outcome indicators provides data on a year by year basis across a given period. This information allows the user to examine the trend and variances and consider if there has been any outside influence, for example, the economic downturn.

- ii. Care should be taken when interpreting a positive or negative outcome as the NRA may still be experiencing significant problems improving but still significantly behind Non NRAs.
- iii. Universal Credit (UC), which replaced Jobseeksers Allowance, Income Support, Working Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit and Housing Benefit, began in September 2017 through a phased geographical roll-out. This may be one of the reasons behind the decrease in claimants across the following:



- iv. Caution is advised when interpreting change over time where numbers are small. This is particularly evident when examining our smaller NRAs. The Demography section of this report provides information relating to the population size and breakdown.
- v. Key Stage assessment data has been impacted by industrial action over the past few years resulting in incomplete returns to the Department. Weighting exercises were conducted on the available data to calculate 'best estimates' at a Northern Ireland level but it is not possible to use the available data to provide information at lower geographical levels or for individual schools. Data for 'No GCSEs' is not available for more recent years due to the small number in Northern Ireland, meaning that analysis by area would not be appropriate.






















